A Bill to Amend the Estate Duty (Consolidation) Ordinance, 1926

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

This Ordinance may be cited as the Estate Duty (Consolidation) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Estate Duty (Consolidation) Ordinance, No. 13 of 1926. 1926, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Amendment of section 12 (4) of

the Principal

Ordinance.

- Sub-section (4) of section 12 of the Principal Ordin- 5 ance is hereby amended by inserting therein, immediately after paragraph (c) thereof, the following new paragraph:—
 - "(d) In respect of any estate of which the principal value does not exceed one hundred pounds."

Repeal and replacement of the Schedule to the Principal Ordinance.

The Schedule to the Principal Ordinance is hereby 10 repealed and the following Schedule is substituted therefor:—

Remission of estate duty in case of persons killed in the war.

4. (1) Where any person has since the 3rd day of September, 1939, died from wounds inflicted, accident occurring, or disease contracted within twelve months before death, while 50 on active service against an enemy, whether on sea, land or air, and was, when the wounds were inflicted, the accident occurred or the disease was contracted, subject to any naval, military or air force law, the Governor may, if he thinks fit, remit, or in the case of estate duty already paid, repay, in any

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one case, the whole or any part of the estate duty leviable under the Principal Ordinance in respect of property passing upon the death of the deceased to his widow or lineal descendants or lineal ancestors, not exceeding the following 5 amounts:—

(a) where the value for the purpose of such estate duty of the property passing to the widow, lineal descendants or lineal ancestors does not exceed seven thousand five hundred pounds, the whole of such estate duty in respect of that property; and

(b) where the said value exceeds seven thousand five hundred pounds—

(i) in respect of the first seven thousand five hundred pounds the whole of estate duty; and

- (ii) in respect of the remainder an amount not exceeding one-half of the estate duty leviable under the Principal Ordinance in respect of such remainder.
- (2) The benefits of the relief given by this section as res-20 pects the first seven thousand five hundred pounds shall be apportioned rateably among the several persons who would otherwise bear such estate duty remitted or repaid according to the amounts which they would so bear and without regard to their respective rights of priority.
- (3) This section shall apply to the naval, military and 25 air forces of the United Kingdom, India, Burma and any of His Majesty's Dominions, Colonies, Protectorates or of any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations is being exercised by His Majesty's Gov-30 ernment.
- 5. (1) Where the Governor is satisfied that estate duty leviable under the Principal Ordinance has become payable on any property passing on the death of any person to which property passing section 4 of this Ordinance applies and that subsequently 35 such estate duty has again become payable on the same pro-caused by the perty or any part thereof passing on the death of some other person to which section 4 of this Ordinance applies, the whole of such estate duty payable on such subsequent death in respect of the property so passing shall be remitted, or in case 40 such estate duty has been paid, repaid, and the property shall not be aggregated with any other property passing on such subsequent death for the purpose of determining the rate of such estate duty.

(2) This section shall apply whether or not on any such 45 death any property passes to the widow, lineal descendants or lineal ancestors of the deceased.

6. The provisions of section 3 of this Ordinance shall Duration. continue in force until the 31st day of December next following such date as the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare 50 to be the date on which the war that was the occasion of the enactment of this Ordinance comes to an end and shall then expire; and upon such expiry the provisions of the schedule to the Principal Ordinance repealed by the said section shall be revived and be of full force and effect.

Remission of estate duty in more than once owing to deaths

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to bring the Kenya rates of estate duty into line with those in force in Tanganyika for the duration of the war; and
- (b) to exempt from the payment of estate duty the estates of members of the armed forces who die while on active service.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.
