(a) Cotton Textiles.—Importers are advised that the following quantities of cotton piece goods are on order from the major supplying countries as at 24th April, 1947:—

(b) Japanese Textiles.—All quotas allocated by the Controller, Overseas Purchasing Division, have been fully taken up and advice has been received that direct shipments from Japan will be available at Japanese port during May.

There is some doubt in the minds of certain importers regarding Japanese textiles which are being sent to the United King-dom for processing. These supplies will be made available from the United Kingdom as and when they are ready and will be licensed in Kenya and Uganda in exactly the same way as textiles offered from the United Kingdom wholy of British manu-

(c) United States of America Textiles.—Several indents submitted by manufacturers' agents to the office of the Imports Controller, purporting to represent orders placed with them by importers, have been found not to represent genuine orders placed by importers; and the latter have subsequently refused to confirm them. There have been other instances in which it has been the offers produced which are not genuine. The issue of import licences in these circumstances is not only a waste of time and effort on the part of the Imports Control authorities but prevents genuine traders from placing orders overseas since the quota has been partly taken up with useless indents.

A check of all import licences is being instituted in order to locate any such abuses as those mentioned above, and if it is found that, after the fortnight's period of grace mentioned below has elapsed, any import licence has not been backed by a firm order and a covering letter of credit has not been established, it is proposed to place the name of the manufacturer's agent concerned on a "black list". Thereafter no indents in the name of his overseas principals will be accepted for import licences.

Those manufacturers' agents who are concerned will, however, for the time being be given an opportunity of putting these matters right by surrendering import licences which have not been taken up by importers or which are not covered by genuine offers and they are asked to do so forthwith. Provided such licences are surrendered within fourteen days of the date of this Gazette, the agents concerned will not be black-listed.

(d) Indian Textiles.—Notwithstanding previous notices, several importers have ordered textiles from India without proper covering import licences. Instances have also arisen where importers have allowed orders to come forward which contain textiles of the types which are not allowed into Kenya and Uganda. These textiles have been seized and confiscated by the Customs authorities and merchants are warned to take all possible precautions to ensure that their orders do not contain prohibited types and are covered by proper import licences.

(e) Gift Parcels.—Instances have been brought to light where private individuals have placed orders in South Africa for goods originating in hard currency countries. Arrangements are made by individuals placing these orders to have the goods sent to them and described as "gift parcels". This practice is illegal and members of the public are warned that action is being taken to have such consignments seized and confiscated by H.M. Customs.

(f) Canned Fish.—Import licences will now be issued without regard to past performance for canned fish of all descriptions. Licences will not be issued, however, covering imports from the United Kingdom nor for indents involving the use of hard
