TENDERS by way of royalty are invited for concessions to collect bêche-de-mer on the coast of the Kenya Protectorate within the following three areas:-

Area No. 1.—The foreshore from the Tanganyika boundary, near Vanga, to the mouth of Kilindini Harbour.

Area No. 2.-The foreshore from the mouth of Kiilndini Harbour to Kipini.

Area No. 3.—The foreshore from Kipini to the boundary of the Kenya Protectorate near Ras Kiambone or Dick's Head.

COMMUNIQUE—BANK OF ENGLAND NOTES THE following is the text of a Bank of England notice of the 23rd of March, 1945:

"The Bank of England have given notice in the London Edinburgh, and Belfast Gazettes calling in bank notes of £10 and upwards on April 30th next.

Up to and including that day such notes will remain legal tender and may be used in the ordinary way. Members of the public are however advised to pay any of these notes in their possession into their banking accounts without delay.

As from May 1st notes of £10 and upwards will cease to be legal tender but will still be exchangeable for bank notes of lower denominations at the Head Office of the Bank of England (or in the case of Branch notes either at the Head Office or at the Branch concerned). The Bank cannot, however, undertake to exchange notes through the medium of the post.

The call-in is primarily a domestic measure. Overseas holders are not directly affected by the notice, since the general ban on the import of all denominations of Bank of England notes remains in force.

This notice does not apply to Bank of England 25 notes, which will continue to be legal tender.

All holders of Bank of England notes of £5 and upwards are invited to exchange such notes at one of the local banks, who will accept them on a collection basis

The United Kingdom authorities will then permit notes so lodged for collection to be imported into the United Kingdom by the banks concerned.

It is pointed out that there is no compulsion on holders to repatriate their holdings of Bank of England notes.

Local banks cannot guarantee to accept notes tendered to them after the 28th of September, 1945.

general level of retail prices of consumers goods in Nairobi on 30th June, 1945, as measured by returns received from representative dealers was 63.6 per cent above the pre-war level, and the same as in April, 1945. Imported articles were 72.8 per cent above the pre-war level and local products 56.7 per cent, while the corresponding figures for April, 1945, were 74.1 per cent and 55.4 per cent respectively.

Among local products the only considerable change was an increase in the price of lake fish, which was probably seasonal.
