A BILL TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONTROL OF THE TRADE IN HIDES AND SKINS

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title
and commence-
ment.

1. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Hide and Skin Trade (Control) Ordinance, 1947, and shall come into force on such date as the Governor may, by notice in the Gazette, appoint.

Application.

(2) So much of the provisions of this Ordinance as relate to the buying of hides and skins and to licences authorizing such buying shall extend only to such areas and such classes of hides and skins as the Governor in Council may from time to time, by notice in the Gazette, appoint.

PART I—INTERPRETATION

Interpretation.

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires:—

“buyer” means any person who buys, sells or otherwise deals in hides and skins;

“buyer’s licence” means a licence issued under the provisions of section 4 of this Ordinance;

“Director” means the person for the time being performing the duties of Director of Veterinary Services;

“export” means export from the Colony;

“exporter” means any person duly authorized under the provisions of this Ordinance to export hides or skins or hides and skins;

“exporter’s licence” means a licence issued under the provisions of section 9 of this Ordinance;

“green hide” or “green skin” means a hide or skin which is not partly nor wholly dried, seasoned or tanned;

“hide” means the hide of a bovine animal;

“Inspector” means any person authorized by the Director to act as an Inspector for the purposes of this Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder;

“licensed premises” means the premises in respect of which a buyer’s or exporter’s licence is in force;

“Licensing Officer” means any person authorized by the Director to issue buyer’s licences under the provisions of this Ordinance;

“Member” means the person for the time being performing the duties of Member for Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Natural Resources;

“preparation” includes the processes of cleansing, fleshing or drying and the expressions “prepared” and “prepare” shall be construed accordingly;

“skin” means the skin of a sheep or goat.

PART II—BUYER’S LICENCE

Restriction on
purchase of
hides and
skins.

3. No person shall, whether on his own account or on behalf of any other person, buy for the purpose of resale or tanning, in the Colony or for export from, the Colony, any hide or skin unless he is in possession of a valid buyer’s licence in the prescribed form issued to him by a Licensing Officer.

4. (1) Any person who wishes to obtain or renew a buyer's licence shall apply therefor, in the prescribed manner, to the Licensing Officer of the area in which he intends to buy hides and skins. Application for buyer's licence.
- 5 (2) The Licensing Officer may, upon receiving any such application, if he is satisfied that the applicant possesses a sufficient knowledge of the trade and is capable of complying with the conditions attached to a licence, issue the applicant with a buyer's licence or a renewal thereof upon payment of the prescribed fee. Issue of buyer's licence.
- (3) A buyer's licence shall, unless previously cancelled or suspended under the powers conferred by section 8 of this Ordinance, remain in force until the 31st day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued. Period of validity of licence.
- 15 5. In addition to any conditions which may be prescribed under the provisions of section 23 of this Ordinance, it shall be a condition of issue of every buyer's licence that the licensee shall— Conditions attached to buyer's licence.
- (a) keep any hides or skins purchased by him free from damage;
- 20 (b) buy and sell each hide or skin (other than a goat-skin or sheep-skin) by grade as well as by weight;
- (c) buy and sell each goat-skin or sheep-skin by grade as well as by the piece;
- 25 (d) carry out the grading of the hides and skins at the time of purchase to the satisfaction of an Inspector;
- (e) display, at the licensed premises in the prescribed manner, the prices which he offers;
- (f) not buy hides and skins at lower prices than those displayed in the prescribed manner: Provided that this condition shall not apply to purchases from the holder of a buyer's licence;
- 30 (g) buy hides or skins for cash only; and
- (h) keep proper books in English or Swahili written in Roman characters.
- 35 6. (1) A Licensing Officer may cancel, or suspend for such period as he deems fit, any buyer's licence, if he is satisfied that the holder thereof— Cancellation or suspension of buyer's licence.
- (a) has been convicted of any offence against any of the provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder; or
- 40 (b) has committed a breach of any of the conditions subject to which his licence was issued; or
- (c) has been convicted of any offence involving fraud or dishonesty or is an undischarged bankrupt.
- 45 (2) When any licensee is notified that his buyer's licence has been cancelled or suspended he shall forthwith surrender the same to the Licensing Officer by whom it was issued and, if any such person fails without lawful excuse to do so, he shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

PART III—EXPORTER'S LICENCE

7. No hide or skin may be exported from the Colony except through a prescribed port or place. Restriction on export of hides and skins.
8. No person shall export any hide or skin from the Colony unless he is in possession of a valid exporter's licence in the prescribed form issued to him by the Director. Export under licence.

