His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the following Bill being introduced into the Legislative Council.

A Bill to Amend the Non-European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1932

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

This Ordinance may be cited as the Non-European Officers' Pensions (War Service) Ordinance, 1941, and shall be No. 53 of 1932. read as one with the Non-European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1932, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

War service to count for pension purposes.

- 2. Where a non-European officer shall have served with His Majesty's Forces in time of war, with the approval of the Governor of the territory in the service of which he was last employed before so serving or of the Secretary of State, the following provisions shall have effect:—
 - (1) during the period of such service in His Majesty's 10 Forces, including any period after the termination of the war (in this section referred to as "military service"), he shall be deemed, for the purposes of the Principal Ordinance, to have been on leave on full salary from the public service in which he was last 15 employed, and to have held the substantive office last held by him in that service, prior to military service;
 - (2) during any period between his leaving the public service for the purpose of serving in His Majesty's Forces and the date of his commencing military 20 service, he shall, for the purposes of the Principal Ordinance, be deemed to be on leave without pay, not granted on grounds of public policy, from the public service in which he was last employed and to have held the substantive office last held by him in 25 that service, prior to military service; and during any period between the termination of his military service and the date of his re-entering the public service he shall, for the said purposes, be deemed to be on leave as aforesaid from the service, and to have held the 30 substantive office, in which he is re-employed:

Provided that—

(a) this section shall not apply when either period mentioned in paragraph (2) of this section exceeds three months, or such 35 longer period as the Governor, with the

approval of the Secretary of State, may in any special case determine; or if the officer fails, after serving with His Majesty's Forces, to re-enter the public service otherwise than in circumstances in which he would be permitted, under the law applicable to the public service in which he is last employed prior to military service, to retire on pension or gratuity, such circumstances arising not later than the expiration of three months, or such longer period as may be determined as aforesaid after the termination of his military service;

(b) if during any period mentioned in paragraph (1) of this section the officer shall have qualified for pension, or received emoluments in lieu of pension rights, actually in respect of military service, paragraph (1) of this section shall, as respects that period, have effect as if the words "leave without salary not granted on grounds of public policy" were substituted for the words "leave on full salary";

(c) if during his military service the officer shall be injured or killed he shall not, for the purposes of section 18 of the Principal Ordinance and Regulation 10 of the Regulations contained in the Schedule to the Principal Ordinance, be deemed to have been injured or killed in the discharge of his duty;

(d) the provisions of this section which require that the officer shall be deemed to have held a specified office and to have been on leave from a specified service shall not apply in respect of any period during which he shall actually have held any other substantive office and have been on leave from any public service;

(e) save where in any particular case the Governor otherwise directs, this section shall not apply where the office in the public service last held by the officer prior to military service was not a pensionable office.

OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill provides that the time spent by non-European officers on war service will count as service on full pay for the purposes of pension.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

NAKURU, GILGIL AND MOLO TOWNSHIP PLOTS

NOTICE

NOTICE is hereby given that grants in respect of the plots at Nakuru, Gilgil and Molo specified in the Schedules hereto, will be sold by public auction at the District Commissioner's Office at Nakuru on Friday, the 31st January, 1941, commencing at 10.30 a.m.

Plans of the plots may be seen at the Public Map Office of the Department of Lands and Settlement, Government Road, Nairobi, and at the office of the District Commissioner at Nakuru, or may be had separately on application to the Department of Lands and Settlement, P.O. Box 89, Nairobi, on payment of the following sums:—

The right to withdraw any plot from the auction is reserved to the Commissioner of Lands.

In the following General and Special Conditions of Sale, the term "Authority" means the District Commissioner, Nakuru, or such other Municipal Authority as may be hereafter established by law.

CONDITIONS OF SALE

(a) Auction

- 1. Each plot will be auctioned separately.
- 2. The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer, and no bidding shall be retracted.
- 3. The highest bidder will be the purchaser, but if any dispute arise as to any bid, the plot will be re-offered at the last undisputed bid.
- 4. Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of 25 per cent of the purchase money. In default of such payment, the plot may be immediately reoffered for sale, and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
- 5. Each purchaser shall on paying the deposit inform the auctioneer of the name or names of the person or persons on whose behalf the plot is purchased; the grant will be issued in accordance with this information.
- 6. The balance of the purchase money and the roads and drains contribution, together with the rent due to the 31st December, 1941, the survey fees, the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 120) and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent on the purchase price and on the rent) and all other expenses, if any, shall be paid to the Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi.

All these amounts shall be paid within seven days of a demand being made therefor.

