Under the orders of the Divisional Engineer the Inspector is in charge of the Mombasa water supply, which supplies at present up to 2,500,000 gallons per day. The duties of the post comprise (a) the production of the above quantity of water from various intakes and pumping stations and boreholes. The maintenance and operation of all works, including the gravitation main (some 26 miles long), together with sundry mains, pumping stations, boreholes, (b) the treatment, sterilization and conditioning of the water, (c) the distribution of water and the maintenance of the distribution system, reservoirs and meters, (d) dealing with the public in connexion with local matters, complaints, etc., (e) dealing with correspondence concerning the water supply
