A Bill to Amend the Increased Production of Crops Ordinance, 1942

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Increased Production of Crops (Amendment) Ordinance, 1945, and shall be read as one with the Consolidated Edition of the Increased Production of Crops Ordinance, 1942, prepared under the provisions of section 23 of the

- Increased Production of Crops (Amendment) Ordinance, 1943, 5 hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance. 2. Section 2 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by
- deleting therefrom the definition of "crops" and substituting therefor the following:-
 - "'crops' means such produce of the soil as the Governor 10 may, with the advice of the Agricultural Production and Settlement Board, by Order published in the Gazette, declare to be a crop for the purposes of this Ordinance;'
 - 3. Section 11 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended— (a) by deleting sub-section (1) thereof and substituting therefor 15

the following sub-sections:

- "(1) The Board may by order in writing addressed to any farmer, whether or not such farmer has submitted a programme of production, order such farmer to carry out such farming operations in connexion with the production of crops as the 20 Board may, in its absolute discretion, determine.
- (2) In any order given by the Board under sub-section (1) of this section the Board may specify the period within which it shall be carried out.
- (3) When an order of the Board, given under sub-section 25 (1) of this section, does not specify the period within which it shall be carried out, such order shall be carried out within such period as may be specified by the sub-committee appointed under the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 6 of this Ordinance for the area in which the land, to which the 30 order relates, is situate, or in the absence of the appointment of any such sub-committee, within such period as may be specified by the District Production and Man Power Committee for the district in which the land, to which the order relates, is situate.
- (4) When an order of the Board, given under sub-section (1) of this section, does not specify the period within which it shall be carried out, it shall be the duty of the farmer who receives such order to ascertain from the sub-committee or District Production and Man Power Committee, as the 40 case may be, the period within which the order is to be carried out."
- (b) by re-numbering sub-sections (2), (3) and (4) thereof as subsections (5), (6) and (7) respectively.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Ordinance (the Consolidated Edition of the Increased Production of Crops Ordinance, 1942) in the following respects:—

- (a) by deleting the definition of "crops" and substituting therefor the new definition contained in clause 2. The object of the amendment is to introduce a degree of flexibility which does
- (b) by deleting sub-section (1) of section 11 of the principal Ordinance and substituting therefor four new sub-sections. Under the existing sub-section the Agricultural Production and Settlement Board is empowered, whether or not a farmer has submitted a programme of production, to order a farmer to carry out, within such time as may be specified in the order, such farming operations in connexion with the production of crops as the Board may, in its absolute dis-

cretion, determine. Planting dates differ widely in different parts of Kenya and depend on a number of factors, including climatic conditions prevailing at the time. In the light of experience it has been found, in the majority of cases, impracticable for the Board, in issuing a planting order, to specify a definite time by which the order is to be carried out. This being so it is sought, by the amendment, to make it permissive for the Board to specify the period in which the planting order is to be carried out, and in cases where it is impracticable for it to do so to empower the subcommittee appointed under the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 6 of the principal Ordinance or, in the absence of such committee, the District Production and Man Power Committee, to specify the period within which the order is to be carried out. The new sub-clause (4) also seeks to throw the onus on the farmer who receives an order, in which the period in which it is to be carried out is not specified by the Board, to ascertain from the sub-committee or District Production and Man Power Committee, as the case may be, the period within which the order is to be carried out.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A Bill to Amend the Penal Code

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Penal Code (Amendment) Short title. Ordinance, 1945, and shall be read as one with the Consolidated Edition of the Penal Code prepared under the provisions of section 25 of the Penal Code (Amendment) Ordinance, 1939, hereinafter referred No. 34 of 1939. 5 to as the principal Ordinance.

2. Section 298 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by Amendment of substituting a comma for the full stop after the words "imprisonment the principal for ten years" at the end thereof and adding thereto the words "with Ordinance. or without corporal punishment.".

3. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting Insertion of new immediately after section 317 thereof the following section:

the principal

service stores

"317A. (1) Any person conveying or having in his possession, Unlawful or keeping in any building or place, whether open or enclosed, possession of any stores being the property of His Majesty's Army, Navy or Air Force, which may reasonably be suspected of having been stolen or unlawfully obtained, and who shall not give an account to the satisfaction of the court of how he came by the same, shall be guilty of a misdemeanour.

(2) For the purposes of this section the term "stores" includes all goods and chattels and any single article or part thereof.".

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of clause 2 of this Bill is to give the court power to impose a sentence of corporal punishment for burglary.

- 2. Clause 3 seeks to make similar provision regarding the unlawful possession of Service stores as that in force regarding the unlawful possession of Government and Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours stores.
- 3. No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.
