THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE

PROCLAMATION

IN EXERCISE of the powers thereunto enabling me, I hereby declare the areas defined in the Schedule to be "infected areas in respect of the disease indicated at the head of the Schedule

SCHEDULE—RABIES

1 The locations of Nyakach and Kano, Central Kavirondo, including Kisumu Township and the area described as follows

Commencing at the north-westerly corner of L R No 654/16 on the Kibos River, thence in an easterly and southerly direction along the northern and eastern boundaries of that portion to its intersection with the bottom edge of the Nandi Escarpment, thence in a generally easterly direction along that edge of the escarpment to a point due north of the north-eastern corner of L R No 1605, thence southerly by a straight line to that corner, thence south-easterly by the north-eastern boundaries

of L R Nos 1605, 1587, 1587/1, 1587 to the intersection of the last boundary with the Kipchui River, thence up-stream by that river to the westernmost corner of L R No 6008, thence south-easterly by the south western boundary of that portion to its south-eastern corner, thence south-westerly by the north-western boundaries of L R Nos 1607 and 6086 to the northern boundary of the Kenya and Uganda Railway thence westerly by that railway boundary to the Kibos River, thence up stream by that river to the point of commencement

2 That portion of Central and North Kavirondo Reserves lying south of the Yala River and bounded in the south by the Lake Province to Kisumu

3 That portion of North and Central Kavirondo Districts lying between the Nzoia River and the Yala River

4 The Kisumu-Londiani Administrative District

5 Portion of North Kavirondo lying north of the Nzoia River

6 Kitui District as described by Proclamation 54 of 1924

7 Kericho Sotik Administrative District, i.e. all settled areas within that district and all the locations of the Lumbwa Reserve

8 Commencing about one and a half miles south-west of the western boundary of Kitale Township at the junction of the centre lines of main district road and the Elmer-Kiminini district road, thence generally southerly for a distance of approximately ten miles by the centre line of the Elmer-Kiminini district road to the junction of the latter with the centre line of the Hemsted's Bridge district road, thence generally north-westerly for a distance of approximately six miles to the junction of the centre line of the Hemsted's Bridge district road with the centre line of the Elgon Link South District road in the vicinity of the Elgon Club, thence generally northerly for a distance of approximately four miles by the centre line of the Elgon Link South District road to its intersection with the centre line of the main district road referred to above, thence generally north-easterly for a distance of approximately six miles by the centre line of that main district road to the point of commencement

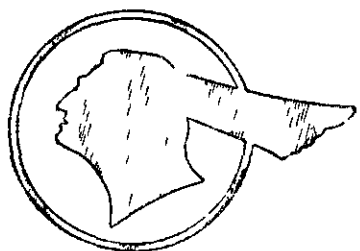

(ii) *Cotton Textiles from India*—The Indian Government has notified a considerable reduction in the quota of cotton piece goods from India for 1947 Allocations are being dispatched to importers in the usual manner

(iii) *Cotton Textiles from the U S A*—Registered importers are notified that no further licences to import cotton piece goods from the U S A are being issued for the time being

(iv) *Cotton Textiles from Japan*—Information has now been received of definite quantities of grey piece goods available for supply from Japan Full details will be circulated to registered importers who are particularly requested not to address correspondence to the office of the Imports Controller in the meantime

(v) *Germany*—Negotiations are in progress for supplies of cotton textiles from Germany and further details will be published in the next Bulletin if available

CANNED SALMON FROM CANADA

The United Kingdom authorities have notified that the International Emergency Food Council have found it necessary to cancel the allocation of canned salmon to these territories

PASSENGER VEHICLES FROM THE U S A

Import licences have been issued to the main motor vehicle agents in Kenya and Uganda covering 650 units from the U S A for the first period, 1947

COTTON PIECE GOODS FROM THE U K

Efforts have been made for some considerable time to ensure that the Uganda Protectorate receives a fair share of textiles from this source It is believed that the facility which permits the release of single bales of piece goods to importers for their own retail sale has been abused and has had to be withdrawn

INDIAN COTTON PIECE GOODS

Several importers have attempted to evade the effect of distribution control by arranging that consignments of cotton piece goods are given descriptions corresponding to types which are not subject to distribution control A list is being compiled of such importers and unless a satisfactory explanation is forthcoming it is proposed to delete their names from the importers list without notice

VEHICLE TYRES

With effect from 1st April, 1947, a permit will no longer be required before a motor vehicle tyre or inner tube can be purchased Registered dealers will be required to submit a weekly return to the Imports Controller in accordance with Government Notice No 272 of 1947
