A Bill to Amend the Credit Trade with Natives Ordinance

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Credit Trade with Natives (Amendment) Ordinance, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Credit Trade with Natives Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby 5 amended by substituting a colon for the full stop which appears at the end thereof and by adding thereto, immediately after such colon, the following proviso:—

"Provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time by order to vary the value or price 10 specified in this section in respect of any province or district."

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Principal Ordinance covers the sale of goods on credit to natives to the value of more than ten pounds in every province or district to which the Ordinance applies. While conditions may vary in different parts of the country, this amount of ten pounds is fixed by law and no power is given to vary it. The object of this Bill is to provide a means by which this amount may be reduced or increased in any province or district where such reduction or increase is considered desirable.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

APPLICATIONS—THE Licensing Authority is not responsible for the contents of applications; its responsibility is confined to seeing that the notices in this publication agree with the applications received.
