His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the following Bill being introduced into the Legislative Council.

A Bill to Amend the Non-European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1932

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Non-European Officers' Pensions (Amendment) (No. 2) Ordinance, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Non-European Officers' Pensions No. 53 of 1932. Ordinance, 1932, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Amendment of section 18 of the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 18 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding thereto, immediately after subsection (3) thereof, the following new subsection:

"(4) If a non-European officer proceeding by a route approved by the Governor to or from the Colony at the 10 commencement or termination of his service therein, or of a period of leave therefrom, dies as the result of damage to the vessel, aircraft or vehicle in which he is travelling, or of any act of violence directed against such vessel, aircraft or vehicle, and the Governor is satisfied that 15 such damage or act is attributable to circumstances arising out of any war in which His Majesty may be engaged, such officer shall be deemed, for the purposes of this section, to have died in the circumstances described in subsection (1) of this section."

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of this Bill is to make it clear that, for the purposes of the Pensions law, a non-European officer who is killed by enemy action when travelling to and from the Colony is to be regarded as killed on duty.

It is not possible to state what expenditure of public moneys would be incurred if the provisions of this Bill were to become law.



CONDITIONS OF SALE AND GRANT

1. Sealed tenders marked "Tender for Kericho Plot" must be deposited with the undersigned before noon on Saturday the 31st May, 1941.

2. No tender of less than the reserve price as shown in the Schedule will be considered.

3. The successful tenderer shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within seven days of the acceptance of his tender, 25 per cent of the purchase money, by way of a deposit, together with the rent due to the 31st December, 1941. In default of such payment the sale may be cancelled.

4. 
