

**SUPPLEMENT** 

KENYA PROCLAMATIONS RULES AND REGULATIONS, No 23

Sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

(2) For the purpose of making such claim the user of imported kerosene oil shall submit a certificate, in the form set out in the Schedule hereto, to the Treasurer not later than one month after the expiration of the three months in respect of which the claim is made, and the Treasurer shall pay to the user, out of such funds as may be provided by the Legislative Council for that purpose, such sum as may be due under the provisions of this Ordinance

#### A Bill to Amend the Kerosene Oil (Repayment of Duty) Ordinance, 1930

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof. as follows —

This Ordinance may be cited as the Kerosene Oil Short title (Repayment of Duty) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Kerosene Oil (Repayment of No 58 of 1930) Duty) Ordinance, 1930, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

2 Sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Principal Ordin- Amendment of ance is hereby amended—

section 3 of the Principal

- (a) by substituting a colon for the full stop which appears Ordinance at the end thereof, and
- (b) by adding thereto immediately after such colon, the following proviso —

"Provided that the Treasurer may, in his absolute discretion, accept a claim submitted not later than three months after the expiration of the three months in respect of which the claim is made, if he is satisfied that the claimant's failure to submit his application within the period of one month prescribed by this sub-section was unavoidable or that, in all the circumstances of the case, such failure ought to be excused"

#### **OBJECTS AND REASONS**

The principal Ordinance requires a claimant for a refund of duty on imported kerosene oil to submit his claim not later than one month after the expiration of the three months in respect of which the claim is made, and no claim can be accepted unless it is submitted within this period

The rigid provisions of this section have operated harshly in certain cases, and it is proposed to empower the Treasurer to admit claims up to a maximum period of three months, instead of one month as at present, in cases where he is satisfied that the claimant's failure to comply with the requirements of the law was unavoidable or that, in all the circumstances of the case, such failure ought to be excused

It is not anticipated that the additional refunds which will be made if the provisions of this Bill become law will amount to a very large sum
