Quorum and
procedure of
the Board

Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

4 (1) The chairman and three other members of the Board shall form a quorum

(2) Questions before the Board shall be decided by a majority of the votes of those present and voting, and, in the case of equality of votes, the chairman shall have a second or casting vote

(3) The chairman and members of the Board shall not be personally liable for any act or default of the Board done or omitted to be done in good faith in the course of the operations of the Board

(4) Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance and of any rules made thereunder, the meetings and procedure of the Board shall be such as the Board may from time to time determine

(5) The Board may appoint a secretary and other necessary officers, agents and servants, and may pay him and them such remuneration as the Governor may approve

(6) The Governor in any case in which he is satisfied that a member of the Board is incapacitated by illness, absence or other sufficient cause from performing the duties of his office may appoint some fit person to be a deputy to act for such member during his incapacity, and any such deputy while

A Bill to Amend the Farmers Assistance Ordinance, 1936

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Farmers Assistance (Amendment) Ordinance, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Farmers Assistance Ordinance, 1936, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

2 Sub-sections (1) and (3) of section 4 of the Principal Ordinance are hereby repealed and the following sub-sections are respectively substituted therefor —

Repeal and replacement of sub-sections (1) and (3) of section 4 of the Principal Ordinance

“(1) Four members of the Board shall form a quorum and, in the absence of the Judge of the Supreme Court appointed under the provisions of the last preceding section from any meeting of the Board, a chairman for such meeting shall be chosen by the members present

(3) The chairman, members of the Board, the agent appointed under section 6 of this Ordinance and any local representative of the agent shall not be personally liable for any act or default done or omitted to be done in good faith in exercise or supposed exercise of the powers given by this Ordinance or by any rules made thereunder ”

so acting shall have all the powers and authorities of the member for whom he is acting .

Sections 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to replace —

9 (1) Any farmer in the Colony may make application, through a Local Committee, to the Board for assistance in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance upon all or any of the following grounds—

- (a) that his liabilities exceed a reasonable valuation of his assets, or
- (b) that such action has been taken or has been threatened against him by his creditor or creditors as to render it impracticable for the farmer to continue his farming operations with a reasonable prospect of success, or
- (c) that by reason of the extent or nature of his obligations or because of lack of stock or absence of means of working his land in a proper manner or for any other good cause, he is unable to continue farming operations with a reasonable prospect of success

(2) Any farmer making application under this section shall forthwith give written notice of the application to all of his secured creditors

10 (1) Every application for assistance under section 9 of this Ordinance shall be made in the form prescribed and shall be filed by the applicant in the office of the appropriate Local Committee, together with an affidavit by the applicant in verification of the particulars contained in the application

(2) The applicant shall at the time he makes such application forward a copy thereof to the agent and such copy shall be filed in the office of the agent

(3) The particulars in every application shall include—

- (a) a complete list of all the creditors and debtors of the applicant,
- (b) a statement of the assets and liabilities of the applicant, and
- (c) a list of the securities held by the secured creditors on the property of the applicant

11 (1) Immediately upon the filing of the application as provided for in section 10 of this Ordinance the chairman of the Local Committee concerned shall, in respect of the applicant's estate—

- (a) issue an Interim Stay Order in the prescribed form, and
- (b) by writing under his hand appoint a Temporary Supervisor of the estate who shall be subject to the instructions of the agent

Provided that a chairman shall have a discretion in any case to refuse for good and sufficient reason so to issue an Interim Stay Order or to appoint a Temporary Supervisor, but in such event the chairman shall forthwith make a written report to the Board giving the reasons for his refusal, and the decision of the Board upon the matter shall be final

(2) The chairman shall forthwith cause notices relating to the making of the Interim Stay Order and to the appointment of the Temporary Supervisor to be published in the Gazette and to be sent to the Registrar. The chairman shall also forthwith forward a copy of every such Interim Stay Order to the Principal Registrar of Titles, who shall file the same in a register to be kept for the purpose, and such register shall be open to the public for inspection free of cost

12 (1) An Interim Stay Order shall remain in force until a meeting of the Board confirms or removes the Interim Stay Order

- (2) While an Interim Stay Order is in force—
 - (a) it shall have the effect of vesting all the property of the applicant in the agent, and
 - (b) all suits, actions, executions or other proceedings whether judicial or extra judicial against the farmer shall be stayed

