His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the following Bill being introduced into the Legislative Council.

A Bill to Amend the Museums Trustees Ordinance, 1938

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

This Ordinance may be cited as the Museums Short title. Trustees (Amendment) Ordinance, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Museums Trustees Ordinance, 1938, herein- No. 40 of 1938. after referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of 5 2. amended—

section 4 of the Principal Ordinance.

(a) by deleting paragraph (c) of sub-section (1) thereof and by substituting therefor the following paragraph:—

"(c) One councillor of the Municipal Council of Nairobi to be nominated by such Council:

Provided that, if the councillor nominated by such Council ceases to be a member of such Council, such Council may require such councillor to resign from the Board and may nominate another councillor to be a member of the Board in place of the member so required to resign; and";

(b) by substituting a colon for the full stop which occurs at the end of sub-section (4) thereof and by adding, after such colon, the following immediately proviso:—

"Provided that a councillor nominated by the Municipal Council of Nairobi shall be appointed for a period of one year only";

(c) by adding, at the end thereof, the following new subsection:—

"(12) No person who is a member of the Board or who has been a member of the Board within the preceding six months shall be appointed as a paid officer or servant of the Board, and no paid officer or servant of the Board shall be appointed as a member of the Board."

OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill has been prepared at the instance of the Municipal Council of Nairobi to give effect to the following proposals:—

- (1) The member representing the Municipal Council of Nairobi on the Board shall be appointed for a period of one year only. At present all members of the Board are appointed for five years;
- (2) The member representing the Municipal Council of Nairobi may, on ceasing to be a member of the Council, be required by the Council to resign from the Board;
- (3) A paid officer or servant of the Board shall not be appointed to be a member of the Board and a member of the Board shall not be appointed as a paid officer or servant of the Board.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE

(Chapter 140, Revised Laws of Kenya)

NAIROBI RESIDENTIAL AND BUSINESS PLOTS

NOTICE is hereby given that grants in respect of the plots at Nairobi specified in the Schedules hereto will be sold by auction at the office of the Commissioner of Lands and Settlement, Nairobi, on Friday the 28th March, 1941, commencing at 11 a.m.

Plans of the plots may be seen at the Department of Lands and Settlement or may be had on application on payment of Sh. 3 each, post free.

The right to withdraw any plot from the auction is reserved to the Commissioner of Lands.

CONDITIONS OF SALE

(a) Auction

1. The usual conditions of auction in respect of Government plots will apply.

(b) General

- 1. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantees shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes, or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.
- 2. The design, standard and type of construction and the siting of the buildings shall be the subject of approval by the Municipal Council of Nairobi and by the Commissioner of Lands, and no building shall be erected on any plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the Municipal Council and by the Commissioner or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the Town Clerk, Nairobi, for necessary action.
- 3. Grants will be subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance and titles will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance. The term of the grants will be 99 years from the 1st day of April, 1941.
 - 4. The grantee shall not at any time divide the plot.
- 5. Grantees will be required to pay Municipal rates upon the whole of the rateable interest and Government's contribution in lieu of rates assessed on the plot. A clause will therefore be embodied in the grant providing for the necessary adjustment between the grantee and Government.
- 6. Any building erected shall conform to a building line decided upon by the Municipal Council.

(c) Special Conditions in respect of the Residential Plots in Schedules 1, 2 and 3

- 1. Plots shall be used for residential purposes and no buildings erected thereon shall at any time during the term of the grant be used for any other purpose than a dwelling-house or an appurtenance thereof.
- 2. Each purchaser shall erect within two years from the commencement of the grant a building of stone, burnt brick or concrete on proper foundations. The buildings to be erected on plots in Schedule 1 must be of a superior type in conformity with those already erected in this area.
- 3. At no time during the term of the grant shall more than one dwelling-house with the necessary offices and outbuildings be erected on any plot without the consent of the Governor.
- 4. The grantee of a plot shall not at any time during the term of the grant erect any building or buildings so as to cover more than one-half of the area of the plot.
- 5. All outbuildings, offices, &c., erected on plots shall be properly sited and screened from view to the satisfaction of the Municipal Council or such other person as may be appointed and shall be kept so screened during the term of the grant.
- 6. The grantee may at any time during the currency of the grant redeem up to three-quarters of the rent of the plot as shown in the Schedules on the basis of twenty years purchase.

(d) Special Conditions in Respect of the Business Plots in Schedules 4 and 5

- 1. Plots shall be used for business purposes but subject to the Municipal By-laws, buildings may also be used for residential purposes.
- 2. Each purchaser of a plot shall erect a building of stone, burnt brick or concrete on proper foundations. In the case of plots in Schedule No. 4, the building shall be completed within three years from the commencement of the grant; in the case of plots in Schedule No. 5 the building shall be completed within two years of the commencement of the grant. The buildings on plots in Schedule No. 4 shall conform in architectural design to the amenities of the neighbourhood. They shall be of not less than two storeys in height and except with the consent in writing of the Commissioner of Lands of a value of not less than Sh. 1/25 per cubic foot of building content.
- 3. The grantee of a plot in Schedule No. 4 may at any time during the currency of the grant redeem up to one-half of the rent of the plot as shown in the Schedule on the basis of 20 years purchase.

The grantee of a plot in Schedule No. 5 may similarly redeem up to three-quarters of the rent of the plot as shown in the Schedule.

- 4. At no time during the term of the grant shall any plot or any portion thereof or any buildings erected on any plot be used for the purposes of carrying on any trade or business which has been or may be declared to be dangerous or offensive by notice in the Official Gazette.
- 5. Verandahs attached to buildings may be erected within a road reserve with the previous consent of the Municipal Council, and must conform to a building line decided upon by the said Council.

Notes.—The attention of prospective purchasers is invited to the following notes:—

- 1. Purchasers will not be liable for any cost for road construction other than that set out in the Schedule. Roads not already constructed will be made when in the opinion of the Government necessity exists. Upon completion of construction maintenance will be undertaken by the Municipal Council.
- 2. The cost of roads and drains shown in Schedule No. 4 for Plots Nos. 2651, 2652, 2653 and 2654 include the apportionate cost of a main sewer along Queensway. Purchasers will be required to bear the cost of connecting sewers.
- 3. The cost of roads and drains shown in Schedule No. 5 for Plots Nos. 2431 and 2432 include the apportionate cost of a main sewer to serve them and purchasers will be required to bear the cost of connecting sewers.
- 4. Plots L.R. Nos. 1702/12, 13, 15, 16, 18, 19 and 20 are already served by water mains and purchasers of

these plots will have to bear the Municipal charge for connecting with these mains.

The water mains for Plots Nos. 1702/22 28 have not yet been installed. The cost is estimated at £165. Before the installation will be undertaken by the Municipal Council the purchasers of plots in this group will be required to guarantee to the Council a return, inclusive of water payments, of not less than 10 per cent per annum on the capital outlay, such guarantee to cease when the revenue from the supply of water to the group at normal rates reaches 30 per cent of the capital outlay. The Municipal charges for connexion will also be payable.

- 5. Government reserves the right to create a road reserve at a width of fifty feet bordering J lot L.R. No. 1702/22.
- 6. Under Government Notice No. 37 of 1941 the permission of the Supply Board is required for the erection of a building exceeding £250 in value.
