LOCUST REPORT

THE SITUATION IN KENYA ON 1ST DECEMBER, 1938

The Migratory Locust (*Locusta migratorioides*)

From the information received since the publication of the last report dated 24th November, it would appear that egg-laying is now general in most areas where locusts are present. The laying swarm from the neighbourhood of Kipkabus, previously reported to be proceeding slowly towards Elgeyo, is now dying out and only a few scattered and sluggish swarms remain. Egg-laying by this swarm has been fairly general in all cultivated land in the Kipkabus district and hoppers may be expected to emerge during the next few weeks. No further swarms have been reported from the Trans Nzoia-Uasin Gishu area, but large numbers of hoppers continue to emerge over a wide area between Soy and Eldoret.

The large swarm which has been in the neighbourhood of Nakuru since the middle of November has laid thinly over an area of some fifty square miles and has now moved south in the direction of Eburru. Scattered groups of hoppers are beginning to appear at Rongai but as yet no large-scale hatching has occurred. Initial supplies of bait have already been sent to this area and further supplies will be sent from now onwards, but it is not expected that baiting will become general for another two weeks.

The latest information regarding other swarms is given below.

Kerio Valley—Flying locusts are still present east of Nabkoi but it is reported that no laying has taken place. Specimens from this swarm have been examined by the Entomologist in Charge, who reports that some of them are infested with worms and others with the eggs and larvæ of a fly. Scattered laying has occurred in small patches in other districts in this area and most of the eggs have already been destroyed by digging.

Kamasia—A few small swarms from Elgeyo and Ravine entered the southern end of the reserve. These swarms, which were mating, passed in a southerly direction towards Lower Molo and it is reported that scattered laying occurred *en route*.

Solai—A fresh swarm arrived in the district from Kamasia on the 20th November and moved in the direction of Ol Punyata. A report from this district states that egg-laying occurred on the 23rd.

South Kavirondo—A recent report from this district states that in one of the areas laid over large numbers of eggs have been destroyed by digging. Hoppers are now appearing in the other area and destruction by beating will be carried out.

POISON BAITING

It is felt that some doubts still exist in the minds of farmers regarding the absence of danger to stock when bait is used and the Entomologist in Charge states that there is no danger when bait is distributed in the manner recommended by the Department.

Uganda—In the locust summary for October the Senior Entomologist states that the migratory locust continued to spread towards the south and west. Egg-laying occurred at four places in north-eastern Bugishu but apart from this small area the Eastern Province was free from locusts. Egg-laying also occurred in seven areas in northern Lango, and further laying is expected to take place during November in all districts

affected by this locust. The total number of swarms in the Protectorate is small.

It is stated that sustained efforts will be made to reduce as far as possible under local conditions the progeny of any breeding which may occur in Uganda.