(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph (b) of sub-section (2) of this section the grant of an Interim Stay Order shall not prevent and shall be deemed never to have prevented any person—

- (a) from instituting or proceeding with any suit, action or other proceeding for the purpose of determining the farmer's liability—
 - (i) for any tort committed by the farmer, or

(c) a list of the securities held by the secured creditors on the property of the applicant

(4) As soon as possible after a copy of the application has been received by the local representative such local representative, after making such inquiries as he may deem fit, shall forward his report and recommendations regarding the application to the agent in writing. On receipt of such report and recommendations the agent shall forthwith refer the matter to the Board

11 (1) The Board, after it has verified that the particulars furnished under section 10 of this Ordinance in respect of the applicant's secured creditors are complete and correct, shall meet to consider the application and the report and recommendations thereon of the local representative

Meeting of

(2) (a) If it appears to the Board that the application is one which should be granted the Board having given fourteen days' notice to the applicant's secured creditors, shall meet with a view to obtaining their consent to the granting of the application

(b) The secured creditors may attend such meeting either in person or by sending duly authorized agents

(c) Any secured creditor who fails to attend such meeting shall be deemed to have consented to the granting of the application and shall, in the event of the application being granted be deemed to have agreed to the arrangement

(3) In any case where the granting of the application is agreed to by seventy-five per centum in value of the secured creditors of the applicant based on the assessed value of their security as determined by the Board, the applicant shall be notified in writing by the Board that, subject to the particulars furnished under section 10 of this Ordinance being found correct and in the absence of opposition to the granting of the application by a majority in value and in numbers of the unsecured creditors as have a claim for not less than five pounds, the Board is prepared to issue a Stay Order and to file with the Registrar a Deed of Adjustment in the prescribed form, containing the terms and conditions of the proposed arrangement

(4) The Board shall at the time of notifying the applicant under the provisions of sub-section (3) of this section forward a copy of such notification to the chairman of the appropriate local committee

12 In any case where the consent of the secured creditors in the terms of the last preceding section has not been obtained, the application shall be refused and the Board shall forthwith inform the applicant accordingly

13 (1) (a) If the applicant wishes to proceed with his application he shall, within thirty days of the Board's notification under sub-section (3) of section 11 of this Ordinance, inform the chairman of the appropriate local committee in writing of his intention so to proceed

(b) In the event of the applicant not informing the chairman of the appropriate local committee in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (a) of this sub-section the application shall be deemed to have been withdrawn and no further action shall be taken thereon except with the leave of the Board for good cause shown

(2) Immediately upon the receipt of information from the applicant in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) of this section the chairman of the local committee concerned shall, in respect of the applicant's estate—

(a) issue an Interim Stay Order in the prescribed form, and

(b) by writing under his hand appoint a temporary supervisor of the estate who shall be subject to the instructions of the agent

(3) The chairman shall forthwith cause notices relating to the making of the Interim Stay Order and to the appointment of the temporary supervisor to be published in the Gazette and to be sent to the Registrar. The chairman shall also forthwith forward a copy of every such Interim Stay Order to the Principal Registrar of Titles, who shall file the same in a register to be kept for the purpose, and such register shall be open to the public for inspection free of cost

14 (1) An Interim Stay Order shall remain in force until a meeting of the Board confirms or removes the Interim Stay Order

(2) The applicant and/or his authorized agent shall be present at the meeting and the creditors of the applicant may attend either in person or by duly authorized agents or they may forward their views, in writing, to the chairman. No other person shall be permitted to be present at the meeting.

(3) At the meeting it shall be the duty of the chairman to encourage a free discussion of the applicant's financial position and he shall endeavour to obtain the view of the applicant and of his creditors upon any proposed adjustment of the applicant's position which appears desirable and equitable to the Local Committee.

(4) As soon as may be after the conclusion of the meeting, the chairman shall refer the matter to the Board in the prescribed form.

16 (1) When the application has been referred to the Board, the Board, having given fourteen days' notice to the applicant and his creditors, shall meet to consider the application and the report and recommendations thereon of the Local Committee.

(2) The applicant and/or his authorized agent shall attend the meeting and the creditors may attend such meeting either in person or by sending duly authorized agents.

Granting of
application

17 (1) In any case where, at the meeting of the Board, the arrangement proposed for the adjustment of the applicant's affairs is agreed to by —

(a) the Board, and

(b) seventy-five per centum in value of the secured creditors of the applicant based on the assessed value of their security as determined by the Board,

the Board shall confirm the arrangement and grant the application unless a majority in value and in numbers of the unsecured creditors present and voting as have a claim for not less than five pounds oppose the arrangement.

