# A BILL TO AMEND THE NATIVE LIQUOR ORDINANCE, 1930

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows—

Short title

No 36 of 1930

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Native Liquor (Amendment) Ordinance, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Native Liquor Ordinance, 1930 hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Exclusive licence to local authorities to authorize sale of wine and beer

No 62 of 1934

2. Where, under the provisions of section 28 of the 5 principal Ordinance, the right to manufacture and/or sell and supply native intoxicating liquor in any area has been declared by the Governor in Council to be vested exclusively in the local authority in charge of such area, such declaration

in the local authority in charge of such area, such declaration shall, notwithstanding the provisions of the Liquor Ordin-10 ance, 1934, but subject to the consent of the District Commissioner and to such conditions as he may impose, confer upon such authority the power, in addition, to sell wines and beers to natives, and the provisions of section 31 of the principal Ordinance shall apply to all profits accruing to the local 15 authority from the sale of such wines and beers to the same extent as it applies to the profits accruing to the local authority from the manufacture and/or sale of native intoxicating

Licences issued under section 9A to authorize sale of wine and beer No 62 of 1934

3. A licence granted under the provisions of section 9A 20 of the principal Ordinance shall, notwithstanding the provisions of the Liquor Ordinance, 1934, but subject to the consent of the District Commissioner and to such conditions as he may impose, confer upon the licensee the right to sell wines and beers to natives resident in or employed in such place or places as may be specified in such licence, and the provisions of sub-section (2) of that section shall apply to all profits accruing from the sale of such wines and beers to the same extent as it applies to the profits accruing to the licensee from the manufacture and/or sale of native intoxicat-30

Amendment of section 5 of the principal Ordinance

- 4. Section 5 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding thereto the following new sub-section
  - '(3) The Provincial Commissioner may, in any case if he thinks fit, and shall, when required so to do and 35 upon payment of a sum of shillings twenty by an applicant, authorize the holding of a special meeting of the licensing Board"

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill is a corollary to the Bill to Amend the Liquoi Ordinance, 1934, and seeks to conter powers upon licensees, under the Native Liquor Ordinance, 1930, to sell, in addition to native intoxicating liquor wines and beers

In addition, this Bill seeks to empower a Provincial Commissioner to authorize the holding of special meetings of any Licensing Board established under the provisions of the principal Ordinance

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

# A BILL TO AMEND THE LIQUOR ORDINANCE, 1934

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquor Short title (Amendment) Ordinance, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Liquor Ordinance, 1934, hereinafter referred to as the No 62 of 1934 principal Ordinance
- 2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Certain principal Ordinance contained, the holder of a wine licensees merchant's and grocei's liquor licence, whose licence has been authorized so endorsed for the purpose of the provisions of this Ordin- to sell ance, may, subject to such conditions as may be set out in wines, etc, to natives, etc 10 such endorsement, sell, for consumption off his premises, wines ale, beer, porter, cyder, perry or hop-beer in quantities authorized under his licence to any native, Abyssinian, Somali, Malagasy or Comoro Islander

3. Any person being the holder of, or an applicant for, Mannet of 15 a wine merchant's and grocer's liquor licence, may, if he so application for desires, when he applies for a new licence or tor a renewal of his existing licence apply also for permission to sell under such licence, for consumption off the premises, wines, ale, beer, porter, cyder, perry or hop-beer to any native, 20 Abyssınıan, Somalı Malagasy or Comoro Islander

4. Where such an application has been received by a Constitution licensing court such court shall, for the sole purpose of hearing of licensing such application, co-opt as members of the court one or more hearing natives from a list of suitable natives which shall be pre-25 pared by the District Commissioner or, in the case of an area under the jurisdiction of a Municipal Council or Municipal Board, by such Council or Board

5 (1) The court when so constituted for such purpose Powers of may grant the application, or refuse to grant the application licensing 30 or may grant the application subject to such conditions as the court may think fit

- (2) The court may refuse to grant an application without assigning any reason therefor and such decision shall be final and not subject to appeal
- (3) Where the court grants an application, it shall cause 35 to be endorsed on the wine merchant's and grocer's liquor licence in question, the fact that the holder thereof is authorized to sell and the conditions under which such holder may so sell wines, ale, beer, porter, cyder, perry or hop-beer to 40 natives, Abyssinians, Somalis, Malagasies or Comoro **Islanders**
- (4) The court when so sitting may, at any time, without hearing the holder of the licence and without assigning any reason therefor, cancel such endorsement with effect from such 45 date as the court may determine
  - **6.** Notwithstanding anything contained in section 41 of the principal Ordinance, any native, Abyssinian, Somali, Malagasy or Comoro Islander may be in possession of any wines, ale, beer, portei cydei perry or hop-beer

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to amend the law so as to enable the holder of a wine merchant's and grocer's liquor licence under the Liquor Ordinance, 1934, to sell wines and beers for consumption off the premises, to natives, Abyssinians Malagasies and Comoro Islanders

Clauses 3, 4 and 5 set out the machinery under which, if the Bill becomes law, the holder of, or an applicant for, such a licence may be granted the necessary permission by means of an endorsement on his licence. It is proposed that the licensing court when hearing applications shall co-opt African members and that the court shall have full powers to refuse or to grant the application on such conditions as it thinks fit. It is also proposed that the court shall have power, without assigning any reason therefor, to cancel the endorsement on a licence from such date as the court may determine

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

The constable continued to struggle with the African and was stabbed in the shoulder. The constable again closed with the African succeeded in getting him on to the ground, receiving a third wound in the hand in doing so, and finally effected his airest.

TENDERS are invited for the purchase for agricultural and pastoral purposes of the grant of each of the areas situated in the Highlands detailed in the Schedule hereto

- 2 Plans of the areas may be seen at the office of the Commissioner of Lands, Mines and Surveys, Nairobi and a copy may be obtained on application at the price of Sh 6 each, post free In those cases in which the areas have not been surveyed, sketch plans only are available
- 3 Each grant will be for a term of 999 years from the first of the month following the acceptance of the tender and will be subject to the ordinary conditions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140 of the Revised Edition) The titles will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance, 1919 (Chapter 142) and will be subject to the following development conditions being effected within a period of two years of the commencement of the grant—
  - (a) The construction of a house to approved specifications
  - (b) The construction of dams each with a depth of not less than 20 feet, if practicable, to a number and specification to be decided by the Soil Conservation Officei (As an alternative to this construction boreholes may be sunk on sites to be determined by the Director of Public Works and the Soil Conservation Officer provided that if need be pipe lines shall be run from borehole sites to watering places approved by the Soil Conservation Officer)
