IMPORTS CONTROL

CAPITAL EQUIPMENT FROM THE UNITED KINGDOM

SO long as the war, particularly in Europe, continues, there remains the severe necessity on man power, supply and shipping grounds for keeping import demands to the minimum essential figure. At the same time it is now possible, without detracting from the full war effort, to consider post-war plans.

Such preparations are particularly necessary with projects which for one reason or another will take some time to implement once the war is over, and advice has been received from the Secretary of State that contact should now be established between purchasers in East Africa and suppliers in the United Kingdom of capital equipment required for post-war works.

The purpose of this advice is to enable contacts to be established in cases where firm orders can or may be placed within about the next 18 months, particularly for equipment of a heavy or specialized nature which will take some length of time to manufacture. It does not refer to subsidiary or consumer goods, and any orders placed will not require to be essential by wartime standards. All orders possible should be finalized, and in any case suppliers should be provided with the maximum of detail available as to likely orders. It is not possible to say when delivery may be effected.

Persons desirous of importing in accordance with the foregoing advice should make application accordingly to the Import Control authority of their territory for the issue of an import licence. In submitting this application, which should be made on the usual form, it will not be necessary to provide information of past importations, but the application should be supported by a brief explanatory memorandum in duplicate setting out the purpose for which the material in question is required. On receipt of this application a special "T" series import licence will be issued without further inquiry, it being clearly understood that these "T" licences will not be regarded as certificates of essentiality, as is the case with the normal series of import licences issued for current requirements. The application should contain ample particulars of the equipment required together with an estimate of its value, and in the case of any single order amounting to £10,000 or over, details will be passed through the Colonial Office to the Board of Trade so that when in due course any assistance in delivery becomes possible this may be undertaken.
