A Bill to Make Provision for Raising a Loan in the Colony not Exceeding the Sum of Two Million Pounds

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

| Short title. | 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Local Loan Ordinance, 1945. | |
| Interpretation. | 2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires—
"Accountant General" means the Accountant General of the Colony;
"Crown Agents" means the person or persons acting for the time being as Crown Agents for the Colonies in England;
"the Loan" means the loan authorized by this Ordinance;
"stock" means Kenya Stock issued under the provisions of this Ordinance, and includes any share or interest in such stock;
"prescribed" means prescribed by regulations made under this Ordinance;
"the register" includes any book kept by the Accountant General under the provisions of this Ordinance;

9. Stock shall be transferable by an instrument of transfer to be approved by the Accountant General, and a certificate issued by the Accountant General in pursuance of such transfer and in respect of the stock so transferred shall be prima facie evidence of the title of the holder of the certificate to the stock specified therein.

Transfer of stock.

10. (1) The Accountant General may, for a period not exceeding fourteen days previous to each payment of interest on any stock registered under the provisions of this Ordinance, close the register of that stock as regards transfers upon giving not less than seven days notice of such closing. Such notice shall be published in the Gazette and in one newspaper published in the Colony.

Closing of register.

(2) The persons who on the day of such closing are registered as stockholders shall, as between them and their transferees, be entitled to the interest then next payable on the stock.

11. The principal moneys and interest represented by the Loan are hereby charged upon and shall be payable out of the general revenues and assets of the Colony.

Loan to be a charge upon general revenues.

12. Interest shall be payable on stock half yearly by the Accountant General on behalf of the Colony at the rate fixed by the Governor at the time of the issue of such stock.

Interest and payment thereof.

13. Stock shall be redeemable at par on a date to be named by the Accountant General in that behalf when issuing the stock, and from and after that date all interest on the principal moneys secured thereby shall cease and determine whether payment of the principal shall have been demanded or not.

When stock redeemable.

14. So long as any portion of the Loan remains outstanding the Governor shall in each half-year ending with the day on which the interest on the Loan falls due appropriate out of the general revenues and assets of the Colony a sum equal to one half-year's interest on the whole of the Loan outstanding, and shall authorize the Accountant General to pay out of such sum the then current half-year's interest on the day on which it falls due.

Appropriation out of general revenue of sums to meet interest when due.

15. (1) The Governor shall also in each half-year ending with the day on which the interest on the Loan falls due appropriate out of the general revenues and assets of the Colony for the formation of a sinking fund for the repayment of the Loan at par an additional sum in respect of the total nominal amount of the Loan outstanding equal to one per centum of such nominal amount, and shall remit that sum to the Crown Agents.

Sinking fund for redemption of stock

(2) The Crown Agents shall invest the money remitted to them under the provisions of subsection (1) of this section in the purchase of such securities as may be approved by the Secretary of State as a sinking fund for the final extinction of the debt, and the Crown Agents shall also invest the dividends, interest or produce of such investment in the purchase of like securities and may from time to time with the approval of the Secretary of State change any such investments and shall hold such funds in trust for the payment of the principal moneys for the time being represented by the Loan.

(3) In case the sinking fund provided for by this section shall be insufficient for the payment of all the principal moneys borrowed under the authority of this Ordinance at the time the same shall have become due the Governor shall make good the deficiency out of the general revenues and assets of the Colony.

16. No notice of any trust in respect of any stock shall be entered in the register or be receivable by the Accountant General.

No notice of trust to be received or registered.

17. No stamp duty shall be payable in respect of any interest, warrant or transfer of stock.

Exemption from stamp duty.

18. All interest on stock shall be deemed to be debenture interest within the meaning of section 2 of the Income Tax Ordinance, 1940, and sub-sections (3) and (4) of section 28 of the said Ordinance shall apply upon payment of such interest as if the references therein to a company which is resident in the Colony were read as references to the Accountant General.

Interest to be deemed debenture interest for the purposes of income tax. No. 11 of 1940.

19. The Governor in Council may make regulations for all or any of the following purposes:—

Power to make regulations.

