SIR MILSOM REES SCHOLARSHIPS

THE scholarships will be tenable at Port Regis Preparatory School, Blandford, Dorset.

Two scholarships will be awarded in 1945, each of the value of £50, which will be deducted from the school fees. One of these scholarships will be open to boys whose fathers are British medical practitioners in East Africa, in private or in Government service. The other will be open to boys whose fathers are British Government Officials in East Africa, or who are British residents in East Africa. There is no minimum residential period for British practitioners in Government service, or for British Government officials; but British medical practitioners in private service or British residents, must have been resident for not less than one year in East Africa, in order that their sons may be eligible to compete for the scholarships.

British residents must be bona fide residents as long as their sons are at Port Regis School.

Candidates for the scholarships must be resident in East Africa, but temporary absence from East Africa will not debar any candidate from making an application.

East Africa shall be defined as embracing Kenya, Uganda, Tanganyika, Northern Rhodesia, Nyasaland and Zanzibar.

Scholars must be under nine years of age at the time of competing for the scholarship. A scholarship will normally be tenable until the boy leaves Port Regis School, but in no case beyond the end of the last term before the scholar becomes 14 years of age.

A scholarship may be terminated at the end of any term if the Headmaster reports unfavourably of the scholar's progress or character.

The subjects of examination will not be specified in advance and may be varied from year to year, so that the candidates may not be specially prepared for the scholarships.

The examination, which on former occasions was held in East Africa, will this year be held at Port Regis School about the 5th and 6th of June, and will include a personal interview.

Applications for the scholarships should be addressed to the Directors of Education in the various territories and should only be made on behalf of candidates at present in the United Kingdom, or likely to be there at the time of the examination.

(14) The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantees shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.
