**A BILL TO PROVIDE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF
A LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title
and date of
commencement

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Local Government Board Ordinance, 1947, and shall come into operation on such date as the Governor may, by notice in the Gazette, appoint

Establishment of
Local Govern-
ment Board

2. (1) There shall be established a Local Government Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), which shall have the powers and exercise the duties and functions conferred upon it under the provisions of this Ordinance or of any other Ordinance, relating to or concerning local government, for the time being in force in the Colony

(2) The Board shall consist of—

(a) the Member for Health and Local Government, as Chairman,

(b) the Attorney General,

(c) the Financial Secretary,

(d) the Chief Native Commissioner, and

(e) such other persons, not being members of the public service, as the Governor may, from time to time, appoint

(3) If any person referred to in paragraphs (b), (c) and (d) of sub-section (2) of this section is unable to attend any meeting of the Board, he may be represented by a deputy

(4) The members of the Board appointed under paragraph (e) of sub-section (2) of this section shall hold office during the Governor's pleasure

(5) In the absence of the Chairman from any meeting of the Board a Chairman for such meeting shall be chosen by the members present

(6) Five members of the Board shall form a quorum

(7) The Chairman of the meeting shall have a deliberative vote and, in the case of an equality of votes shall also have a casting vote The decision of the majority of the members present and voting at any meeting shall be deemed to be the decision of the Board

Functions and
duties of
the Board

3. The Board shall, in addition to any powers, functions or duties which may be conferred upon it under the provisions of any Ordinance for the time being in force in the Colony, advise the Governor and the Governor in Council upon all matters in regard to local government which the Governor or the Governor in Council may refer to it for advice

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to establish a Local Government Board which will have the general direction of policy in matters relating to local government, and, arising out of the reorganization of the Government in accordance with Sessional Paper No 6 of 1945, will exercise a number of powers, including approval of financial estimates, which are at present exercised by the Governor in Council, and which will be transferred from the Governor in Council to the Board

It is also intended that, under the proposed legislation to amend the law relating to local government the Board shall act as the appellate authority from decisions of local authorities and Standing Committees

It is not anticipated that any additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law
