THE SHOP HOURS (WEEKLY HALF-HOLIDAY) (INQUIRY) RULES, 1935

Kericho Township

WHEREAS I propose to make an Order under the provisions of section 7 of the Shop Hours Ordinance, 1925, fixing Thursday as the day for the weekly half-holiday for all shops in the Class B Business Area and Sunday as the day for the weekly half-holiday for all businesses in the factory area, notice is hereby given in pursuance of the requirements of Rule 3 of the Shop Hours (Weekly Half-Holiday) (Inquiry) Rules, 1935, that an inquiry will be held by me in the Kipsigis Local Native Council Hall, Kericho, on Wednesday the 30th day of July, 1941, at 4 p.m. for the purpose of ascertaining whether or not the occupiers of a majority of the shops which will be affected by the proposed Order are in favour of and approve the Order.

The occupiers of all shops affected by the proposed Order are hereby called upon to attend the said inquiry to express their opinion as to the proposed Order.

The occupier of any such shop who for any reason is unable to attend the said inquiry may record his approval or otherwise of the proposed Order by sending to me by registered post not later than the 29th July, 1941, an expression in writing signed by him recording his approval or otherwise of the proposed Order.

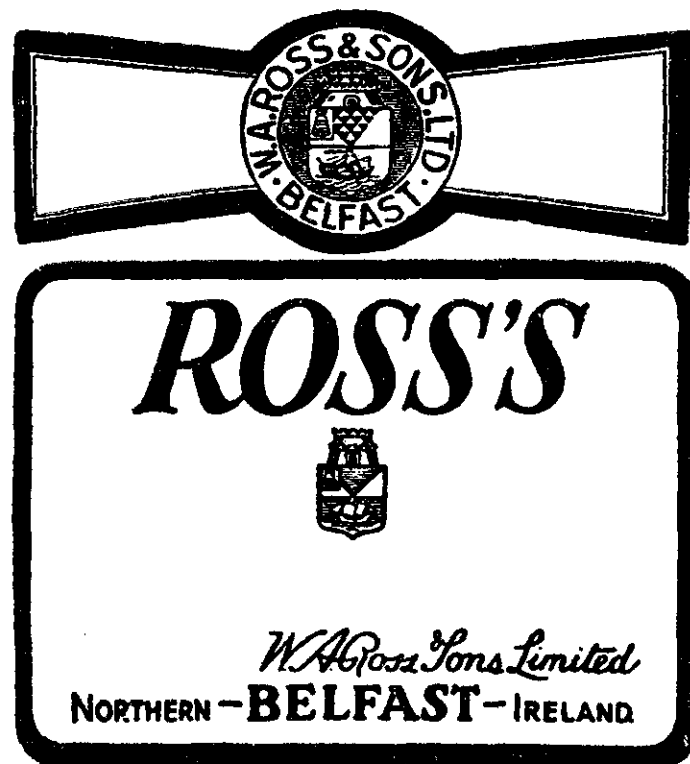
