A BILL TO PROVIDE FOR THE TESTING, AND FOR THE CONTROL OF THE SALE, IMPORT, EXPORT AND USE OF, SEEDS

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title and commencement

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Seeds Ordinance, 1947, and shall come into operation upon such date as the Governor may, by notice in the Gazette, appoint

PART I—INTERPRETATION

Interpretation

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise re- 5 quires—

"Director" means the Director of Agriculture,

"impurities" means—

- (a) all seeds or portions of seeds, other than those of which the parcel purports to consist, whether they are those 10 of weeds harmless plants, or other cultivated plants,
- (b) broken seeds of the kind of which the parcel purports to consist so far as they are incapable of germinating,
- (c) foreign matter, sand, grit, soil, fragments of 100ts, stems or flowers, sprouted seeds (except in the case 15 of cereal seeds), single glumes, single pales, pales without a kernel, smut, ergot and other sclerotia, broken cones, scales and seed wings, and
- (d) in the case of mangel and beet seed, clusters wholly devoid of seeds and all material which passes through 20 a sieve having circular holes of 25 millimetres diameter,

"inspector" means any officer of the Department of Agriculture or of the Forestry Department authorized by the Director to act as an inspector for the purposes of this Ordin-25 ance, and includes any other person authorized by the Director, with the approval of the Member for Agriculture, by notice in the Gazette,

"official seed-tester" means a seed-tester appointed under the provisions of section 4 of this Ordinance, 30

"owner" in relation to seeds includes any person having the possession thereof,

"pure seed" means the seed of which the parcel purports to consist after the impurities as defined in this section have been eliminated

35

"purity" means analytical purity, and the degree to which any parcel of seed consists of pure seed, but in the case of those species, varieties, stocks or strains of plants, the seeds of which cannot be distinguished from one another by expert examination, the use of the term does not imply that the seed 40 is genuine or true to name,

"registered seed-grower" means any person registered with the Director under the provisions of section 12 of this Ordinance,

"seeds" means the parts of plants customarily referred 45 to as seeds,

"seed-testing station" means a seed-testing station established under the provisions of section 3 of this Ordinance

PART II—TESTING OF SEEDS

3. (1) The Director shall establish and maintain one or Establishment of more seed-testing stations in the Colony

seed-testing stations

- (2) Any person who wishes to have any sample of seeds 5 tested at a seed-testing station shall deliver with the sample of such seed a statement in respect of the origin, kind, variety, quantity of the seed, and such other details, together with such fees, as may be prescribed
- The Director shall by notice in the Gazette appoint Appointment of 10 one of more officers in the service of the Government of the Colony to be official seed-testers

PART III—CONTROL OF THE IMPORT, EXPORT AND SALE OF SEEDS

5. (1) No seeds shall be imported into the Colony except Import of seeds 15 through one of the following ports or places of entry —

Mombasa,

Kisumu,

Nairobi

- (2) All seeds imported into the Colony shall be detained 20 by a customs officer who shall deliver the seeds to an official seed-tester for testing or examination
- (3) Any seeds which have been detained under the provisions of this section and which are found on examination by an official seed-tester to contain seeds of the noxious weeds 25 specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto, in excess of the amounts specified in the second column of the Schedule hereto, may be destroyed together with their containers
- (4) No compensation shall be payable in respect of any seeds or seed containers destroyed under the provisions of 30 this section
 - (5) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, the Director may, by notice in the Gazette, exempt from all or any of such provisions such seeds, and subject to such conditions, as may be specified in such notice
- 6. No vegetable or agricultural seeds shall be exported Export of seeds 35 unless they have been tested under the provisions of section 8 of this Ordinance

7. (1) Save as prescribed in this section, no seeds shall Prohibition on be sold, exposed for sale, delivered, bought, or sown if they sale, purchase 40 contain seeds of the noxious weeds specified in the first of seeds column of the Schedule hereto in excess of the amounts containing specified in the second column of the Schedule hereto

and use, etc, noxious weeds

Provided that the provisions of this sub-section shall not apply to the sale or delivery of seeds, which have been grown 45 in the Colony, to a person purporting to purchase them with a view to cleaning them before they are sold or exposed for sale, and who, at the time of the sale or delivery, whichever is the earlier, gives to the seller or owner of the seeds an undertaking in writing that he will clean the seeds before selling 50 them or exposing them for sale

- (2) Any person cleaning seeds shall destroy by fire any noxious weed seeds removed during the process of cleaning
- (3) (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-section (1) Exemption of of this section, seeds which have been grown in the Colony seeds not to be used for sowing 55 and which contain seeds of the noxious weeds specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto in excess of the amounts specified in the second column of the Schedule hereto, may under a permit issued by the Director, be sold, offered for sale or delivered for purposes other than for sowing
- 60(b) The Director may refuse to issue such a permit of may issue such a permit subject to such conditions as he may think fit to impose

