BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Northern Frontier Short title Poll Tax (Amendment) Ordinance, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Northern Frontier Province Poll Tax Ordinance, No 53 of 1930 1930, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of this Bill is to repeal section 17 of the Principal Ordinance under which that Ordinance will expire at the end of 1938 unless by resolution of the Legislative Council it is continued in force until a later date

The measure has proved eminently suitable for the conditions obtaining in the Northern Frontier District, and no good reason is seen for retaining this section

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

A Bill to Amend the Asian Civil Service Provident Fund Ordinance, 1934

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Asian Civil Service Provident Fund (Amendment) Ordinance, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Asian Civil Service Provident Fund Ordinance, 1934, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

No 64 of 1934

Members of B E A Meteorological Service may become contributors

2 (1) Any Asian member of the British East African Meteorological Service, who would if he were a member of the Kenya Asian Local Civil Service fall within the definition of "contributor" contained in section 2 of the Principal Ordinance, may, within three months after the commencement of this Ordinance or within three months after he becomes so eligible, whichever date is the later, by writing under his hand addressed to the Accountant General elect to become a contributor to the fund

Application of Principal Ordinance

- (2) Where any such member so elects to become a contributor he shall—
 - (a) save as is hereinafter provided, be subject to the provisions of the Principal Ordinance, as if he were a member of the Kenya Asian Local Civil Service,
 - (b) be deemed to have authorized the Accountant General to appoint an agent outside the Colony to exercise the powers conferred upon the Accountant General by sub-section (3) of section 4 of the Principal Ordinance

Construction

(3) Service in the British East African Meteorological Service shall be deemed to be included in the definition of "service" contained in section 2 of the Principal Ordinance

Provided that, in the application of paragraph (b) of section 6 of the Principal Ordinance to any such member, the reference therein to service prior to the date of commencement of the Principal Ordinance shall be deemed to refer only to service between the 1st day of January, 1937, and the date of commencement of this Ordinance, and no contributions from the general revenue of the Colony shall be credited, under the provisions of that paragraph, to any such member except in respect of service in the British East African Meteorological Service between those dates

OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill provides for the admission of members of the Asian Staff of the British East African Meteorological Service to the Kenya Asian Civil Service Provident Fund

The Fund will be reimbursed by the Service for all payments made under sections 6, 7 and 10 of the Principal Ordinance, and no increase in this Government's contributions to the fund will be entailed if the provisions of this Bill become law

Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to replace —

Prohibition of use of shop without a licence Penalty

- 3 (1) No person shall on any alienated land in a rural area use or permit the use of any shop unless such shop is licensed under this Ordinance by a licensing officer of the district in which such shop is situated
- (2) Before issuing a licence under this section, the licensing officer shall take the opinion of the District Council or Committee, if any, within whose area such shop is situated
- (3) Every licence under this section shall, unless revoked under the provisions of section 6 hereof, be in force until the 31st day of December in the year in which it is issued, and shall then expire
- (4) For every licence issued under this section and for every renewal thereof there shall be paid the sum specified in the Schedule to this Ordinance
- (5) Every licence issued under this section shall be kept in the shop in respect of which it is issued and shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection by any authorized person

A Bill to Amend the Shops in Rural Areas Ordinance, 1933

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

This Ordinance may be cited as the Shops in Rural Areas (Amendment) Ordinance, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Shops in Rural Areas Ordinance, 1933, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

- "3 (1) No person shall on any alienated land in a Prohibition of rural area use or permit to be used any shop, unless such without a shop is licensed under this Ordinance by a licensing officer of the district in which such shop is situated Every person applying for a licence shall make an application to the licensing officer in the prescribed form
- (2) No licence shall be issued under the provisions of this section except with the consent of the District Council, or Committee if any, within whose area such shop is situated, and such licence may be issued subject to either or both of the following conditions—
 - (a) that the shop shall remain, until the licence expires, the property of the applicant,
 - (b) that the shop will not be sub-let

Provided that, if the District Council or Committee, as the case may be, refuses to give its consent to the issue of a licence, an applicant may appeal against such refusal to the Provincial Commissioner, whose decision shall be final

(3) Every licence under this section shall, unless revoked under the provisions of section 6 hereof, remain Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

- 5 (1) Every person shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance who—
 - (a) being the owner or occupier of alienated land in a rural area uses or permits the use of any building on such land as a shop without having a valid licence in respect of such shop, or
 - (b) manages or controls any shop, whether on his own behalf or on behalf of another person without having a valid licence in respect of such shop
- (2) Every person who commits an offence against this Ordinance shall be liable for a first offence to a fine not exceeding five pounds or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or to both such fine and such imprisonment, and for a second or subsequent offence to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or to both such fine and such imprisonment

- (4) Any person, to whom a licence has been issued under the provisions of this section, who desires to obtain a licence for a further period shall make an application in the prescribed form to the licensing officer on or before the thirtieth day of November of the year preceding the year in respect of which such licence is desired
- (5) For every licence issued under this section there shall be paid the sum specified in the Schedule to this Ordinance
- (6) Every licence issued under this section shall be kept in the shop in respect of which it is issued "

