LOCUST REPORT

The situation in Kenya on the 15th December, 1938
The Migratory Locust (Locusta migratorioides)

During the past week there have been no reports of laying by any of the small swarms. The large swarm which laid in the vicinity of Gilgil is now proceeding southwards towards Eburru and further laying is expected. A small off-shoot from this swarm is circling to the south of Lake Nakuru and scattered laying has taken place on several farms in the district

The small swarms reported from Thomson's Falls and Rumuruti continue to circle in that area but up to the present time no laying has been reported. For some time past, these swarms have been in the condition at which laying is imminent but they are reported to have been kept to the ground by adverse weather conditions, and this factor has no doubt retarded their final development

Scattered flyers are present in several districts recently visited by the large swarms previously reported, but with the exception of these no adult locusts other than those mentioned above now remain in the Colony

Hoppers have continued to emerge in the Nzoia-Uasin Gishu area and energetic and persistent efforts for their destruction are being made. Hatching has been most irregular and has continued on the same land for several weeks, resulting in hopper bands of greatly differing ages, and necessitating continuous baiting over wide areas

Of the other areas visited by laying swarms, Ravine and Rongai are the only two with hoppers of an age suitable for successful baiting and this is now being proceeded with Hoppers have commenced to appear at Solai and Ol Punyata and baiting will be carried out in this area in due course

Sudan—The report for November states that a few flying swarms were present on the Red Sea coast near the Eritrean border and breeding took place there Swarms were reported in Southern Kordofan moving mainly eastward and flyers are also stated to have entered eastern Sudan from Abyssinia In western Sudan flying swarms were reported moving mainly south and west Hoppers were present in the Nyala district but the area was reported to be clear by the end of the month There were three reports of flying swarms in Equatoria Province, one of which entered the extreme south from the east and hoppers were reported near Juba