(2) Any creditor who fails to attend the meeting convened in accordance with section 16 of this Ordinance shall, in the event of the application being granted, be deemed to have agreed to such arrangement.

18 In any case where an arrangement in the terms of the last preceding section has not been confirmed, the application shall be refused and the Board shall forthwith remove the Interim Stay Order and terminate the appointment (if any).

(2) While an Interim Stay Order is in force—

(a) it shall have the effect of vesting all the property of the applicant in the agent, and

(b) all suits, actions, executions or other proceedings whether judicial or extra judicial against the farmer shall be stayed

(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph (b) of sub-section (2) of this section the grant of an Interim Stay Order shall not prevent and shall be deemed never to have prevented any person—

(a) from instituting or proceeding with any suit, action or other proceeding for the purpose of determining the farmer's liability—

(i) for any tort committed by the farmer, or

(ii) for any injury suffered by a workman in the employ of the farmer, or

(iii) under the Divorce Ordinance or for the support of the wife or children of the farmer, or Cap 170

(5) As soon as may be after the conclusion of the meeting, the chairman shall transmit the report and recommendations of the local committee to the Board

18 (1) If, after the discussion referred to in sub-section (3) of section 17 of this Ordinance has taken place, the local committee is of opinion that the application is one which should not be granted, the chairman shall postpone the meeting with the creditors and shall forthwith report such opinion, together with the reasons therefor, to the Board

Procedure when Local Committee is not in substantial agreement with the Board's proposals

(2) On receipt of such report the Board—

(a) if it agrees with the opinion of the local committee, shall refuse the application and shall forthwith remove the Interim Stay Order and shall terminate the appointment of the temporary supervisor, and shall publish a notice in the Gazette to that effect and shall notify the Registrar and the Principal Registrar of Titles,

(b) if it does not agree with the opinion of the local committee, shall inform the chairman of the local committee accordingly, whereupon such chairman shall call a further meeting of the local committee at which the applicant and/or his authorized agent shall, and the creditors of the applicant or their duly authorized agents may, be present. Reasonable notice of such further meeting shall be given to the applicant and all his creditors

(3) At such further meeting the procedure set forth in sub-section (4) of section 17 of this Ordinance shall be followed and as soon as may be after the conclusion of the meeting, the chairman shall transmit the report and recommendations of the local committee to the Board

18A If at the meeting of the Local Committee the application is opposed by a majority in value and in numbers of the unsecured creditors as have a claim for not less than five pounds the chairman shall forthwith report such opposition to the Board. 20 The Board shall not grant any application made by a farmer for an advance or formulate or submit or bring into force any scheme for the adjustment of the debts of any farmer unless it is satisfied that by so doing the farmer who is to be so assisted is deserving of assistance and will be enabled to continue his farming operations with a reasonable prospect of success

Section 21 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

Advances

21 (1) At any time after the granting of an application and while a Stay Order is in force the Board may, after such inquiry as it may deem necessary, authorize an advance for the purpose of providing a reasonable living allowance for the farmer whose application has been granted and for his dependants and for defraying the necessary expenditure of the farmer in connexion with the working and maintenance of his farm, and the marketing of his produce, and for any other expenditure for which the Board deems it proper that an advance should be made

Provided that—

(a) no advance under this section shall be made of an amount exceeding seventy per centum of the value of an average year's crop or produce as assessed by the Board,

(b) where an advance is to be applied towards the cost of permanent improvements (as defined in the First Schedule to the Crown Lands Ordinance) and/or movable assets essential to farming operations the amount of such advance shall not exceed sixty per centum of the value of the security as assessed by the Board

(2) As soon as may be after any such advance is authorized the Board shall publish in the Gazette the name and address of the farmer and the amount of the authorized advance

(3) The Board may provide for the repayment of any such advance by such instalments and upon such terms and conditions as the Board thinks fit. Such terms shall include provision for the payment of interest on the amount advanced at a rate to be notified from time to time by the Governor in Council

4 Section 20 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting the word "success" which occurs at the end thereof and by substituting therefor the words "meeting his obligations to his creditors in full or at such an amount as may be fixed in the Deed of Adjustment within a period of not more than five years"

