THE distribution of the several small swarms in the

large stretches of land previously infested with hoppers are reported to be clear In the Ravine and Rongai districts destruction of the scattered hopper bands is being effected by poison baiting, burning, and in some instances by beating out Hoppers have commenced to appear to the east of Nakuru and from now onwards further hatchings in this district may be expected

Referring to the scattered laying which took place over a wide area in Kamasia towards the end of November, the District Commissioner states that it is anticipated that there will be no difficulty in dealing with any hoppers which may emerge

Colony has remained unchanged since the publication of the last report dated 15th December, 1938, and no fresh swarms have been reported The large swarm which commenced to lay near Nakuru towards the end of November has continued its movement southwards, proceeding as tar as Lake Naivasha, and was last reported to be moving in a westerly direction towards the Mau This swarm has done a fair amount of damage to grazing and the locusts have also shown a liking for the papyrus on the fringe of the Lake Several small sections have split off from the main body but on the whole these have followed the same route as the parent swarm A feature of some of these sections is the great preponderance of males but an exception to this is the small offshoot now circling near Nakuru and laying in that district

Hopper destruction is being carried out in the Trans Nzoia-Uasin Gishu, Ravine and at Rongai The results of the vigorous control measures carried out in the first-named area is now becoming apparent, and The proposed works will consist of a canal 1,420 feet long

A plan may be seen at the office of the Director of Public Works, Nairobi

The application will subsequently be considered for a Water Right