(a) Registering stock in the register;

(b) prescribing the persons who may be registered as stockholders;

(c) prescribing the method by which any payment in respect of stock shall be made;

(d) prescribing the method by which stock may be transferred;

- (e) providing for the registration, payment of interest, repayment of principal, and transfer of stock in the case of persons who are under legal disability;
- (f) providing for the replacement of lost certificates;
- (g) generally for the better carrying out of the provisions of this Ordinance. 5

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of this Bill is to empower the Governor to raise a loan not exceeding the sum of two million pounds by the issue in the Colony of registered stock, known as Kenya Stock. Such loan may be raised either at one time or by successive issues. The purposes of the loan are to supplement the sinking funds of any existing specific loans and such other purposes as the Governor, with the sanction of the Secretary of State, may determine.

By Clause 11 the principal moneys and interest represented by the loan are guaranteed by the Government. Kenya Stock will therefore be trustee stock by virtue of the provisions of the Trustee Ordinance, 1929.

It is estimated that the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £2,500 will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A Bill to Amend the Resident Labourers Ordinance, 1937

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title
and commence-
ment.
No. 30 of 1937.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Resident Labourers (Amendment) Ordinance, 1945, and shall be read as one with the Resident Labourers Ordinance, 1937, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance, and shall come into operation on such date as the Governor may by notice in the Gazette appoint. 5

Amendment of
section 3 of
the principal
Ordinance.

2. Section 3 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the definition of "farm" and by substituting therefor the following definition:—

"'farm' means any area of land held under a grant, lease or licence from the Crown (other than an area of land situated 10 in a municipality, township or trading centre which is held under a title, or a licence, the terms of which preclude either expressly or impliedly such area of land from being used for agricultural purposes) and shall include any area of Crown land within the jurisdiction of a district council (other than a road, or an area 15 of land situated in a township or trading centre, or any land which is specifically excluded from the operation of this Ordinance by the Commissioner of Lands by notice in the Gazette) and shall, except for the purposes of sub-section (10) of section 5, sections 18 and 19 of this Ordinance, include any forest area: 20

Cap. 143.

Provided that if, under section 2 of this Ordinance, the Governor in Council by proclamation applies the provisions of this Ordinance to the Protectorate of Kenya or to any district thereof, or to any area therein, this definition shall, so far as such Protectorate, district or area, as the case may be, is concerned, be 25 deemed to include such land as may be held under a Certificate of Title granted under the Land Titles Ordinance and is specified in such proclamation;"

Amendment of
section 21 of
the principal
Ordinance.

3. Section 21 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting sub-section (6) thereof and by substituting therefor the follow- 30 ing sub-sections:—

"(6) The Governor may, by notice in the Gazette, declare that any local authority may make an order under this section in respect of any forest area or part thereof which is outside the jurisdiction of such local authority, and such local authority may 35 make an order accordingly.

(7) Any order made by a local authority under the provisions of sub-section (6) of this section relating to a forest area or part

thereof which is outside the jurisdiction of such local authority shall be of a similar nature to an order which such local authority has made in respect of any area within its jurisdiction which abuts on such forest area or part thereof, unless the Conservator of Forests otherwise consents in writing.

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(8) Where a local authority has made an order under this section relating to any forest area or part thereof, whether such forest area or part thereof is within the jurisdiction of such local authority or not, the Conservator of Forests may apply to such local authority to vary such order in respect of any resident labourers employed by him, and such local authority may vary the order accordingly. When the local authority refuses to vary the order upon such application being made, the Conservator of Forests may, within 30 days after being notified of such refusal, appeal to the Governor in Council whose decision shall be final."

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Clause 2 of this Bill seeks to bring within the definition of "farm" all unalienated Crown land which is within the jurisdiction of a district council other than areas of such land which are situated in townships or trading centres and land which is specifically excluded by the Commissioner of Lands.

Clause 3.—The proposed new sub-section (6) seeks to empower local authorities to make orders under section 21 of the principal Ordinance in respect of forest areas which are outside their jurisdiction. By the proposed sub-section (7) any such order must be of a similar nature to an order which the local authority has made in respect of any area within its jurisdiction which abuts on such forest area, unless the Conservator of Forests agrees to the contrary. By the proposed sub-section (8) the Conservator of Forests may apply to the local authority to vary any order made in respect of resident labourers employed by the Forest Department, whether the forest area with respect to which the order is made is within the jurisdiction of the local authority or not. And when the local authority refuses to vary the order, the Conservator of Forests is given a right of appeal to the Governor in Council whose decision shall be final.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.
