THE CINEMATOGRAPH FILMS CENSORSHIP (AMENDMENT) RULES, 1945

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 15 of the Stage Plays and Cinematograph Exhibitions Ordinance (Chapter 73 of the Revised Edition), and all other powers thereunto enabling him, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Cinematograph Films Censorship (Amendment) Rules, 1945, and shall be read as one with the Cinematograph Films Censorship Rules, 1930 (Government Notice No. 500 of 1930), hereinafter referred to as the principal Rules.

2. Rule 2 of the principal Rules is hereby amended—

(1) by the deletion of paragraph (d) of sub-rule (1) thereof and the substitution thereof of the following paragraph:—

“(d) Two of a panel of ten European women, six Indian women and two Africans, to be appointed by the Governor.”;

(2) by the deletion of sub-rule (2) thereof and the substitution thereof of the following sub-rule:—

“(2) Two members of the Board, of whom one shall not be a panel member, shall form a quorum.”;

(3) by the deletion of sub-rule (4) thereof and the substitution thereof of the following sub-rule:—

“(4) Before any question before the Board is discussed at any meeting the Chairman shall nominate the two panel members who shall be entitled to vote at the meeting.”.

VACANCIES IN THE LAND DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LANDS AND MINES, TANGANYIKA

TWO vacancies exist for Land Rangers in the Land Division of the Department of Lands and Mines, Tanganyika. These posts which are non-pensionable, carry a salary scale of £372 by £18 to £480 by £20 to £600 with an efficiency bar at £480, and the holders will be required to enter into normal overseas agreements and to contribute to the Government Employees' Provident Fund.

THE following vacancies exist in the Survey Division of the Department of Lands and Mines, Tanganyika Territory:—

Two Junior Surveyors, one Junior Draughtsman, one Junior Computer, one Junior Lithographer, one Junior Photographer: Salary, £180 per annum for two years, then £240 by £15 to £300 by £15 to £360, with an efficiency bar at £300.

2. These vacancies are intended for young men of European parentage straight from school (aged approximately 17 years) but are also open to men who went straight from school into the Forces.