Control of sale of Governmenttested seeds

- 8. No person shall sell or expose for sale any seeds purporting to be Government-tested seeds or bearing any label or mark indicating or implying that the seeds have been Government-tested unless—
 - (a) a sample of the seeds taken in the prescribed manner 5 has been submitted to and tested at a seed-testing station,
 - (b) a statement in the prescribed form, containing the prescribed particulars in respect of the purity and germination of the seeds, has been issued to the seller 10 by an official seed-tester,
 - (c) such statement is displayed conspicuously by the seller on or in close proximity to the seeds, and
 - (d) (i) a copy of such statement is delivered by the seller to the purchaser on or before any sale or, if the 15 seeds are not delivered at the time of sale, on or before the delivery thereof, or
 - (11) in the case of packets of seeds, the packets are distinctly marked in the prescribed manner to the effect that the contents thereof conform with the provisions 20 of this section

Control of sale of Governmentcertified seeds

- 9. No person shall sell or expose for sale any seeds, other than seed potatoes, purporting to be Government-certified seeds or bearing any label or mark purporting to be a Government certificate unless—

 - (a) a sample of the seeds, taken in the prescribed manner, has been submitted to and tested at a seed-testing station,
 - (b) a certificate in the prescribed form and containing the prescribed particulars in respect of the country of 30 origin, variety, trueness to variety, purity and germination of the seeds, has been issued to the seller by an official seed-tester,
 - (c) such certificate is conspicuously displayed by the seller on or in close proximity to the seeds, and 35
 - (d) (1) a copy of such certificate is delivered by the seller to the purchaser on or before any sale or, if the seeds are not delivered at the time of sale on or before the delivery thereof, or
 - (11) in the case of packets of seeds, the packets are dis-40 tinctly marked in the prescribed manner to the effect that the contents thereof conform with the provisions of this section

Control of sale of Governmentcertified seed potatoes

- 10. (1) No person shall sell or expose for sale any potatoes purporting to be Government-certified seed potatoes 45 or bearing any label or mark purporting to be a Government certificate unless—
 - (a) the crop has been inspected in the field by an inspector,
 - (b) a certificate in the prescribed form to the effect that the crop has been inspected in the field by an inspector and that it was found to have reached prescribed standards of freedom from disease, trueness to name and dressing has been issued to the seller by the inspector,
 - (c) such certificate is conspicuously displayed by the seller 55 on or in close proximity to the potatoes, and
 - (d) a copy of such certificate is delivered by the seller to the purchaser on or before any sale or, if the potatoes are not delivered at the time of sale, on or before the delivery thereof

PART IV—CERTIFICATES AND STATEMENTS

11. (1) No certificate shall be issued under the provisions Certificates and of section 9 of this Ordinance, unless the sample of seeds tested reaches the prescribed standards in respect of variety, 5 trueness to variety, purity and germination

- (2) No certificate shall be issued under the provisions of section 9 or of section 10 of this Ordinance in respect of any seeds, other than imported seeds, unless—
 - (a) they have been grown by a registered grower, and
 - (b) the grower has carried out, to the satisfaction of an inspector, all such instructions with regard to selecting or roguing which may have been given to the grower by an inspector under the provisions of section 13 of this Ordinance
- (3) The copy of the statement or certificate, as the case Statement or 15 may be, required to be delivered to a purchaser in respect of delivered with seeds, other than seeds in packets, under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be contained in a sale note or invoice or be attached to, inserted or written on, the package containing 20 the seeds

PART V—REGISTERED SEED-GROWERS

12. (1) Any person wishing to grow any crop for seed Registration of production may, before the crop is sown, register himself with the Director as a registered seed-grower in respect of such crop

seed-growers

- (2) The Director shall from time to time publish in the Official Gazette the names of registered seed-growers and particulars of the crops in respect of which they are registered
- 13. A registered seed-grower shall permit an inspector Registered seedto inspect the growing crop in respect of which he is registered 30 and shall carry out all instructions which the inspector may instructions of give him with regard to selecting, roguing, or uprooting and destroying any such or any other crop

PART VI—GENERAL POWERS OF INSPECTORS, AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

14. Where any person has been registered by the Direc- Power to order 35 tor as a registered seed-grower and an inspector is satisfied that upon any land, within such distance of the seed crop of such registered seed-grower as may be prescribed, there is growing any plant which may, by cross-pollination, endanger 40 the purity of the registered seed-grower's crop, he may, by notice in writing, require the grower of such plant, or the owner or occupier of the land upon which such plant is growing, to uproot such plant before a date to be specified in such notice