9. (1) Any person who wishes to obtain or renew an exporter's licence shall apply therefor, in the prescribed manner, to the Director and, on payment of the prescribed fee may, subject to the provisions of sub-section (2) of this section, be issued with an exporter's licence. 5

Power to
refuse licence.

(2) The Director may, without assigning any reason therefor, refuse to issue an exporter's licence if—

- (a) in his opinion, the applicant has insufficient resources, or inadequate facilities, or that he or the staff he intends to employ lack the technical knowledge, to engage satisfactorily in trading in hides and skins for export in the manner required by this Ordinance or by any Rules made thereunder; or 10
- (b) the premises in which the applicant proposes to carry on his business do not conform with the requirements of any regulations or by-laws of a local authority having jurisdiction in the place where the premises are situate; or 15
- (c) the applicant has within the five years immediately preceding the date of his application been convicted of an offence against any of the provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder; or 20
- (d) the applicant within the last five years has been convicted of any offence involving dishonesty or fraud or is an undischarged bankrupt. 25

For the purpose of paragraphs (c) and (d) of this sub-section "applicant" includes, in the case of a corporation or firm, any director or partner of such corporation or firm or its local manager.

(3) An exporter's licence shall, unless previously cancelled or suspended under the provisions of section 10 of this Ordinance, remain in force until the 31st day of December of the year in which it is issued. 30

Conditions
attached to
exporter's

10. In addition to any conditions which may be prescribed under the provisions of this Ordinance, it shall be a condition of every exporter's licence that the licensee shall— 35

- (a) equip and maintain his premises to the satisfaction of the Director;
- (b) buy each hide or skin by grade as well as by weight or by the piece, as the case may be; 40
- (c) carry out the grading of the hides and skins to the satisfaction of the Director; and
- (d) keep proper books in English, Arabic or Gujarati in the manner prescribed.

Cancellation
or suspension
of exporter's
licence.

11. The Director may, without assigning any reason therefor, cancel, or suspend for such period as he deems fit, an exporter's licence if he is satisfied that the holder thereof— 45

- (a) has been convicted of an offence against any of the provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder; or 50
- (b) has committed a breach of any of the conditions subject to which his licence was issued; or
- (c) has been convicted of any offence involving fraud or dishonesty or is an undischarged bankrupt.

PART IV—REGISTRATION OF PREMISES 55

Premises used
for drying to
be registered.

12. (1) No premises may be used for shade or suspension drying until they have been approved as suitable for such purpose by an Inspector who, if he so approves, shall issue the owner or occupier with a registration certificate in the prescribed form. A separate registration certificate shall be required for each premises. 60

(2) An Inspector may—

(a) refuse to register premises if, in his opinion, they are unsuitable for the purpose or the owner or occupier, or the persons employed therein are not capable of satisfactorily preparing hides and skins in the prescribed manner;

Power to refuse to register.

(b) cancel or suspend the registration certificate of any registered premises if the hides and skins therein are not being prepared or dried in a manner which, in his opinion, is satisfactory.

Power to cancel or suspend registration.

13. A registration certificate shall, unless cancelled or suspended under the provisions of section 12 of this Ordinance, remain in force until the 31st day of December of the year in which it is issued.

Period of validity of registration certificate.

