 - (a) a detailed description of their proposals for the development of the area as a residential estate,

- (b) a plan based upon the Government contour plan referred to in paragraph 2 combined with information available at the Land Office, showing the subdivisional layout scheme, the water reticulation, roads of access and drainage system, based upon plot areas of not less than five acres and not more than fifteen acres each
- 6 (1) Tenders shall include proposals for he adequate supply of water for all plots, including those previously alienated and for the Cottage Hospital and the Police Station, obtained from at least two boreholes and shall provide for storage reservoirs sufficient for at least three days' normal supply Such water shall be piped to the boundary of each plot, all of which shall be connected by all-weather roads of access to the main road
- (2) Tenders shall also include proposals for the construction and maintenance of roads of access and drainage