15. An inspector may at all reasonable times enter Power to enter 45 upon any land, within such distance as may be prescribed of upon land the boundaries of the land upon which any registered seedgrower is growing any crop for seed production in order to ascertain whether or not any plants are growing thereon 50 which may by cross-pollination endanger the purity of the registered seed-grower's crop

16. (1) An inspector may at all reasonable times enter Inspector's any premises where seeds are sold, exposed for sale, stored power of entry or cleaned or prepared for sale and may, without payment, where seeds 55 take in the prescribed manner samples of the seeds for testing, and the owner thereof shall on demand deliver to the inspector a statement containing such particulars with respect thereto as, under the provisions of section 3 of this Ordinance, are required to be contained in the statement to be delivered with a sample.

- (2) An inspector taking a sample of seeds under the provisions of this section shall divide the sample into two parts, shall cause each part to be marked, sealed and fastened up, and shall deliver or tender one part to the owner of the seeds and shall deliver or send by post to an official seed-tester the other part of the sample for the purpose of its being tested
- (3) A report in the prescribed form of the result of any test of a sample sent to an official seed-tester under the provisions of this section or of sub-section (2) of section 20 of this Ordinance shall be issued in the prescribed manner 10 and a copy of every report so issued shall as soon as it has been issued be sent to the owner of the seeds

Purchaser of certain seeds to disclose name of seller

17. Where any seeds, of which a sample has been tested under the provisions of section 16 of this Ordinance, have been purchased from any other person as Government-tested 15 or Government-certified seed, and the Director is satisfied from the report of the test that the seeds in some material respect fail to correspond with the particulars contained in the copy of the statement or certificate delivered to the purchaser under the provisions of this Ordinance on the sale to 20 the purchaser of the seeds, the purchaser shall, on application in writing made to him by the Director, at any time after the test has been completed, furnish to the Director the name and address of the person from whom he purchased the seeds, together with a copy of the statement or certificate delivered, 25 and the Director shall, on being furnished with the said name and address, cause to be sent to the seller in a sealed packet a part of the sample of the seeds together with a copy of the report

Inspectors nct hable for acts not involving negligence, etc 18. No suit, prosecution or other legal proceedings shall 30 lie against any inspector for anything done in good faith and without negligence under the provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder

Conclusive evidence

19. (1) Every report issued under the provisions of section 16 of this Ordinance shall, in any proceedings against 35 the owner or seller of the seeds, be conclusive evidence of the facts stated in the report, unless the owner or seller of the seeds, within fourteen days after the date on which the copy is received by him, gives notice in writing to the official seed-tester who issued the report requiring a further portion of the 40 sample to be tested

Where more than one test, results to be averaged (2) Where a further portion of a sample is so tested and the reports issued in respect of the two tests differ, the average of the result of the two tests shall be deemed to be the result of the test for the purposes of this Ordinance, and a certificate 45 by the Director as to the average of the results of the two tests shall be conclusive evidence of the facts stated in the certificate

Statements on certificates prima facie true

- 20. (1) For the purposes of any legal proceedings on a contract for the sale of seeds, being a sale to which the provisions of this Ordinance apply, the particulars contained in the copy of the statement or certificate delivered under the provisions of section 8 or of section 9 or of section 10 of this Ordinance on the sale shall be deemed to be true unless it be proved on test that the seeds fail in some material respect to 55 correspond with such particulars
- (2) If the purchaser of any seeds desires that a test thereof should be made for the purposes of this section he may, at any time within ten days after the date of delivery of the seeds to him, request an inspector to take in the prescribed manner 60 a sample of the seed at the place at which they were delivered, whether at his own premises or elsewhere, and the inspector

shall divide the sample so taken into two parts, of which one part shall be sent to an official seed-tester for the purpose of being tested and the other part shall be delivered or tendered to the seller

PART VII—RULE-MAKING POWERS

The Member for Agriculture may make Rules for Power to the better carrying out of the provisions of this Ordinance and, in particular and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, in regard to all or any of the following matters —

- (a) prescribing the methods of sampling, 10
 - (b) prescribing the forms of the statements, certificates, reports, or marking of seed packets, under the provisions of this Ordinance, and the particulars to be contained therein,
- 10 (c) prescribing the fees for testing and for the issue of statements, reports and certificates,
 - (d) providing for the registration of registered seedgrowers,
 - (e) prescribing the distance from the land of any registered seed-grower of any land upon which an inspector may enter and exercise the powers conferred by section 14 and section 15 of this Ordinance

