TENDERS FOR THE GRANT OF CROWN LAND AT TIGONI

TENDERS in terms of capital value are invited on the following conditions for the purchase for the purpose of development as a residential estate of the grant of a lease in respect of a portion of land known as Land Reference No 160, situated at Tigoni in the Limuru District of the Highlands

2 A plan of the area concerned may be seen at the office of the Commissioner for Lands, Mines and Surveys, and of the Commissioner for European Settlement, Nairobi, and a copy may be obtained on application, at the price of Sh 3, post free

3 The tender and development will be under the control, on behalf of the Government, of a Development Committee, consisting of the Commissioner for Lands, Mines and Surveys, the Commissioner for European Settlement, and the Chairman of the Nairobi District Council, or their nominees, who may co-opt to the Committee other members. The requirements and decisions of the Committee shall be accepted by tenderers as final

4 Tenders must be accompanied by statements indicating—

- (i) the present land holding, if any, of the tenderer, within the Colony, and the extent and nature of development thereon,
- (ii) particulars of capital moneys expended for those development purposes

5 Tenderers are required to submit in their tenders—

- (a) a detailed description of their proposals for the development of the area as a residential estate,

(b) a plan based upon the Government contour plan referred to in paragraph 2 combined with information available at the Land Office, showing the subdivisional layout scheme, the water reticulation, roads of access and drainage system, based upon plot areas of not less than five acres and not more than fifteen acres each

6 (1) Tenders shall include proposals for the adequate supply of water for all plots, including those previously alienated and for the Cottage Hospital and the Police Station, obtained from at least two boreholes and shall provide for storage reservoirs sufficient for at least three days' normal supply. Such water shall be piped to the boundary of each plot, all of which shall be connected by all-weather roads of access to the main road

(2) Tenders shall also include proposals for the construction and maintenance of roads of access and drainage

7 No provision for a shopping centre shall be made, but reservations for other than residential purposes may be agreed upon

8 The allocation by the grantee and sale price of plots shall be subject to the approval of the Development Committee and no plot shall be sold until authority shall have been given by that committee

9 The successful tenderer shall be required to pay to the Commissioner of Lands, within seven days of notification that his tender has been accepted, 20 per cent of the capital value tendered as stand premium

10 The survey fees and the fees (Sh 120) payable in respect of preparation and registration of the title deeds together with the stamp duty (which is approximately 2 per cent on the purchase price and the rent) in respect of the grant must be paid within seven days of a demand therefor. Title will be issued as soon as conveniently may be

11 The term of the grant will be 99 years from the 1st day of December, 1947, and the grant will be issued under the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140 of the Revised Edition, especially Part V thereof), and the Registration of Titles Ordinance (Chapter 142 of the Revised Edition)

12 No building shall be erected on the land unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the Development Committee

13 All dwelling-houses and other approved buildings erected shall conform to a building line to be decided upon by the Development Committee

14 The grantee's deed of sale shall make provision binding plot purchasers to pay District Council rates, if imposed, including any Government contribution in lieu thereof, and rates covering water supply and maintenance undertaken by the successful tenderer as may be approved by the Development Committee

15 The subdivisional plots may be used for residential purposes only and no further sale will be permitted within five years of the date of the first sale of each subdivisional plot and a clause will be inserted in the title deeds requiring personal residence by the first purchaser of each of the subdivided plots for three out of the first five years from the date of purchase

16 The development to be effected on the land will be subject to a time limit to be decided upon, and subject to revision in exceptional circumstances, by the Development Committee

17 The successful tenderer shall accept responsibility for the supply of water and road maintenance until such time as other arrangements may be made for such services by request of the grantee and to the satisfaction of the Development Committee. Such maintenance services shall be covered by provision of water rate conditions embodied in the deeds of sale issued by the grantee with the approval of the Development Committee

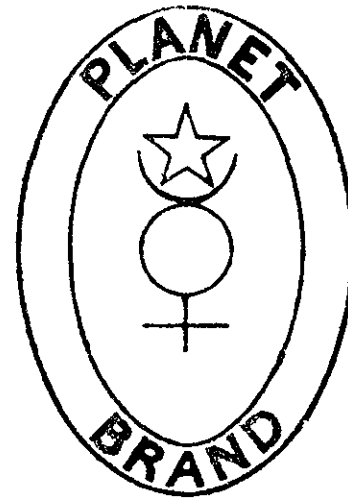
