A Bill to Amend the Patents, Designs, Copyright and Trade Marks (Emergency) Ordinance, 1940

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Patents, Designs, Copyright and Trade Marks (Emergency) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Patents, Designs, Copyright and Trade Marks (Emergency) Ordinance, 1940, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance. 5

Amendment of Section 4(1) of the Principal Ordinance.

2. Sub-section (1) of section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting therein between the word "Act" and the word "shall" which appear in the second line thereof the words following:—

"with respect to a registered design or a copyright, 10 or a patent registered under the Registration of Patents Ordinance, 1933".

No. 58 of 1933.

OBJECTS AND REASONS

Patents granted in the United Kingdom do not extend to the Colony unless they are registered under the Registration of Patents Ordinance, 1933.

Consequently the extension to the Colony of an order made under section 2 of the United Kingdom Patents, Designs, Copyright and Trade Marks (Emergency) Act, 1939, in respect of a United Kingdom patent not registered in the Colony would be of no effect. The object of this Bill is to restrict the application of section 4 of the Principal Ordinance, so far as it relates to patents, to patents granted in the United Kingdom which are in force in Kenya.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A Bill to Amend the Widows and Orphans Pension **Ordinance**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

This Ordinance may be cited as the Widows and Short title. Orphans Pension (Amendment) Ordinance, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Widows and Orphans Pension Ordinance (Chapter 34 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred Cap. 34. 5 to as the Principal Ordinance.

Section 16 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended—

section 16 of the Principal

(a) by deleting therefrom sub-section (1) thereof and sub- Ordinance. stituting therefor the following sub-section:—

"(1) No widow of a contributor whose marriage with him is contracted after he has left the public service (not having elected under section 8 of the Widows and Orphans Pension (Amendment) Ordinance, 1932, to continue to rank for benefit) or has No. 28 of 1932. ceased to contribute to the Scheme, whichever of those events shall first happen, and no issue of such marriage shall be capable of constituting a beneficiary or become entitled to any pension under this Ordinance";

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(b) by adding thereto, immediately after sub-section (2) thereof, the following new sub-section:—

"(3) For the purposes of this section the expression 'public service' means service in a civil capacity under this Government or under the Government of any part of His Majesty's Dominions, or of any British Protected State or Protectorate, or of any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty, or of the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan, or any other service which the Secretary of State may determine to be public service for the purposes of this Ordinance."

OBJECTS AND REASONS

Section 16 of the Principal Ordinance provides, inter alia, that no widow of a contributor whose marriage with him is contracted after he has left the East African Service or has attained the age of 55, and no issue of such marriage shall be capable of constituting a beneficiary or become entitled to any pension under the Ordinance. The object of this Bill is to amend the section so as to make it applicable only to a marriage after the officer has ceased to contribute to the Scheme or has left the public service, whichever shall first happen, as there seems no reason for excluding the wife and issue of the marriage contracted by an officer, who is still a contributor, after he has been transferred from the East African service to, and is still in, other public service.

It is not possible to state what expenditure of public moneys would be incurred if the provisions of this Bill were to become law.

A Bill to Amend the Local Government (Municipalities) Ordinance, 1928

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

This Ordinance may be cited as the Local Government (Municipalities) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Local Government (Municipalities) Ordinance, 1928, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Amendment of section 10(2) of the Principal Ordinance.

2. Sub-section (2) of section 10 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the word "annually" which appears in the third line thereof and substituting therefor the words "for a period of three years".

Amendment of section 13(1) of the Principal Ordinance.

3. Sub-section (1) of section 13 of the Principal Ordin- 10 ance is hereby amended by inserting therein between the word "Governor" and the full stop which appear in the eighth line thereof the words "for a period not exceeding three years".

Repeal and replacement of section 41 of

4. Section 41 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby 15 repealed and the following sections are substituted therefor:—

the Principal Ordinance. Disability of councillors for voting on account of interest in contracts, etc.

"41. (1) If a member of a Council has any pecuniary interest, direct or indirect, in any contract or proposed contract or other matter, and is present at a meeting of the Council or of any committee thereof at 20 which the contract or other matter is the subject of consideration, he shall at the meeting, as soon as possible after the commencement thereof, disclose the fact, and shall not take part in the consideration or discussion of, or vote on any question with respect to, the contract or 25 other matter:

Provided that this section shall not apply to an interest in a contract or other matter which a member may have as a ratepayer or inhabitant of the area under the jurisdiction of the Council, or as an ordinary con- 30 sumer of water, or to an interest in any matter relating to the terms on which the right to participate in any service, including the supply of goods, is offered to the public.