PART V—APPEALS

14. (1) Any person who is aggrieved by the decision of a Licensing Officer given under the provisions of section 4 or of section 6, or of an Inspector given under the provisions of section 12, of this Ordinance may, in writing, require the Licensing Officer or Inspector, as the case may be, to give to him, in writing, the reasons for his decision and such person may, within fourteen days after the date he receives such reasons, appeal in the prescribed manner to the Director whose decision on the appeal shall be final.

Appeal from decision of Licensing Officer or Inspector.

(2) Any person who is aggrieved by the decision of the Director given under the provisions of section 9 or of section 11 of this Ordinance may, in writing, require the Director to give to him in writing the reasons for his decision and such person may, within fourteen days after the date he receives such reasons, appeal in the prescribed manner to the Member whose decision on the appeal shall be final.

PART VI—POWERS OF INSPECTION, SEARCH AND SEIZURE

15. (1) Any Inspector, or any other person authorized in writing for the purpose by the Director, may at all reasonable times enter any premises in which any buyer or exporter of hides or skins carries on, or in which any Inspector or other authorized person suspects him of carrying on, his business, or any premises registered under the provisions of Part IV of this Ordinance, or suspected by any Inspector or other authorized person of being used for the purpose of preparing hides or skins, for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder, or the conditions of any licence, are being observed, and may inspect any hides or skins found on such premises and may take any such hides or skins as samples for the purpose of instituting any proceedings under this Ordinance or under any Rules made thereunder.

Powers of inspection, search and seizure.

(2) Any person authorized in writing for the purpose by the Director, if he has reasonable cause to believe that any offence has been committed against any of the provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder in respect of any hides or skins, may take possession of such hides or skins or, by order in writing, require the person in possession of such hides or skins to retain such hides or skins in his possession pending the orders of the Director.

(3) A police officer may stop and examine any vehicle carrying, or suspected by him of carrying, hides or skins and may stop any person carrying, or suspected of carrying, hides or skins, and may inspect any hides or skins found in such vehicle, or in the possession of such person, for the purpose of ascertaining whether or not the provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder are being observed.

PART VII—MISCELLANEOUS

Separate
licence for
each premises.

16. A separate buyer's or exporter's licence shall be required in respect of each premises owned or occupied by a licensee which are situated in different Municipalities, townships or trading centres. 5

Additional
premises on
licence.

17. Any person holding a buyer's or exporter's licence issued in respect of premises situated in a Municipality, township or trading centre who wishes to trade in or store or prepare or otherwise deal in hides and skins in premises other than those in respect of which he is licensed but which 10 are situated within the same Municipality, township or trading centre, shall apply, in the case of the holder of a buyer's licence to the Licensing Officer of the district in which the new premises are situated, or in the case of the holder of an exporter's licence to the Director, for particulars 15 of such premises to be endorsed on his licence.

Dispute on
buyer's
grading.

18. Where the person who produces any hide or skin for sale to a buyer is dissatisfied with the buyer's grading, the dispute may be referred to a person authorized in writing for the purpose by the Director. The decision of such person shall 20 be final and binding on both parties, and the buyer shall, if he buys such hide or skin, pay the price appropriate to the grade as fixed by such person.

PART VIII—OFFENCES

Licensee to
store hides,
etc., on
licensed
premises.

19. No holder of a buyer's licence shall store any hides 25 or skins except in the premises or places to which his licence relates.

Offence to
possess, etc.,
certain hides
and skins.

20. No person shall, within a radius of five miles of any place where provision is made for the shade or suspension drying of hides and skins, be in possession of, purchase, 30 sell or offer for sale—

- (a) any hide or skin from which the head and the arms and legs below the knees or hocks have not been trimmed or from the hump of which the fat has not been removed; 35
- (b) any hide or skin which has not been either shade-dried or suspension-dried in a manner approved by the Director.

Offence to
buy, etc., certain
dried hides.

21. No person shall sell or offer for sale, and no holder of a buyer's licence or exporter's licence shall be in possession 40 of, purchase, sell or offer for sale any dried hide which is smeared with blood, dung or any foreign substance, or which is not completely dried and in a fit condition for storage.

Offence to
treat hides
in certain
manner.

