His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the following Bill being introduced into the Legislative Council.

A Bill to Amend the Vagrancy Ordinance

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

Cap. 63.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Vagrancy (Amendment) Ordinance, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Vagrancy Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Amendment of the definition of "vagrant".

- 2. The definition of "vagrant" in section 2 of the 5 Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—
 - (i) by inserting therein the words "employment or" between the word "has" and the word "visible" in paragraph (b) thereof; and
 - (ii) by deleting therefrom the words "and not having any 10 visible" in paragraph (c) thereof and by substituting therefor the words "being unable to show that he has employment or visible and sufficient".

Repeal and replacement of of section 3 of the Principal Ordinance.

Police may arrest without warrant for offences under the Ordinance.

- 3. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:— 15
 - "3. Any police officer may arrest without warrant any person who is apparently a vagrant or who he has reasonable grounds to believe has committed an offence under this Ordinance, and shall take such person before a magistrate as soon as possible."

Amendment of section 10 of the Principal Ordinance.

- 4. Section 10 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—
 - (i) by substituting a semi-colon for the full stop at the end of sub-section (1) thereof and by adding immediately after such semi-colon the words "and the 25 magistrate may order him to be again repatriated, and he shall be repatriated accordingly."; and
 - (ii) by substituting a semi-colon for the full stop at the end of sub-section (3) thereof and by adding the words "and the magistrate may order him to be 30 returned again to the area (if any) reserved for the use of his tribe or sub-tribe, and he shall be returned accordingly."

Amendment of section 11 of the Principal Ordinance.

5. Section 11 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by substituting a semi-colon for the full stop at the 35 end of sub-section (3) thereof and by adding immediately after such semi-colon the words "and the magistrate may again order him to be returned to such area, and he shall be returned accordingly."

6. Section 14 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment amended-

of section 14 of the Principal Ordinance.

- (i) by inserting the words "or upon any premises without the consent of the owner or occupier" between the word "about" and the word "be" in the fourth line of sub-section (1) thereof:
- (ii) by substituting a comma for the semi-colon at the end of the third line of sub-section (2) thereof and by adding immediately after such comma the words "and on conviction shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months:"; and
- (iii) by substituting the word "be" for the word "by" in the fourth line of sub-section (2) thereof.

OBJECTS AND REASONS

Clause 2 of this Bill relieves a person who can show that he has employment from coming within the definition of "vagrant".

- 2. Clause 3 empowers a police officer to arrest without a warrant any person who has committed an offence under the Ordinance.
- 3. Clauses 4 and 5 remedy an omission under the existing law and give power to a magistrate to send back to his country or area a person who has previously been repatriated as a vagrant and has committed an offence by returning without permission.
- 4. Under section 14 of the Principal Ordinance police action is now limited, in the case of juveniles, to children who are "found wandering about". The object of clause 6(i) is to include children who are found upon premises without the consent of the owner or occupier.
- 5. Clause 6(iii) provides a penalty for a juvenile who again leaves the custody of his parents or guardian after being ordered by a magistrate to return to them; it having been held that in the absence of such provision lines 4 and 5 of section 14(2) of the Principal Ordinance are inoperative. The opportunity has been taken to correct a typographical error in the same sub-section.
- 6. No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE

(Chapter 140, Revised Laws of Kenya)

NAIROBI RESIDENTIAL AND BUSINESS PLOTS

NOTICE is hereby given that grants in respect of the plots at Nairobi specified in the Schedules hereto will be sold by auction at the office of the Commissioner of Lands and Settlement, Nairobi, on Friday the 28th March, 1941, commencing at 11 a.m.

 - 4. The grantee shall not at any time divide the plot.
