# A BILL TO AMEND THE SISAL INDUSTRY ORDINANCE, 1945

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

No 21 of 1945

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Sisal Industry (Amendment) Ordinance, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Sisal Industry Ordinance, 1945, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Repeal and replacement of section 7 (9) (1) of the principal Ordinace

- 2. Sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph (9) of section 7 of the 5 principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following sub-paragraph substituted therefor
  - "(1) the payment of such fees, travelling and out-of-pocket expenses, as may be approved by the Governor, to members of the Board and of Committees 10 appointed by the Board,"

Repeal and replacement of section 10 of the principal Ordinance

Board may appoint Committees and may delegate powers

- 3. Section 10 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor
  - "10 The Board may appoint, whether from amongst their own number or otherwise, committees and may, by 15 resolution, delegate any powers conferred upon them by this Ordinance to any such committees or to any member, officer or servant of the Board"

Repeal of Ordinance No 40 of 1946 4. The Sisal Industry (Amendment) Ordinance, 1946, is hereby repealed 20

# MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Under the law as it stands, the Sisal Board has power to appoint committees only from amongst the members of the Board and may only authorize the payment of fees, travelling and out-of-pocket expenses to such members. It is the desire of the members of the Board that they should be empowered to appoint committees from amongst their own number or otherwise, and that they should be able to pay fees, travelling and out-of-pocket expenses, not only to members of the Board, but to members of such committees

This Bill seeks to make the necessary amendments to the law No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law
