

2 In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Native intoxicating liquor" includes palm wine (other than tembo tamu), pombe, fermented asali, and all liquors such as are prepared by natives which contain more than one per centum by weight of absolute alcohol

A Bill to Amend the Native Liquor Ordinance, 1930

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

- This Ordinance may be cited as the Native Liquor short title (Amendment) Ordinance, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Native Liquor Ordinance, 1930, hereinafter referred to as No 36 of 1930 the Principal Ordinance
- Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended by deleting therefrom the definition of "Native section 2 of intoxicating liquor" and by substituting therefor the following Ordinance definition —

- "'Native intoxicating liquor' means—
 - (a) palm wine (other than tembo tamu), pombe, fermented asalı, Nubian gin, and native beer,
 - (b) all intoxicating liquors such as are prepared by natives from cereals,
 - (c) all liquors (other than those mentioned in paragraphs (a), (b) and (d) of this definition) such as are prepared by natives and which contain more than one per centum by weight of absolute alcohol, and
 - (d) such other liquor as the Governor may from time to time by notice in the Gazette declare to be native intoxicating liquor for the purposes of this Ordinance,"

OBJECTS AND REASONS

It has been held by the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa that, having regard to the definition of "native intoxicating liquor" in section 2 of the Native Liquor Ordinance, 1930, in prosecutions for offences against that Ordinance it is necessary to prove that the liquor in respect of which the case is brought, unless the liquor is one specifically named in the definition, contains more than one per centum by weight of absolute alcohol In view of the large number of prosecutions brought under the Ordinance and the difficulty of submitting analytical proof in every case, it is considered desirable to replace the definition The proposed definition is based on one contained in the Zanzibar law

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

GEORGE R I

GEORGE THE SIXTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India To all to whom these presents shall come

GREETING

Whereas We have taken into Our Royal consideration the good services which are rendered by members of the Police Forces and of Fire Brigades in Our Colonies and in Territories under Our Protection

And whereas We are desirous of rewarding meritorious service rendered by them

We do by these presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors institute and create a new Medal to be awarded to members of the aforesaid Police Forces and Fire Brigades for distinguished conduct

First It is ordained that the Medal shall be designated and styled "The Colonial Police Medal"

Secondly It is ordained that the Colonial Police Medal shall consist of a circular medal of silver with the Effigy of the Sovereign on the obverse, and on the reverse an emblematic design with the words "For Gallantry" or "For Meritorious Service", as the case may be The Medal shall bear on the rim the name and rank of the person to whom it is awarded and the name of the Police Force or Fire Brigade for service in which the award is made

Thirdly It is ordained that the Medal shall be awarded only to those members of recognized Police Forces or of properly organized Fire Brigades in Our Colonies and in Territories under Our Protection who have performed services of conspicuous merit, and that such award shall be made only on a recommendation to Us by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State

Fourthly It is ordained that the names of those to whom this Medal may be awarded shall be published in the London Gazette, and that a Register of such names shall be kept in the Office of Our Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies

Fifthly It is ordained that the Medal shall be worn on the left breast suspended from a ribbon one inch and three-eighths in width, of which the central part (one half of an inch in width) shall be dark blue with two green borders, each three-eighths of an inch in width, and two silver stripes, each one-sixteenth of an inch wide separating the borders from the central part. In the case of awards for gallantry the green borders of the ribbon shall each be centrally divided by a crimson stripe one-sixteenth of an inch in width

Sixthly It is ordained that any gallant conduct which is worthy of recognition by the award of the

Colonial Police Medal, but is performed by one upon whom the Medal has already been conferred, may be recorded by a bar attached to the ribbon by which the Medal is suspended. For each such additional award an additional Bar may be added, and for each Bar awarded a small silver rose may be added to the ribbon when worn alone.

Seventhly It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors by an Order under Our Sign Manual and on a recommendation to that effect by or through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State to cancel and annul the award to any person of the Colonial Police Medal, and that thereupon the name of such person in the register shall be erased Provided that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors to restore the Medal so forfeited when such recommendation has been withdrawn. And every person to whom the said Medal is awarded shall, before receiving the same, enter into an agreement to return the Medal if his name shall be erased as aforesaid.

Eighthly It is ordained that the Medal shall be awarded under such regulations as to grant, forfeiture, restoration and other matters in amplification of these Our rules and ordinances as may be issued from time to time by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State

Ninthly It is ordained that as from the date of this Warrant the grant of "The African Police Medal for Meritorious Service", which was instituted and created by His late Majesty King George the Fifth by a Warrant under His Sign Manual dated the twenty-sixth day of July nineteen hundred and fifteen, for award to non-commissioned officers and men other than those of European descent) of the Police Forces of East and West Africa, shall be discontinued for future service, and the aforesaid Warrant is hereby cancelled

Lastly We reserve to Ourself, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with these rules and ordinances, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Sign Manual

Given at Our Court at St James's the tenth day of May, one thousand, nine hundred and thirty-eight in the second year of Our Reign

REGULATIONS

The following Regulations shall be observed in recommending His Majesty to grant the Colonial Police Medal —

- (a) The Medal shall be open to all ranks of the Police Forces, civil and military, and to all members of properly organized Fire Brigades, in the Colonies and in Territories under His Majesty's Protection (including Mandated Territories)
- (b) Each recommendation for the Medal shall state the name and rank of the person recommended, the Police Force or Fire Brigade of which he is or was a member, and particulars of the action or service for which the grant of the Medal is recommended
- (c) The qualifications for the Medal shall be as follows
 - (1) Conspicuous gallantry
 - (11) Valuable service characterized by resource and devotion to duty, including prolonged service marked by exceptional ability, merit and exemplary conduct

- (d) Any award of the Medal for conspicuous gallantry shall be made as soon as possible after the event occasioning the grant, and all other awards shall be made annually on the occasion of His Majesty's Birthday
- (e) The number of Medals to be awarded in any one year, for services other than conspicuous gallantry, shall not exceed one hundred and fifty save and except that in very special circumstances which, in His Majesty's opinion, would justify an exceptional grant, His Majesty may award Medals exceeding that number
- (f) The Medal shall be worn next to and immediately after the Burma Police Medal
- (g) The award of the Medal will not be a bar to subsequent recommendation for the King's Police Medal
