#### LOCUST REPORT

THE SITUATION IN KENYA ON 81H DECEMBER, 1938
The Migratory Locust (Locusta migratorioides)

No fresh swarms have been reported within the Colony since the publication of the last report dated 1st December, 1938 Several small scattered swarms are present but the only large swarm now known to exist is the laying swarm which has been active near Nakuru This swarm was last reported to be proceeding southwards in the direction of Ebuiru and has since laid, just north of Lake Elmenteita. The swarm is now in the vicinity of Gilgil and a further laying may be expected to take place within the next few days. As far as is known this swarm has already laid on two occasions but, like the other large swarm which laid in Nzoia, it is probably made up of flyers of differing ages and in consequence the period over which it lays may be extended somewhat

Large numbers of hoppers continue to emerge in the Nzoia-Uasin Gishu area and the campaign for their destruction is being waged most vigorously gratifying to be able to record that vast numbers of hoppers have already been destroyed In a report received from this area it is stated that the enormous hopper bands which were seen by many crossing the large stretch of main road near Hoey's Bridge for three full weeks, do not now exist This result was achieved by spreading bait daily during a period of fourteen aays, about a hundred bags being used each day This result in itself is ample justification for the use of poison bait and should serve to convince any who may still doubt is efficacy. It is important to realize that in the case of these large hopper bands persistent baiting is essential

The latest information from other areas is as follows —

Southern Kamasia—There are no flying locusts in this district o her than a few stragglers from a swarm which passed through about a week ago. The swarm is reported to have laid in patches over about four square miles, and further isolated laying took place over a fairly wide area.

Kisumu-Londiani — Small bands of hoppers have commenced to appear in the Kibos sugar area and these are being destroyed by hand. The infestation so far, only amounts to a few acres

Narok—This district is now reported to be free from locusts, the last few stragglers having died out. No laying has taken place

Owing to the fact that stiagglers from the laying swarms may remain in a few districts after the passage of the main swarm, isolated laying by these stragg'ers may take place. It is important that the presence of these locusts should be reported so that steps may be taken to prevent the escape of flyers from the resulting hopper bands