22. (1) Any person who—
- (a) treats any hide or skin with any substance not 45 approved by the Director;
 - (b) treats or prepares any sun-dried hide or skin with the object of selling it as a shade or suspension-dried hide or skin;
 - (c) without the permission of an Inspector, soaks, 50 immerses or in any other way applies liquid to any hide or skin which has been partially or wholly dried;
 - (d) without the consent of the Director, or of an Inspector authorized for the purpose by the Director, removes, 55 alters or defaces any mark or label made on or attached to a hide or skin in pursuance of the provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder;
 - (e) makes any statement, which is to his knowledge untrue, 60 in any application for any licence required under

the provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder;

- (f) contravenes, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules made, or of any lawful order issued, thereunder;
- (g) commits a breach of, or fails to comply with, any of the conditions of any licence issued to him under the provisions of this Ordinance;
- (h) obstructs any Inspector, or any other authorized person, in the exercise of his powers and duties under the provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder;

shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

- (2) Any person who is guilty of an offence against the provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder shall, on conviction therefor, be liable to a fine not exceeding two thousand shillings or to a term of imprisonment not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment. Penalty.

PART IX—RULES

- 23. The Governor in Council may make Rules generally for the purpose of improving the quality of hides and skins produced, prepared, or sold in, or exported from, the Colony and, without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, for all or any of the following purposes— Power to make rules.

- (a) prescribing the method of application for, the conditions to be attached to, and the fee to be paid for, any licence or certificate to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance;
- (b) prescribing the number of buyer's licences which may be issued in respect of any area of the Colony under the provisions of this Ordinance;
- (c) requiring returns to be made by buyers and exporters, and prescribing the persons to whom, and the form in which, such returns shall be made;
- (d) regulating the grading and classification of hides and skins and defining the grades and classes thereof;
- (e) regulating the manner and method of marking or labelling hides and skins for export or to denote grade, type, and district of origin;
- (f) prohibiting or controlling the movement of hides and skins—
 - (i) from any part of the Colony to any other part of the Colony, or
 - (ii) from any part of the Colony to any part of the Tanganyika Territory or of the Uganda Protectorate, or
 - (iii) from any neighbouring territory through the Colony to the port or place of export;
- (g) regulating the manner of buying and selling hides and skins generally or in specified areas;
- (h) prohibiting, regulating and controlling the offering for sale or the buying or the export, of any kind of hide or skin, or any hide or skin not prepared in the prescribed manner, or which is not in a prescribed condition, or which has been so mutilated by brand marks or in any other way so as to render it in the opinion of a prescribed person unfit or unsuitable for sale, purchase or export;
- (i) providing for the imposition of a cess or tax on hides and skins either generally, or on any specified grade

- or class of hides or skins, for the purpose of providing funds for the direct benefit of the industry, and providing for the appointment of a person or body of persons who shall have the control and administration of such funds. 5
- (j) prescribing the conditions under which a person may deal in green hides and skins, and for regulating and controlling the issue of, and prescribing the conditions to be attached to, any licence for buying or dealing in green hides and skins; 10
- (k) prescribing the areas in which producers may market their hides and skins;
- (l) fixing the prices to be paid for the various grades and types of hides and skins;
- (m) regulating and controlling the methods which may 15 or may not be used in preparing hides and skins;
- (n) regulating the method of removing a hide or skin from an animal;
- (o) defining the meaning of shade or suspension dried hides and skins; 20
- (p) prescribing the treatment of hides and skins, with the object of preserving them or of improving their general quality, either before or after they are dried;
- (q) requiring buyers and exporters in specified areas to— 25
- (i) keep registers,
 - (ii) preserve such registers for a period of not less than two years from the date of the last entry therein, and
 - (iii) produce such registers for inspection when 30 called upon to do so by an Inspector;
- (r) prescribing the ports or places through which the export of hides or skins shall be permitted;
- (s) regulating and controlling the method of marking or labelling shade and suspension dried hides or skins 35 with the registered number of the premises in which they were dried;
- (t) prescribing anything required under the provisions of this Ordinance to be prescribed;
- (u) generally for the better carrying out of the provisions 40 of this Ordinance.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Both Uganda and Tanganyika have already enacted legislation for the purpose of controlling the hides and skins industry in those territories. This Bill seeks to control the industry in the Colony and is based on the legislation in force in those territories.