PART VIII—OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

22. Any person who—

Offences and penalties

- (a) tampers with any seeds so as to procure that any 25 sample taken under the provisions of this Ordinance does not correctly represent the bulk of the seeds,
 - (b) tampers in any manner with any sample taken under the provisions of this Ordinance,
- (c) with intent to deceive, causes or allows to be sent to 30 any seed-testing station, or to any person, to be tested for the purposes of this Ordinance, a sample of seeds which to his knowledge does not correctly represent the bulk of the seeds,
- (d) wilfully obstructs or interferes with, or fails to comply 35 with any order given by, any inspector in the execution of his powers or duties under the provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder,
- (e) makes or causes to be made any statement, required to be delivered or displayed under the provisions of 10 this Ordinance, which is false in any material particular,
 - (f) sells or exposes for sale any seeds which do not correspond with the description in any statement or certificate required to be delivered or displayed under the provisions of this Ordinance,
 - (g) contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules made, or of any notice or order issued thereunder,
- 50 shall be guilty of an offence and shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to improve the standard of the internal seed supplies of the Colony, to protect seed buyers from being supplied with seed of unknown origin and quality and to build up a reputable export trade of seeds, which experience shows can be satisfactorily produced in the Colony Many of the provisions of the Bill are based on the United Kingdom Seeds Act, 1920

The Bill has the support of the Seeds Advisory Committee which was appointed under Government Notice No 764 of 1st September, 1945, to inquire into the advisability of introducing legislation to cater for the requirements of the seeds industry

Clause 3 seeks to provide for the establishment of one or more Government seed-testing stations

Clause 4 seeks to authorize the Director of Agriculture to appoint official seed-testers

Clause 5 contains provisions restricting the places of entry of seeds into the Colony and providing for their detention and examination Similar provisions are already in force by virtue of an Order (G N No 688 of 1937) under the Plant Protection Ordinance, 1937 This clause seeks also to provide for the destruction of seeds containing specified noxious weed seeds

It is desired, however, to give the Director of Agriculture powers of exemption from the provisions of this Clause

Clause 6 seeks to provide that no vegetable or agricultural seeds shall be exported from the Colony unless they have been tested in respect of purity and germination

Clause 7 seeks to prohibit the buying, selling or sowing of seeds containing specified noxious weed seeds

Clauses 8, 9 and 10 seek to establish standards of quality with regard to purity, germination and trueness to variety Seed producers or seed sellers will be able to submit seed to Government seed-testing stations for testing and be issued with statements or certificates specifying the standard of the seeds

Clause 8 seeks to provide that seeds, which will be known as Government-tested seeds, will be those which have been tested and in respect of which a statement has been issued specifying the actual standard of the seeds in respect of purity and germination. It is not proposed that Government-tested seeds should necessarily reach any prescribed standard, but the legislation seeks to enable a buyer to ask whether seeds have been tested and in that case to be provided with a statement containing the result of the test

Clauses 9 and 10 provide for the issue of Government certificates in respect of seed which has not only been tested but has been found to reach certain prescribed standards. If on being tested any seed is found not to reach the prescribed standards no Government certificate will be issued. Such certification will guarantee that the seed is of a high standard.

Clause 11 seeks to provide that growers, who wish to produce Government-certified seed, will have to submit themselves to a measure of Government control to the extent that they will have to register themselves as seed-growers, their crops will be open to inspection and any departmental requirements aimed at ensuring the purity and trueness to variety of the resultant seed will have to be observed

Clause 12 seeks to provide for the voluntary registration of seedgrowers and for the publication in the Official Gazette, from time to time, of the names of registered seed-growers and particulars of the crops they are growing

Clause 13 seeks to provide for the inspection of a registered seed-grower's crop and for the carrying out of instructions given by an inspector to ensure the purity and trueness to variety of the resultant seed

Clauses 14 and 15 seek to protect the growing seed crops of registered seed-growers from cross-pollination and consequent ruin, by enabling an inspector to order the destruction of plants dangerous from this point of view within prescribed limits of the growing seed crops and whether on the registered seed-grower's own land or on neighbouring land. This compulsory protection is necessary as, owing to local conditions, it would be impracticable to introduce any voluntary zoning scheme such as exists in the United Kingdom for the express purpose of preventing cross-pollination.

Clause 16 seeks to authorize an inspector to enter premises where seeds are sold, stored or cleaned, and to take samples for testing and to require the owner of seeds to furnish to an inspector, on demand, particulars with regard to the origin and kind of seed found on the premises

Clause 17 seeks to empower the Director to require the purchaser to disclose the name of the seller of seeds which, on test, fail to correspond with the statement or certificate delivered to the purchaser with the seeds

It is not possible to state what expenditure of public money will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law, but it is hoped that a considerable proportion of the expenditure will be recovered in the form of fees for seed-testing and for the issue of statements and certificates


