IMPORTS CONTROL—KENYA AND UGANDA
BULLETIN No 8

I—IMPORTS

(a) *Cotton Textiles—U S 4*—

As the result of action taken as set out at 1 (c) of Bulletin No 7, import licences covering very considerable quantities of textiles have been surrendered for cancellation. Importers are notified that import licences for further quantities of grey piece goods from the U S A will be issued on 1st August, 1947. The issue of these import licences will be confined to those merchants who have actually imported U S A textiles during 1947. Applications should be submitted together with firm offers, samples and the numbers and dates of import entries covering imports for the current year. Quantities need not be shown. On the date indicated these applications will be examined and if considered suitable will be licensed. Those considered unsuitable will be rejected and in this connexion the decision of the Imports Controller will be final. Owing to staff difficulties any applications or offers not received strictly in accordance with the foregoing will be ignored and the relative documents filed away.

(b) *Japanese Textiles*—

Approximately 6,000,000 yards of Japanese grey piece goods have been dispatched to the United Kingdom for conversion. Offers of these textiles are being received and U K import licences will be issued therefor in the usual manner.

(c) *Indian Cotton Piece Goods*—

It is notified for general information that import licences will be issued for cotton piece goods from India to those merchants whose names appear on the Indian Import Quota List. Import licences will not be issued to any merchant who received import licences against fixed offers in the early part of 1947 and who did not import the quantities stated to have been available in the relative offers. All applications must be accompanied by offers showing the type, price and quantity. Offers will not be accepted for hand-printed textiles, motor-hood cloth nor furnishing fabrics unless it can be clearly established that these items are not included in the Indian Cotton Piece Goods Export Quota. Any applications which are received which are not in accordance with the foregoing will be ignored and the relative papers filed.

(d) *Cotton Piece Goods—General*—

Many merchants have brought so called fixed offers for textiles to the office of the Imports Controller which have subsequently proved to be false in some particular or other. Importers are advised that import licences issued from any source against fixed offers will in no circumstances be amended in any particular. It is unfortunately necessary to emphasize once again that owing to staff difficulties requests for such amendments will have to be ignored and the relative licences will be cancelled in instances where such requests are received.

Attempts have been made by various importers to avoid the effects of distribution control by importing goods by parcel post. In several instances hundreds of parcels have been received by the same importer. All import licences issued for cotton textiles from any source will be endorsed "not valid for importation by parcel post."

2 General Notice No 576 of 1946 is hereby varied accordingly.

(e) *Woollen Piece Goods*—

Import licences will now be issued for woollen piece goods without regard to past performance. Such licences will not, however, be issued involving the use of hard currencies.

(f) *Import Licences*—

Importers are informed that they must exercise greater care to ensure that import licences issued to them are not mislaid or lost. Numerous applications for the issue of copies of import licences takes up a great amount of the time of the Control and also of the importers concerned.

Import licences subject to a time limit should be kept under careful review by the holder and submitted to the office of the Imports Controller for renewal as and when necessary. Imports against time-expired import licences will not be allowed.

(g) *Office Machinery—Calculators*—

The undermentioned United Kingdom manufacturers are able to supply the machines indicated—

(1) London Computator, Ltd., Albemarle Street, London W 1. Manufacture the "Plus Rapid" adding machine and offer delivery in four months from receipt of order. These machines are made in three sizes, twelve-column model, £42, nine-column model, £31 10 0 and minor or six-column model £25-4-0.

(2) Muldiver Calculating Machine Co., Ltd., 49 Victoria Street, London, E C 4, manufactures several adding-listing and calculating machines and can offer delivery of hand-operated 'Britannic' calculator in one month, price £92 10-0. There are various models at prices from £46 to £105. The higher-priced models are electrically operated.

(3) Bulmers Calculating Machines, 7 Poultry, London, E C 2, manufacture the 'Addo' calculating machine in several models but would require details of sizes and quantities required before giving delivery dates.

(h) *Indian Pepper*—

Importers are advised that the Government of India has made available for export 15 tons of Indian pepper for the period April/September, 1947.

(i) *Fish Nets and Twines*—

(i) *Cotton*—The United Kingdom authorities have notified that after the expiry of the current period (i.e. from 30th June 1947) the United Kingdom specified market allocation procedure will be abandoned. Supplies to these territories, however, will be safeguarded so far as is practicable. Orders should be placed as early as possible and in the event of difficulty merchants should notify the Imports Controller giving full details of indents and licence numbers.

(ii) *Flax and Hemp*—Control of production in the United Kingdom has ceased but control of the raw materials will be continued. No guarantee can be given, however, that manufacturers will accept all orders placed. Importers should notify the Imports Controller in the event of difficulty, giving information regarding indents and import licences.

(j) *Oils and Fats from India*—

The undermentioned quantities have been made available for export from India for the period ending 31st December, 1947—

Groundnut Oil—Kenya and Uganda five tons

Linseed Oil—Kenya and Uganda twelve tons

(k) *Foodstuffs*—

Import licences will now be issued for the following items of canned fish from the United Kingdom—

(i) *Canned Herring*
Herring Roe
Cod Roe
Brisling

(ii) *Salted Fish*—Import licences will be issued for this item for supply from the United Kingdom.

(iii) *Chocolate and Sugar Confectionery Cocoa and Drinking Chocolate*—United Kingdom manufacturers will be allotted quotas of the aggregate of the Colonial Export Programmes and supplies may be obtained from any preferred manufacturer up to the approved programmes.

(iv) Import licences will be issued for olive oil from all sources subject to currency considerations.

(l) *Iron and Steel*—

Advices received from overseas indicate that the position for this item has become even more acute and all concerned are requested to exercise the greatest possible economy in the use of articles manufactured from iron and steel.

(m) *Newsprint*—

The United Kingdom authorities have notified that a quota of 47½ tons will be made available for the second half of the current year for supply from that source.

(n) *Wallboards*—

A further quota will be issued for the second half of 1947 on the same basis as for the first half of 1947 to those importers with past performance.

II—DISTRIBUTION

(a) *Cotton Piece Goods—Imports by Parcel Post*—

Owing to continued attempts to evade distribution control it has been found necessary to issue freezing orders for imports by parcel post. Where it is established that large quantities have come forward these will be subject to distribution control as in the case of arrivals by freight.

(b) *U K Textiles*—

It is notified for general information that returns as at 31st December indicated that Uganda had not received a fair share of imports of textiles from this source. It had been the practice to release imports consisting of single bales of textiles and investigation established that this indulgence had been abused and that merchants had made arrangements with their overseas suppliers to ship single bales on single bills of lading and in other instances to pack quantities normally imported in two bales into one bale. In these circumstances it has been necessary to withdraw the facility of the release of such single bales and

arrangements have been made that alternate bales arriving singly will be taken over by the Uganda Piece Goods Buying Pool

At a recent case at Mombasa a merchant was fined Sh 200 and two bales of piece goods were confiscated. This importer endeavoured to evade distribution control by declaring khaki drill as bleached piece goods

(c) Refrigerators—

All classes of refrigerators are subject to control and importers are notified that applications for the release of commercial refrigerators will not be considered until priority demands have been satisfied

(d) Whisky—

Sufficient supplies are not available to permit an allocation to be made for the month of July. An allocation will be made in August if possible

A large amount of correspondence has been received from various individuals, clubs and hotels seeking an increase in their present allocation or asking to be considered for a fresh allocation. It is not possible in view of the present supply position either to increase current allocations or to make new allocations and those concerned are advised that applications forwarded to the office of the Imports Controller, notwithstanding this notice, will, owing to staff difficulties, have to be ignored
