This Ordinance may be cited as the Eire and Short title Northern Ireland (Consequential Provisions) Ordinance, 1938

2 (1) Any reference in any Ordinance, Rule, Regulation, Reference to Proclamation, Order or Notice to Ireland shall be construed as a reference to Eire and Northern Ireland

# **OBJECTS AND REASONS**

This Bill is designed to make consequential alterations to the Kenya law in order to give effect to the provisions of the Irish Free State (Agreement) Act, 1922, the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922 (Session 2), and the Eire (Confirmation of Agreements) Act, 1938

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law
