BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Eire and Northern Ireland (Consequential Provisions) Ordinance, 1938 Short title

2 (1) Any reference in any Ordinance, Rule, Regulation, Proclamation, Order or Notice to Ireland shall be construed as a reference to Eire and Northern Ireland Reference to Eire and Northern Ireland

(2) Any reference in any Ordinance, Rule, Regulation, Proclamation, Order or Notice to the Irish Free State shall be construed as a reference to Eire

OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill is designed to make consequential alterations to the Kenya law in order to give effect to the provisions of the Irish Free State (Agreement) Act, 1922, the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922 (Session 2), and the Eire (Confirmation of Agreements) Act, 1938

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law
