His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the following Bill being introduced into the Legislative Council.

A Bill to Amend the Arms and Ammunition Ordinance, 1925

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

No. 8 of 1925.

Power to inspect premises.

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Arms and Ammunition (Amendment) Ordinance, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Arms and Ammunition Ordinance, 1925, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- 2. (1) Any police officer of or above rank of assistant 5 inspector may at all reasonable times enter upon any premises with a view to ascertaining whether or not the provisions of the Principal Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder are being complied with, and may demand for inspection the production of any arms, and the production of any licence, 10 permit, document or record of any description whatsoever which may, under the provisions of the Principal Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder, be required to be taken out, or kept, as the case may be, and may require any person appearing to be in control of such premises or employed 15 therein to give such information as such police officer may require in order to ascertain whether or not the provisions of the Principal Ordinance or any Rules made thereunder are being complied with.
- (2) Any person who obstructs any police officer in the 20 exercise of the powers conferred on such police officer by this section, or who fails to comply with any lawful order given by such police officer or who refuses to give any information when requested so to do by such police officer shall be guilty of an offence.
- (3) Any such police officer having reasonable grounds for believing that any person has committed an offence against the Principal Ordinance or any Rules made thereunder and that such person will not attend the court in answer to any process which may be issued against him, may arrest such 30 person without a warrant.

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of this Bill is to confer powers on police officers of or above the rank of assistant inspector to enter premises and inspect arms, and licences or other documents, and in certain circumstances to arrest without warrant persons who, there are reasonable grounds for believing, have committed an offence against the Principal Ordinance.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A Bill to Provide for the Payment of Pensions, Gratuities and Other Allowances in Respect of the Death, Disablement or Sickness of Members of His Majesty's Forces Serving in any Unit Raised in the Colony.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as His Majesty's Forces Short title and Pensions Ordinance, 1941, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the third day of September, 1939.

2. (1) The Governor in Council may make Regulations Power to make 5 prescribing the conditions under which and the manner in for grant of which pensions, gratuities or other allowances may be granted pensions, etc. in respect of the death, disablement or sickness of any member of His Majesty's Forces serving in any of such forces raised under the authority of any law for the time being in 10 force in the Colony.

- (2) All regulations made under this Ordinance shall have the same force and effect as if they had been enacted in this Ordinance and shall be laid as soon as conveniently may be before the Legislative Council; and if a resolution is passed 15 within forty days of their being so laid before the Legislative Council praying that any such regulation shall be revoked or amended, such regulation shall thenceforth be deemed to be revoked or amended, but without prejudice to anything done thereunder.
- 3. No pension, gratuity or other allowance granted Pensions, etc., 20 under this Ordinance shall be assignable or transferable, or assignable. liable to be attached, sequestered or levied upon for or in respect of any debt or claim whatsoever, other than a debt due to the Government of the Colony.

4. If any person to whom a pension or other allowance Pensions, etc., has been granted under this Ordinance is sentenced to a term to cease on conviction. of imprisonment by any competent court whether within or without the Colony for any crime or offence then, in every such case, it shall be lawful for the Governor to direct that 30 such pension or allowance shall forthwith cease:

Provided that the pension or allowance shall be restored with retrospective effect in the case of a person who after conviction at any time received a free pardon:

And provided further that where a pension or allowance 35 ceases for the reason aforesaid it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause all or any part of the moneys to which the pensioner would have been entitled by way of pension or allowance to be paid to or applied for the benefit of any wife, child or children of the pensioner, or, after the expiration of 40 his sentence, also for the benefit of the pensioner himself, in such proportions and manner as the Governor may think proper, and such moneys shall be paid or applied accordingly.

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of this Bill is to confer power upon the Governor in Council to make Regulations providing for the payment of pensions and other allowances in respect of the death, disablement or sickness of members of His Majesty's Forces serving in any unit raised in the Colony.

It is not possible to estimate what expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

TARIFF OF HARBOUR DUES AND CHARGES No. 4—DATED 1ST JULY, 1938

Clause 14—Mooring and Unmooring—

"Goods detained by H.M. Customs for verification purposes shall not be liable for storage charges during the period so detained, i.e. from the date documents are presented to the Shed Supervisor until the date of completion of examination.

Insert in paragraph 3 the word "Entered" before "Goods" in the first line.


