CONDITIONING PLANT, KILINDINI

PRODUCE is received at the Conditioning Plant, Kilindini, under the following conditions:

- 1. Owners of produce to be conditioned should notify the Chief Grader and Inspector, Agricultural Department, Kilindini, giving full particulars as to the number of bags to be conditioned, kind of conditioning required, and date of shipment, prior to lelivery at the Conditioning Plant.
- 2. The above produce will be delivered to the Conditioning Plant through the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours only. Owners must supply any bags found necessary on rebagging. When the produce is intended for export, such bags must be of the kind prescribed by Rules made under the Agricultural Produce Export Ordinance, 1921.
- 3. The determination of the priority of acceptance of produce for treatment at the Conditioning Plant shall be in the sole discretion of the Chief Grader and Inspector.

4. CHARGES.

(a) Maize and Wheat,-

- (i) For maize and/or wheat which has been rejected in the process of grading under Rules made under the Agricultural Produce Export Ordinance, 1921, and is received for treatment at the plant, a charge of 60 cents per bag will be made.
- (ii) A charge of 50 cents per bag will be made on all maize and/or wheat consigned direct from railway stations to the Conditioning Plant provided, however, that the Chief Grader and Inspector shall give preference to maize and/or wheat rejected in the process of grading and sent to the plant for conditioning.

(b) Beans.

- (i) Wet Beans—Extraction of Moisture.—A charge of 70 cents per bag will be made for beans conditioned in one operation at the Conditioning Plant, and for each subsequent treatment a charge of 60 cents per bag. The minimum charge shall be Sh. 140.
- (ii) Destruction of Bean Beetle.—A charge of 70 cents per bag will be made for beans treated for the destruction of bean beetle with a minimum charge of Sh. 140.
- (c) Other Produce.—For produce other than maize, wheat and beans a charge of 60 cents per bag will be made for treatment at the plant.
- (d) The above charges include handling into and out of the Conditioning Plant.
- 5 In addition to the above charges, charges for haulage and 5. In addition to the above charges, charges for hadiage and handling when incurred will be collected by the Chief Grader Inspector on behalf of the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours in accordance with the current tariff.
- 6. All charges both for conditioning and for haulage and handling shall be payable to the Chief Grader and Inspector before delivery of the produce from the Conditioning Plant. The Agricultural Department may sell such quantity of the produce by auction as is calculated to be sufficient to meet all charges due to it and to the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours, for conditioning services.
- 7. After conditioning of the produce, the Agricultural Department may deliver the produce, so conditioned, to the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours, for storage pending export.
- 8. The Government will not accept responsibility for any loss or damage that may be suffered on produce treated at the Conditioning Plant.


