SALE OF MEPACRINE TABLETS TO THE PUBLIC AT POST OFFICES

GENERAL Notice No. 464, Official Gazette, Vol XLIV, No. 15, dated 14th April, 1942, and General Notice No. 800, Official Gazette, Vol. XLVI dated 30th May, 1944, are hereby cancelled and the following notice is substituted with effect from 1st May, 1945:-

Owing to the low stocks of quinine held in the Colony and the present absence of totaquina tablets, it has been found necessary to substitute another anti-malarial drug, mepacrine hydrochloride (or quinacrine), for sale to the public at Post Offices.

The sale of mepacrine at Post Offices will be governed by the following rules:-

- 1. The charges for mepacrine will be as follows:-
- (a) Bottles of 500 tablets, with directions for use, Sh. 35 per bottle.
- (b) Tablets of mepacrine, 1½ grs. each, seven cents per tablet.
- 2. Mepacrine will only be sold for cash at the time of purchase. 3. No larger quantity than 15 tablets of mepacrine will be sold
- to any person at any time except on presentation of a "Permit to Purchase Mepacrine", signed by a Government Medical Officer of Health or by the Medical Officer in Charge, General Dispensary, Nairobi.
- 4. A permit to purchase mepacrine will not be valid for the purchase of mepacrine at any Post Office other than that mentioned on the permit.
- 5. Applications for permits to purchase mepacrine must be made, with the exceptions mentioned below, to the Medical Officer of Health of the district in which the applicant resides.
- (1) Applications for permits from persons resident within the Municipality of Nairobi should be sent to the Medical Officer in Charge, General Dispensary, Nairobi, and not the Medical Officer of Health, Nairobi, Residents in Nairobi District may obtain their permits from the Medical Officer in Charge, General Dispensary, Nairobi, or from the Medical Officer of Health, Kiambu.
- (2) Applications from persons resident in the districts listed below should be made to the officer indicated in the list:—

Lamu District, Tana River District, Malindi District, Kilifi District: The Senior Medical Officer, Mombasa.

Kitui District: The Medical Officer of Health, Machakos.

Laikipia-Samburu District, Baringo District: The Medical Officer of Health, Nakuru.

Nandi District, Elgeyo District: The Medical Officer of Health, Eldoret.

- 6. The application form for a permit to purchase mepacrine will have the same form as that previously used for quinine.
- 7. Permits to purchase mepacrine at Post Offices will not ordinarily be issued to persons resident within the area of any municipality, township or trading centre in which there is a Post Office at which mepacrine is sold, or to any person resident within two miles of such a Post Office.
- 8. Mepacrine purchased at a Government Post Office in Kenya may not be resold.
