A Bill to Regularize the Position Regarding the Marriage, Divorce and Law Relating to Succession, of Hindus

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Hindu (Marriage, Divorce and Succession) Ordinance, 1945.

Interpretation.

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Hindu" includes Buddhists, Sikhs, Jains, Arya Samajists, Sanatanists, Brahmo Samajists and any person who, for the purpose of marriage, divorce or succession, is governed by Hindu law;

"Hindu law" means the law relating to marriage, divorce and succession adopted by any School or sub-School of Hindu law.

Marriage of Hindus.

3. (1) The marriage in the Colony of Hindus whether domiciled in the Colony or not, who are not related to each other in any of the 10 degrees of consanguinity or affinity prohibited by the law of the religion of either party to the marriage, shall, if the marriage is contracted in the manner customary in the Colony among persons professing the religion of either party to the marriage, be deemed for all purposes to be a valid marriage:

Provided that from and after the commencement of this Ordinance no boy under the age of eighteen years and no girl under the age of fourteen years shall be capable of contracting a valid Hindu marriage.

- (2) Save as is provided in the proviso to the last preceding sub- 20 section this section shall apply to marriages contracted either before or after the commencement of this Ordinance, but shall not render valid any invalid marriage—
 - (a) which, before the commencement of this Ordinance, has been declared to be invalid by any competent court; or 25
 - (b) where either party to the marriage has, before the commence-

7. (1) Subject to the provisions of this or any other Ordinance Succession to for the time being in force in the Colony, the succession to the property of movable property in the Colony of a deceased Hindu who at his Hindus. death is domiciled in the Colony and to the immovable property in the 5 Colony of a deceased Hindu, whether domiciled in the Colony at his death or not, shall be regulated by Hindu law:

Provided that—

- (a) so much of the Hindu law as deprives any person of a right of succession to property by reason of that person having *10* renounced or having been excluded from the Hindu religion or having been deprived of caste shall not be in force in the Colony; and
 - (b) every creditor shall have the same rights and remedies against the estate of a deceased Hindu (including the right to follow assets) as he has against the estate of a deceased Christian.
 - (2) This section shall apply to the estate of a Hindu who died before the commencement of this Ordinance in like manner as it applies to the estate of a Hindu dying after the commencement of this Ordinance:
- Provided that no part of an estate which has been distributed 20 before the commencement of this Ordinance shall be recoverable by reason only of any alteration in the law effected by this Ordinance.
- 8. No alteration in law effected by this Ordinance shall affect Saving of titles any title to property acquired for value before the commencement of 25 this Ordinance.

9. (1) For the purposes of this Ordinance, the Hindu law govern- Ascertainment ing any Hindu shall be the law subject to any special custom recognized and adopted by members of his caste domiciled in the Colony.

(2) A court may ascertain the Hindu law or any custom by any means which it thinks fit, and may act on information which appears to the court to be credible though it is not legal evidence, and in case of doubt or uncertainty may decide as the principles of justice, equity and good conscience may dictate.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to regularize the legal position as to marriages contracted in the Colony in accordance with the rites of the Hindu religion and further to make provision for the divorce of Hindus and the succession to property by Hindus.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.
