A Bill to Amend the Land and Agricultural Bank Ordinance, 1930

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

No. 3 of 1931.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Land and Agricultural Bank (Amendment) Ordinance, 1946, and shall be read as one with the Land and Agricultural Bank Ordinance, 1930, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of January, 1946.

Amendment of section 32 of the principal Ordinance.

2. Section 32 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by repealing the two provisos thereto and substituting therefor the following proviso:—

"Provided that the rate of interest charged in respect of any advance shall not be less than is sufficient to cover the average 10 rate payable by the Bank on the following funds, namely—

- (a) these provided under the provisions of sub-section (1) (a) or (b) of section 20 of this Ordinance;
- (b) those borrowed under the provisions of section 21 of this Ordinance, not including redemption thereof, 15

together with the costs of the administration of the Bank, including provision for losses."

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to repeal the first proviso to section 32 of the principal Ordinance (Ordinance No. 3 of 1931) which provides that no increase in the rate of interest shall be made on advances already made and, in the case of reduction of the rate of interest, such reduction shall only apply to the unpaid balance of the advance outstanding at the time of such reduction and that the rate of interest on any portion of an advance due and payable before such reduction of interest shall be based on the rate of interest payable on advances before such reduction.

Acting under the provisions of section 32 of the principal Ordinance the Board, with the approval of the Governor in Council, has decided to reduce the rate of interest payable on advances made out of the funds of the Bank to $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent, such reduction to take effect from the 1st January, 1946. It is desired to make such reduction in the rate of interest applicable to all loans made by the Bank including outstanding advances due and payable before the 1st January, 1946, and that cannot be done unless the above-mentioned proviso is repealed.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.


