

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 172

His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the following Bill being introduced into the Legislative Council.

A Bill to Amend the Local Government (Rating) Ordinance, 1928

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

No. 20 of 1928.

Amendment of section 3(1) of the Principal Ordinance.

No. 19 of 1928.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Local Government (Rating) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Local Government (Rating) Ordinance, 1928, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by substituting a colon for the full stop which appears at the end thereof and by adding thereto, immediately after such colon, the following proviso:—

"Provided that where under paragraph (b) of section 29 the provisions of this Ordinance have been declared to apply to the whole or to any part of a Grade "A" Township and such township or part thereof is subsequently declared under the provisions of section 11 of the Local Government (Municipalities) Ordinance, 1928, to be a municipality, it shall not be necessary for a further valuation to be made until the expiration of 5 years from the date when the last valuation was made in respect of such township or part thereof to which this Ordinance was applied, or such longer period as the Governor may approve."

OBJECTS AND REASONS

By section 3(1) of the Principal Ordinance the local authority must cause a valuation to be made of all rateable property within the municipality not less than once in every five years. The object of this Bill is to provide that when a Grade "A" Township is declared to be a municipality it shall not be necessary to make a valuation until the expiration of five years from the date when the last valuation was made in respect of the township.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A Bill to Amend the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Interpretation Snort title and General Clauses (Amendment) Ordinance, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Chapter 1 of the Revised Edition), Cap. 1. 5 hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended by the insertion therein between paragraphs (3) and the Principal (4) thereof of the following new paragraph:—

section 2 of Ordinance.

"(3)A "cognizable to the Police" used with reference to an offence shall mean that any police officer may 10 arrest without warrant any person whom he suspects upon reasonable grounds of having committed that offence."

OBJECTS AND REASONS

In several Ordinances it has been provided that offences under those Ordinances shall be "cognizable to the police".

There is no definition of the expression "cognizable to the police" and it is obviously desirable that this omission should be rectified.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A Bill to Amend the European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1927

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

No. 11 of 1927.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the European Officers' Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1941, and shall be read as one with the European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1927, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Amendment of section 19 of the Principal Ordinance.

- 2. Section 19 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby 5 amended by adding thereto, immediately after sub-section (2) thereof, the following new sub-section:—
 - "(3) If a European officer proceeding by a route approved by the Governor to or from the Colony at the commencement or termination of his service therein, or 10 of a period of leave therefrom, dies as the result of damage to the vessel, aircraft or vehicle in which he is travelling, or of any act of violence directed against such vessel, aircraft or vehicle, and the Governor is satisfied that such damage or act is attributable to circumstances arising out of war in which His Majesty may be engaged, such officer shall be deemed, for the purposes of this section, to have died in the circumstances described in sub-section (1) of this section."

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of this Bill is to make it clear that, for the purposes of the Pensions law, a European officer who is killed by enemy action when travelling to and from the Colony is to be regarded as killed on duty.

It is not possible to state what expenditure of public moneys would be incurred if the provisions of this Bill were to become law.

THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE

(Chapter 140, Revised Laws of Kenya)

NAIROBI RESIDENTIAL AND BUSINESS PLOTS

NOTICE is hereby given that grants in respect of the plots at Nairobi specified in the Schedules hereto will be sold by auction at the office of the Commissioner of Lands and Settlement, Nairobi, on Friday the 28th March, 1941, commencing at 11 a.m.

Plans of the plots may be seen at the Department of Lands and Settlement or may be had on application on payment of Sh. 3 each, post free.

The right to withdraw any plot from the auction is reserved to the Commissioner of Lands.

CONDITIONS OF SALE

(a) Auction

1. The usual conditions of auction in respect of Government plots will apply.

(b) General

- 1. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantees shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes, or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.
- 2. The design, standard and type of construction and the siting of the buildings shall be the subject of approval by the Municipal Council of Nairobi and by the Commissioner of Lands, and no building shall be erected on any plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the Municipal Council and by the Commissioner or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the Town Clerk, Nairobi, for necessary action.
- 3. Grants will be subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance and titles will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance. The term of the grants will be 99 years from the 1st day of April, 1941.
 - 4. The grantee shall not at any time divide the plot.
- 5. Grantees will be required to pay Municipal rates upon the whole of the rateable interest and Government's contribution in lieu of rates assessed on the plot. A clause will therefore be embodied in the grant providing for the necessary adjustment between the grantee and Government.
- 6. Any building erected shall conform to a building line decided upon by the Municipal Council.

- (c) Special Conditions in respect of the Residential Plots in Schedules 1, 2 and 3
- 1. Plots shall be used for residential purposes and no buildings erected thereon shall at any time during the term of the grant be used for any other purpose than a dwelling-house or an appurtenance thereof.
- 2. Each purchaser shall erect within two years from the commencement of the grant a building of stone, burnt brick or concrete on proper foundations. The buildings to be erected on plots in Schedule 1 must be of a superior type in conformity with those already erected in this area.
- 3. At no time during the term of the grant shall more than one dwelling-house with the necessary offices and outbuildings be erected on any plot without the consent of the Governor.
- 4. The grantee of a plot shall not at any time during the term of the grant erect any building or buildings so as to cover more than one-half of the area of the plot.
- 5. All outbuildings, offices, &c., erected on plots shall be properly sited and screened from view to the satisfaction of the Municipal Council or such other person as may be appointed and shall be kept so screened during the term of the grant.
- 6. The grantee may at any time during the currency of the grant redeem up to three-quarters of the rent of the plot as shown in the Schedules on the basis of twenty years purchase.

(d) Special Conditions in Respect of the Business Plots in Schedules 4 and 5

- 1. Plots shall be used for business purposes but subject to the Municipal By-laws, buildings may also be used for residential purposes.
- 2. Each purchaser of a plot shall erect a building of stone, burnt brick or concrete on proper foundations. In the case of plots in Schedule No. 4, the building shall be completed within three years from the commencement of the grant; in the case of plots in Schedule No. 5 the building shall be completed within two years of the commencement of the grant. The buildings on plots in Schedule No. 4 shall conform in architectural design to the amenities of the neighbourhood. They shall be of not less than two storeys in height and except with the consent in writing of the Commissioner of Lands of a value of not less than Sh. 1/25 per cubic foot of building content.
- 3. The grantee of a plot in Schedule No. 4 may at any time during the currency of the grant redeem up to one-half of the rent of the plot as shown in the Schedule on the basis of 20 years purchase.

The grantee of a plot in Schedule No. 5 may similarly redeem up to three-quarters of the rent of the plot as shown in the Schedule.

- 4. At no time during the term of the grant shall any plot or any portion thereof or any buildings erected on any plot be used for the purposes of carrying on any trade or business which has been or may be declared to be dangerous or offensive by notice in the Official Gazette.
- 5. Verandahs attached to buildings may be erected within a road reserve with the previous consent of the Municipal Council, and must conform to a building line decided upon by the said Council.
