KENYA GOVERNMENT VACANCIES

Two Labour Officers, Labour Department

Salary scale, £400 by £20 to £480 by £20 to £600 by £20 to £720 per annum (initial salary according to age, qualifications and experience) on Kenya European Civil Service terms and conditions of service. Applicants must be in first-class health. The work of the Labour Department is directed towards the furtherance of good relations between employers and employees and practical experience of dealing with Africans and a good working knowledge of Swahili is essential. Successful applicants will be expected to pass the Government Standard Swahili Examination within one year of taking up their appointments.

When not in occupation of Government quarters a housing allowance will be payable to a limit of $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of the salary when the salary when the salary exceed £520 per annum and 5 per cent of the salary when the salary exceeds that amount; in cases of hardship these allowances may be increased to a mxaimum of $17\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of the salary when the salary does not exceed £520 per annum and 15 per cent of the salary when it exceeds that amount. In the event of an officer of the Civil Service who has already been accorded pensionable status being appointed, he will retain his pensionable rights and other privileges on an appropriate salary scale.

PRINCE OF WALES SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP KENYA HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP

A LIMITED number of scholarships is open in 1948 to students of the Prince of Wales School and Kenya High School who wish to proceed to approved universities, colleges or training institutions outside the Colony or to a Kenya institution approved by the Scholarshp Committee.

The survey fees and the fees (Sh. 120) payable in respect of preparation and registration of the title deeds together with the stamp duty (which is approximately 2 per cent on the purchase price and the rent) in respect of the grant must be paid within seven days of a demand therefor. Title will be issued as soon as conveniently may be.
- 11.