(2) Any person having possession of or control over any documents, information, returns or forms relating to any of the matters aforesaid who communicates or attempts to communicate such information or anything contained in such documents, returns or forms to any person—

(a) other than a person to whom he is authorized by the Governor to communicate it, or

(b) otherwise than for the purposes of this Ordinance,

shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction before a magistrate of the first class to a fine of one hundred pounds or to imprisonment for six months or to both such fine and imprisonment ”

OBJECTS AND REASONS

At the request of the Governor in Council the Farmers Conciliation Board conducted an investigation and made recommendations with a view to improvement being made in the running of the conciliation machinery under the Farmers Assistance Ordinance, 1936

This Bill embodies in clause 3 the main recommendation that the procedure with regard to applications for assistance under the Ordinance shall ensure that the publicity involved in the publication of a Stay Order in the Gazette will only take place after the Board has considered that there is reasonable chance of the application being granted

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

Paragraph (h) of section 5 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

“5 The immigration into the Colony by land or sea of any person being or appearing to be of any of the classes defined by the following sub-sections (hereinafter called “prohibited immigrant”) is prohibited, that is to say —

(h) Any person entering or endeavouring to enter the Colony who not having received a free pardon has been convicted in the Colony of murder or of any offence for which a sentence of imprisonment has been passed for a term of not less than six months

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Immigration Restriction (Amendment No 2) Ordinance, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Immigration Restriction Ordinance (Chapter 62 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

LOCUST REPORT

THE SITUATION IN KENYA ON 24TH NOVEMBER, 1938

The Migratory Locust (*Locusta migratorioides*)

Since the publication of the last report dated 17th November, no further swarms have been reported as having entered the Colony from adjacent territories. The scattered flying swarm from the Uasin Gishu, now in the neighbourhood of Kipkabus, is moving slowly eastward towards Elgeyo, and is probably nearing the end of its activities. The swarm previously reported from Kampi-ya-Moto-Rongai is still circling in the district and scattered laying has taken place over approximately 50-80 square miles. There is a further large swarm in the neighbourhood of Nakuru west of Menengai, and laying is now taking place.

The campaign against hoppers in the Trans Nzoia-Uasin Gishu area continues and successful kills are being obtained. Plentiful supplies of bait have been distributed to various stations and sidings along the railway and all farmers in the area are urged to collect bait and to proceed with the destruction of hoppers without delay as soon as they are observed to be feeding freely. Attention is again drawn to the fact that the baiting of hoppers in the first week or ten days of their life is not always satisfactory, but after this period, when they have commenced to feed, results are excellent, and the dead hoppers may be found in the shade of trees, bushes and tufts of grass, etc.

The latest information regarding swarms in the various districts is as follows —

Kerio Valley—Two swarms are now present in the valley, the second swarm arriving from Kamasia on the 15th November. Egg laying is reported to have taken place on both sides of the Kerio River.

Kamasia—This area is now reported to be free from flying locusts, the remaining swarms having proceeded southwards in the direction of Menengai and Solai.

Solai-Subukia—Scattered laying has occurred on several farms and it is reported that a large proportion of the eggs appear to have been destroyed by ants or other agencies.

Ol Punyata-Lower Molo—Scattered laying is now taking place on farms in the district. Destruction of the hoppers will be effected by burning.

Ravine—Hoppers have commenced to appear in scattered bands on two farms and bait is now being laid down.

South Kavirondo—A report from Kisii states that egg laying in scattered patches has taken place during the past week in two small areas of approximately six and twelve square miles extent. Destruction of eggs by digging is being carried out.

Nairo Moru—A small thin swarm of locusts is reported to have passed down the Ngobit Valley on 17th November. The locusts are described as immature.

In the report for October issued by the Government of Anglo-Egyptian Sudan mention is made of a number of flying swarms. These have mainly moved south-westerly but it is reported that flying locusts are present east of Juba, having arrived presumably from Abyssinia.

Since there is a danger of invasion taking place between now and February, 1939, it is advised that all stock farmers take steps to preserve their grass in the form of hay and to plant Lucerne and other food-stuffs for stock, in case grazing is destroyed by locusts.

Reference to the poison baiting of locust hoppers was made in a report issued by the Government of South Africa for October. The report states that the results obtained were excellent and farmers are pleased with the poison bait policy, which has emerged successfully from the first large scale test in a widespread and serious outbreak of hoppers.