OBJECTS AND REASONS

During the meeting of Legislative Council held during August, 1937, an assurance was given that the views of District Councils and Committees would be obtained on the question of amending the Shops in Rural Areas Ordinance, 1933, so as to provide that no licence would be issued without the approval of the District Council or Committee, as the case may be Action was accordingly taken and the replies show that, with the exception of one District Committee, all the Councils and Committees are in favour of the proposed amendments

The Bill prohibits the issue of a licence except with the consent of the District Council or Committee concerned but provides for an appeal to the Provincial Commissioner against a decision adverse to the applicant. Licences will be issued for one year only and any person who desires to obtain a licence for a further period must apply in the prescribed form for a fresh licence before the 30th November of the year preceding the year in respect of which such licence is desired Licences may be issued subject to either or both of the conditions mentioned in the proposed sub-section (2) of section 3 in clause 2 of the Bill Provision is also made empowering the Governor in Council to prescribe forms of applications for licences and forms of licences

A Bill to Provide for Changes in the Titles of the Principal Financial Officers

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

This Ordinance may be cited as the Financial Officers (Change of Titles) Ordinance, 1938, and shall be deemed to have come into force on the first day of September, 1938

Short title and commencement

In this Ordinance "enactment" means an Ordinance and includes an order of the Governor in Council, order, proclamation, resolution, regulation, rule, commission, by-law, notice, deed, contract, minute, official letter or other document issued or made under or in connexion with an Ordinance

Interpretation

(1) The title "Financial Secretary" is substituted for Substitution of the title "Treasurer" or "Colonial Treasurer" wherever eather for the title of such titles occurs in the whole or in every section or part "Colonial" specified in the third column of the First Schedule to this Ordinance of every enactment specified in the first and second columns of the said Schedule

- (2) The title "Accountant-General" is substituted for the title "Treasurer" or "Colonial Treasurer" wherever either of such titles occurs in the whole or in every section or part specified in the third column of the Second Schedule to this Ordinance of every enactment specified in the first and second columns of the said Schedule
- (3) The title "Commissioner of Inland Revenue" is substituted for the title "Treasurer" or "Colonial Treasurer" wherever either of such titles occurs in the whole or in every section or part specified in the third column of the Third Schedule to this Ordinance of every enactment specified in the first and second columns of the said Schedule
- The Governor in Council may, by order, make any Power to add to addition to, or substitution or alteration in any of the Schedules or amend Schedules to this Ordinance

LOCUST REPORT

THE SITUATION IN KENYA ON 17TH NOVEMBER 1938
The Migratory Locust (Locusta migratorioides)

Most of the flying swarms now in the Colony have commenced to lay eggs and large numbers of locusts from the earlier swarms are dying out A large swarm estimated to be about 15 miles long by two miles wide is now in the Nakuru District. This swarm passed over Ol Punyata on the 10th November, flying west and is probably made up from several swarms previously reported to have proceeded east in the direction of Baringo Further small swarms are present in the Solar, Thomson's Fals and Ravine Districts Egg-laying has occurred thinly over a large area between Kampi-ya-Moto and Rongai and a spaise laying over an area of some 80 acres is reported from Solai The swarm which has been in the Ravine District for the past few weeks has laid over an area of about 800 acres, on cultivated land on farms adjoining the Kamasia Reserve

Hoppers continue to emerge in the neighbourhood of Hoey's Bridge and Soy, poison baiting and spraying operations are being carried out where the hopper bands have formed. The result of baiting at Hoey's Bridge is described as excellent and with ample supplies of bait available in the district it is hoped that the destruction of hoppers will be complete

The position in other districts is as follows —

Kerio Valley — The small swarm previously reported east of Nabkoi is still present in the valley but no laying by the swarm has yet taken place. The other swarms left the valley flying east towards Baringo. A small area was laid over and the District Commissioner, Tambach, is dealing with the destruction of the eggs. The locusts are reported to be dying.

Narok—The latest report from the District Commissioner states that the scattered swarm which remained in the area has dispersed and that only a few solitary locusts are now met with

Kamasia—The swarm reported to be in this area during the past week came from the Kerio Vallev As mentioned above, this swarm has left the reserve and has proceeded towards Nakuru

It is expected that egg laying will take place from now onwards and where this occurs, members of the public are asked to send in full details without delay Letters and telegrams will be conveyed free by the Post Office

Sudan—A recent report from the Sudan states that the hopper campaign concluded in October except for certain areas in Western Sugan. The campaign was successful in most areas but numerous swaims escaped from the uncontrolled desert areas. The Majority of these swarm flew south-west, during October, and a few flew south. Comparatively lew flying swarms were reported from the southern provinces of the Sudan but of these, some were mature during October and any swarms remaining there have probably laid by now. Owing to swamps, tall grass and forest country control measures are not considered practicable in most parts of the southern provinces.

Tanganyıka—A report dated the 7th November, 1938, issued by the Department of Agriculture states that small swarms were scattered over a large part of the Musoma District, egg-laying has not yet taken place and there has been no damage to crops. The swarms which entered Mwanza have now left in a westerly direction and were last reported to be on the Biharamulo District boundary.
