THE general level of retail prices of consumers goods in Nairobi on 31st August, 1945, as measured by returns received from representative dealers, was 62.3 per cent above the pre-war level, while the corresponding figure for June, 1945, was 63.6 per cent. Imported articles were 73.1 per cent above the pre-war level and local products 53.5 per cent, while the corresponding figures for June, 1945, were 72.8 per cent and 56.7 per cent respectively.

Among local products, sugar recorded a slight increase, while cocoa, aerated water, potatoes and fruits and vegetables recorded decreases.
