## A Bill to Amend the Criminal Procedure Code (Amendment) Ordinance, 1939

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Criminal Procedure Code (Amendment) Ordinance, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Criminal Procedure Code (Amendment) Ordinance, 1939, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

No. 35 of 1939.

2. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by substituting the word "three" for the word "two" which appears in the eighth line thereof.

#### **OBJECTS AND REASONS**

This Bill will increase the maximum period of imprisonment which may be awarded by a first class magistrate from two years to three years.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

Under section 19 (3) of the Ordinance, the Board is empowered to charge and collect interest on arrear assessment rates at a rate not exceeding 1 per centum per month. Such interest will be payable from 1st June, 1941. Assessment rates are a debt to the Municipal Board and although every effort will be made to deliver to those liable demand notes stating the amount due, the failure so to deliver will not be held to absolve the debtor from any disability or penalty attaching to non-payment.