Upon such payments being duly made, the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140, Revised Edition), and to the Conditions of Sale having been complied with, be entitled to a grant of the plot, which grant shall be presented to him duly executed as soon as conveniently may be.

Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter, unless and until the Commissioner of Lands can present to the purchaser the grant duly executed.

7. Subject to the proviso contained in Condition No. 6, if the amounts therein mentioned are not paid as therein laid down within seven days of a demand being made therefor, the Commissioner of Lands may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited, and the purchaser shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

(b) General

- 1. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantees shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.
- 2. No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the Authority, and by the Commissioner of Lands, or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the District Commissioner, Nakuru, for necessary action.
- 3. Grants will be made under the Crown Lands Ordinance and titles will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance. The term of the grants for plots in Schedules Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 will be 99 years from the 1st day of February, 1941. For plots in Schedules Nos. 5 and 6 the term of each grant will be 25 years from the 1st day of February, 1941, subject to extension to 99 years if at any time during the term of the grant a main building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete on proper foundations be erected on the plot.
- 4. The grantee may at any time during the currency of the grant redeem up to three-quarters of the rent of the plot as shown on the Schedule on the basis of twenty years' purchase.
- 5. The grantee shall not at any time sub-divide the plot, or assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any portions of the plot without the previous written consent of the Governor.
- 6. Any building erected shall conform to a building line decided upon by the Authority.

(c) Special

- 1. Owing to previous commitments occupation of the plots in Schedule No. 1 is restricted to persons of pure European descent.
- 2. Plots in Schedules Nos. 1 and 2 shall be used for residential purposes and no building erected on any plot shall at any time be used for any other purpose than that of a dwelling-house.
- 3. At no time during the term of the grant shall more than one dwelling-house with the necessary offices and outbuildings be erected on any plot mentioned in Schedules Nos. 1 and 2 without the consent of the Governor.
- 4. All outbuildings, offices, etc., on plots in Schedules Nos. 1 and 2 shall be properly sited and screened from view to the satisfaction of the Authority or such other person as may be appointed, and shall be kept so screened during the term of the grant.

- 5. The grantee of any plot in Schedules Nos. 1 and 2 shall not at any time during the term of the grant erect any building or buildings so as to cover more than one half of the area of the plot.
- 6. At no time during the term of the grant shall any building erected on any plot in Schedule No. 3 be used for residential purposes and the plot and the buildings erected thereon shall be used for business purposes only.
- 7. The grantee of any plot in Schedule No. 3 shall not at any time during the term of the grant erect any building or buildings so as to cover more than 90 per cent of the area of the plot.
- 8. The plots mentioned in Schedules Nos. 4, 5 and 6 may be used for business purposes only, or for the combined purposes of business and residence:

Provided that in the event of the plot being used for the said combined purposes, then not more than one half of the area thereof shall be built upon; otherwise not more than 90 per cent of the area thereof shall be built upon.

- 9. At no time during the term of the grant shall any plot in Schedules 3, 4, 5 and 6 or any portion thereof, or any building erected on the plot be used for the purpose of carrying on any trade or business which has been or may be declared to be dangerous or offensive by notice in the Official Gazette.
- 10. Verandahs may be erected on plots in Schedules Nos. 3, 4, 5 and 6 within a road reserve with the previous consent of the Authority and must conform to a building line decided upon by such Authority.
- 11. In no case shall the area of any plot specified in Schedules Nos. 3, 4, 5 and 6 used solely for business purposes required to remain unbuilt on be less than

300 square feet or 10 per cent of the area whichever is the greater, and the said area shall be free from any erection thereon above the level of the ground except latrine accommodation constructed in accordance with all laws and by-laws in force relating thereto, and in accordance with a design approved by the Authority.

Such open space shall be at the rear of the building, and shall extend along the entire width of the building, or for a distance of not less than 30 feet whichever shall be the less, and the distance across such open space from every part of the building to the rear boundary of the plot shall be not less than 10 feet.

- 12. Each purchaser of a plot in Schedules Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 shall erect within two years of the commencement of his grant a building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete on proper foundations.
- 13. Each purchaser of a plot in Schedules Nos. 5 and 6 shall erect within two years of the commencement of his grant a building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick, concrete, or wood and iron on proper foundations.
- 14. Under the provisions of section 60(b) of the Crown Lands Ordinance grantees of all the plots will be required to pay municipal rates upon the whole of the rateable interest assessed on these plots. A clause will, therefore, be embodied in each grant providing for the necessary adjustment between the grantee and Government.
