IN VIEW of the end of the war and the continuing difficulties of the clothing situation the following instructions regarding dress are issued for information:—

When attending ceremonial occasions where uniform is to be worn, officers in possession of Colonial white undress uniform should wear it (*see* paragraph 141 of Colonial Regulations). Those not in possession of this uniform should wear ordinary civilian dress, or, if they have been members of H.M. Forces, may wear service dress, until further orders. The Governor will continue to wear the drab field service uniform.

Following the practice at Buckingham Palace, short coats and black ties will continue to be worn by gentlemen attending official dinner parties at Government House. Persons not in possession of this dress but who have been members of H.M. Forces may wear service dress until further orders. Persons not possessing either of the above types of dress may wear ordinary day dress.

Advice has been received from the Colonial Office that it is likely that the above instructions regarding dress will be in force for at least a year.
