A BILL TO AMEND THE CUSTOMS MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE, 1926

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title and commencement No 25 of 1926 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Management (Amendment) Ordinance, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Customs Management Ordinance, 1926, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of 5 January, 1947

Amendment of section 135 (1) and (2) of the principal Ordinance

- 2. Section 135 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended—
 - (a) by inserting between the word and comma "thereof," and the word "be", which appear in the fifth line 10 of sub-section (1) thereof, the words and comma "unless the Governor otherwise directs", and
 - (b) by inserting between the word 'shall' and the word 'furnish', which appear in the third line of subsection (2) thereof, the commas and words ", unless 15 the Governor otherwise directs,"

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Under the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 135 of the principal Ordinance (the Customs Management Ordinance, 1926) all goods which are imported free of duty on the ground that they are the property of the Crown, or of an officer of the Government, or of any company, firm or individual privileged by contract or otherwise to import such goods free of duty, are liable if such goods are thereafter sold, to be charged with the same duties as would be payable on the importation of similar goods by any person to whom the concession does not apply

During the emergency large quantities of goods were imported by the Crown and it has frequently been found expedient to dispose of such goods without requiring the import duty to be paid. To cover the position the section was temporarily amended, by means of Defence Regulations, to enable the Governor, in proper cases, to exempt such goods from the liability of import duty, and upon expiry of the Defence Regulations in February, 1946, the temporary amendment was continued, until the 31st day of December, 1946, by Ordinance No. 20 of 1946.

It is considered desirable that the Governor should continue to be vested with the above-mentioned power and this Bill, therefore, seeks to amend the principal Ordinance accordingly

A BILL TO AMEND THE COFFEE (MARKETING) ORDINANCE, 1946

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Coffee (Market- short title ing) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Coffee (Marketing) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1946, No 6 of 1946 hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance
- 2. Section 18 of the principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended by deleting paragraph (a) of the proviso to sub-section 18 of section (2) thereof and substituting therefor the following Ordinance paragraph —

- "(a) the Board sells to the Ministry of Food of the United Kingdom or otherwise offers for sale, and sells, in 10 the United Kingdom,"
 - 3. Section 27 of the principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended by deleting the figures "1949", which appear in the section 27 of second line thereof, and substituting therefor the figures Ordinance "1952"

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

As a result of negotiations between the Coffee Board and the Ministry of Food, an agreement was reached whereby the Ministry of Food will take 6,000 tons per annum of Kenya coffee at an agreed price for a period of five years commencing with the 1947/48 crop If effect is to be given to this agreement it is essential that control over the marketing of coffee be continued to cover the whole term of the agreement, 1 e until the 30th June 1952

Section 27 of the principal Ordinance (the Coffee (Marketing) Ordinance, 1946) provides that the measure shall continue in force until the 30th day of June, 1949

As the above-mentioned agreement was considered in the best interests of the coffee industry of the Colony, all coffee planters were circularized by the Coffee Board asking whether they would agree to the life of the principal Ordinance being extended for the whole period of the agreement An overwhelming majority of those voting agreed to the life of the Ordinance being so extended

This Bill, therefore, seeks to amend the principal Ordinance by prolonging its life until the 30th June, 1952 It also seeks to amend section 18 of the Ordinance to empower the Board to sell coffee to the United Kingdom Ministry of Food without first offering it for sale by public auction in Nairobi

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Uplands Bacon Factory (Kenya), Limited, (Constitution) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Uplands Bacon Factory (Kenya), Limited, (Constitution) Ordinance, 1945, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance, and shall 5 be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of July, 1946

- 2. Sub-section (5) of section 3 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting the words "have contributed to the cess" which appear in the third line thereof, 10 and substituting therefor the words and commas "contributed to the cess prior to the first day of April, 1946,"
- 3. The Schedule to the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following Schedule substituted therefor —

"SCHEDULE

(Section 3 (5))

- l Every pig producer who contributed to the cess prior to the first day of April, 1946, shall be credited with the following amounts—
 - Sh 4/48 35 for each bacon pig delivered by such producer,
 - Sh 2/39 12 in respect of each porker pig delivered by such producer,

and shall be issued with redeemable preference share(s), of the value of Sh 20 each, in respect of such credit, which share(s) shall be subject to the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the company

- 2 When the amount contributed to the cess by any pig producer, as arrived at in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 1 of this Schedule, is not a multiple of Sh 20, such pig producer shall elect whether he will receive or pay the difference required to bring such amount to a multiple of Sh 20
- 3 Redeemable preference shares allotted in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule shall be in the following form —

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Uplands Bacon Factory (Kenya), Limited, (Constitution) Ordinance, 1945, provides, inter alia, that the first shareholders of the Company shall be the Pig Industry Board to which all the ordinary shares shall be allotted, and the pig producers who have contributed to the cess to whom preference shares shall be allotted in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule to the Ordinance, and the Schedule provides that every pig producer who has contributed to the cess shall be allotted one redeemable preference share for every twenty shillings contributed by him to the cess up to the date of the coming into operation of the Ordinance

In 1941 when the cess was instituted the necessary staff required in order to keep the records of individual producers in pounds weight was not available. A communiqué was, therefore issued to all producers notifying them that for the purpose of calculating the amount of cess contributed by him, each supplier would be credited with—

150 lb per pig for Baconers, 80 lb per pig for Porkers.

and that the total amount so credited would be divided into the total cess collected and that each individual producer would be credited with a share of the capital subscribed, calculated accordingly

Although pig producers paid a cess of three cents per pound on the actual weight of pigs delivered, in view of the fact that no records exist regarding such weights it is impossible to allocate shares in accordance with the present provisions of the above-mentioned Oldinance

This Bill, therefore, seeks to amend the Ordinance to enable an allocation of shares to be made in accordance with the terms of the above-mentioned communiqué

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

Interest due from the Asiatic Widows' and Orphans Pension Fund on account of contributions of those members who were formerly members of the Asiatic Widows and Orphans Pension Fund and who have become members of the Asian Officers Family Pensions Fund since 1st May, 1942, his not yet been transferred to the Asian Officers' Family Pensions Fund. The rate of interest is under consideration by Government and when it is fixed the interest will be transferred.

The sum of £13,421-10-35 appearing in the Income and Expenditure Account in respect of Government Contributions is liable to reduction to an extent yet to be ascertained. Resulting from misinterpretation of Section 13A(1) of the Ordinance Government Contributions were assessed in the case of members transferring from the Asiatic Widows and Orphans' Pension Fund as from the dates on which they commenced to subscribe to that fund, where is in fact such contributions by Government were only due as from the 1st May 1942. The extent of the refund necessary in this connexion can only be ascertained when the revision of individual calculations has been completed.

The sum of £28,315-3-51 which is shown as eash on deposit at the Treasury was not available for investment during the year. This figure is largely represented by an adjustment of £28 155-0-10 in respect of Government Contributions, transfers from the Asiatic Widows' and Orphans Pension Fund, and arrears of personal contributions which was effected in 1946 prior to the closing of 1945 account
