OBITUARY

HIS EXCELLENCY the Governor deeply regrets to announce the death of Mr. Richard Charles Alexander Cavendish, C.B.E., Commissioner of Police, at the European Hospital, Nairobi, on the 28th of April.

Mr. Cavendish began his Colonial career with the British South Africa Police in Southern Rhodesia where he served from 1906 to 1911. Subsequently he was transferred to the Nigerian Police Force with whom he served from 1912 to 1931, when he was appointed Commissioner of Police, Kenya.

In 1939 he was made a Companion of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, and in June, 1940, he was appointed Assistant Commissioner in Charge of the Kenya Division of the St. John Ambulance Brigade, an organization in which he had taken a keen interest for many years.

His sudden and unexpected death is greatly regretted by the Government which has lost the services of a most loyal and able officer, and also by his brother officers in the service and by a large circle of friends throughout the Colony.

His Excellency, on behalf of the Government, extends his sincere sympathy to the relatives.