- (2) For the purposes of this section a person shall 35 (subject as hereafter in this sub-section provided) be treated as having indirectly a pecuniary interest in a contract or other matter, if—
 - (a) he or any nominee of his is a member of a company or other body with which the contract is 40 made or is proposed to be made or which has a direct pecuniary interest in the other matter under consideration; or
 - (b) he is a partner, or is in the employment, of a person with whom the contract is made or is

proposed to be made or who has a direct pecuniary interest in the other matter under consideration:

Provided that—

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(i) this sub-section shall not apply to membership of, or employment under, any public body;

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(ii) a member of a company or other body shall not, by reason only of his membership, be treated as being so interested if he has no beneficial interest in any shares or stock of that company or other body.

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(3) In the case of married persons living together the interest of one spouse shall, if known to the other, be deemed for the purposes of this section to be also an interest of that other spouse.

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(4) A general notice given in writing to the Town Clerk by a member of the Council to the effect that he or his spouse is a member or in the employment of a specified company or other body, or that he or his spouse is a partner or in the employment of a specified person, shall, unless and until the notice is withdrawn, be deemed to be a sufficient disclosure of his interest in any contract, proposed contract, or other matter relating to that company or other body or to that person which may be the subject of consideration after the date of the notice.

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(5) The Town Clerk shall record in a book to be kept for the purpose particulars of any disclosure made under sub-section (1) of this section, and of any notice given under sub-section (4) thereof, and the book shall be open at all reasonable hours to the inspection of any member of the Council.

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(6) If any person fails to comply with the provisions of sub-section (1) of this section, he shall for each offence be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds, unless he proves that he did not know that a contract, proposed contract, or other matter in which he had a pecuniary interest was the subject of consideration at the meeting.

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(7) Any person convicted of an offence against this section shall *ipso facto* become disqualified from continuing to be a councillor and shall account to the Council for any profit which may accrue to him of such contract or matter.

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(8) Any councillor disqualified under the provisions of sub-section (7) of this section shall not be capable, for a period of three years, of being elected or nominated a councillor for any municipality.

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(9) A prosecution for an offence under this section shall not be instituted except by or on behalf of the Attorney General.

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(10) The Governor may, subject to such conditions as he may think fit to impose, remove any disability imposed by this section in any case in which the number of members of the Council so disabled at any one time would be so great a proportion of the whole as to impede the transaction of business, or in any other case in which it appears to the Governor that it is in the interests of the inhabitants of the area under the jurisdiction of the Council that the disability should be removed.

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- (11) A Council may by standing orders provide for the exclusion of a member of the Council from a meeting of the Council or of any committee thereof whilst any contract, proposed contract or other matter in which he has such an interest as aforesaid is under consideration.
- 41A. No councillor shall by himself or his partner or agent act as an advocate against the Council.
- 41B. No councillor shall by himself or his partner or agent act as an advocate or representative of any other person—
 - (a) before any Valuation Court appointed by the Council under the Local Government (Rating) Ordinance, 1928, or
 - (b) before any committee of the Council appointed to consider or deal with applications for any 15 licence or certificate which the Council has power to grant or issue.
- 41c. No councillor or his partner or his employer or employee, or any company of which a councillor is a director shall act for the Council for reward as an 20 auditor."

5. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting therein, immediately after section 74 thereof, the following new section:—

"74A. (1) Where the Council is empowered to make 25 by-laws prohibiting, restricting or regulating the doing of any act and such by-laws require any person to obtain a permit from a specified authority before the doing of such act, such by-laws may provide for a deposit of such sum, or the execution of a bond with or without sureties in 30 such sum, as may be prescribed in such by-laws, such sum to be refunded or such bond to be void, as the case may be, if the person to whom such permit is granted complies with all the conditions of such permit.

(2) The provisions of the preceding sub-section shall 35 not apply where the Council may, under section 77 of this Ordinance, impose duties or fees."

6. Sub-section (5) of section 94 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting therein between the word "Gazette" and the full stop which appear in the seventh 40 line thereof the words "if in the opinion of the Standing Committee such publication is necessary".

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The principal object of this Bill is to introduce in the Colony the English Local Government law relating to contracts and other dealings between councillors and the Council.

Opportunity has been taken to amend the Principal Ordinance in certain other respects:—

Clause 2 will allow the Arab member of the Mombasa Municipal Board to be nominated for a period of three years instead of for one year as hitherto.

Clause 3.—When a municipality is constituted, and until the members of the Council or Board of such municipality are elected or nominated, the Governor has power to appoint a Council or Board consisting of such elected and nominated members as he may decide; but,

as the law stands at present, the period of appointment of such members is not prescribed. This clause limits the maximum period to three years.

Clause 5 will authorize the Municipal Council or Board if it so desires to demand a monetary deposit or bond from an applicant for a permit from a Council or Board, such as for example, a quarrying permit.

Clause 6.—Under section 94 Councils are required to publish a summary of their annual estimates in the Gazette. When these estimates have been approved by the Standing Committee it is provided by section 92(5) that an abstract of the estimates shall be published in the Gazette. It is considered that the second publication should be at the discretion of the Standing Committee and this clause makes the necessary amendment.