Part II of the Bill seeks to prohibit any person, unless he is duly licensed under the provisions of the measure, from buying any hide or skin for resale, tanning or export. A Licensing Officer is empowered to refuse a licence unless he is satisfied that the applicant possesses a sufficient knowledge of the trade and is capable of complying with the conditions attached to the licence. The licence will remain in force until the 31st day of December of the year in which it was issued but may be renewed. It will be issued subject to certain conditions and may be cancelled or suspended in certain circumstances.

Part III seeks to prohibit the export of any hide or skin from the Colony except through a prescribed port or place, and any person from exporting any hide or skin unless he is in possession of an exporter's licence issued to him under the provisions of the Bill. The Director is empowered to refuse to issue an exporter's licence unless he is satisfied, *inter alia*, with the applicant's resources and technical knowledge. The licence will be issued subject to certain conditions and it may be cancelled or suspended in certain circumstances. It will otherwise remain in force until the 31st day of December of the year in which it was issued but may be renewed.

Part IV seeks to provide that no premises may be used for shade or suspension drying unless they have been approved as suitable and have been registered for the purpose. An Inspector has power to refuse to register premises in certain cases.

Part V seeks to provide for appeals from the decisions of a Licensing Officer, an Inspector and the Director in the exercise of their powers under the Bill.

Part VI seeks to empower Inspectors and other authorized persons to enter premises and to take possession of any hides or skins in respect of which they have reasonable cause to believe that an offence has been committed. Police Officers are vested with the usual powers to stop and examine vehicles, or to stop any persons, carrying or suspected of carrying hides or skins.

Part VII deals with certain miscellaneous provisions.

Part VIII seeks to make certain specific acts offences and prescribes the penalty.

Part IX seeks to confer wide rule-making powers upon the Governor in Council including *inter alia*, power to make rules regulating the grading and classification of hides and skins, defining the grades and classes thereof, regulating the manner or method of marking or labelling hides and skins, regulating and controlling the methods which may or may not be used in preparing hides and skins and prescribing the ports or places through which the export of hides and skins shall be permitted.

It is not possible to state what additional expenditure, if any, of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

**A BILL TO AMEND THE CUSTOMS TARIFF
ORDINANCE, 1947**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Amendment, No. 2) Ordinance, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1947, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance. Short title.
No. 10 of 1947.
2. The Schedule to the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding the following sub-item to Item 160 thereof:— Amendment of
the Schedule to
the principal
Ordinance.

“(j) Goods imported by the Governor for his use Free.”.
3. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have come into operation on the twenty-third day of November, 1947. Commencement.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Ordinance so as to exempt from payment of customs duty goods imported by the Governor for his use.

The Bill gives effect to a Resolution passed by the Legislative Council on the 6th November, 1947, and Clause 3 seeks to make it come into operation as from the 23rd November, 1947.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

RETAIL PRICE INDEX FOR AUGUST, 1947

THE general level of retail prices of consumer goods in Nairobi as at 31st October, 1947, as measured by returns from representative dealers was 71 per cent above pre-war level, while the corresponding figure for 31st August, 1947, was 67 per cent.

It is important to note that the main increase has been in the price of imported tobacco and if this increase is omitted the price level was only 68.5 per cent above pre-war level. As the purpose of the customs duty on imported tobacco was to reduce consumption, and as the price of local tobacco has remained unchanged, the effect of this item on the cost of living should be discounted.

For purposes of comparison of cost of living the relevant indexes are: August 167 and October 168.5 (August, 1939 100). The other main increases were recorded for fruit and vegetables and some clothing items. A fall in price was recorded for lake fish.

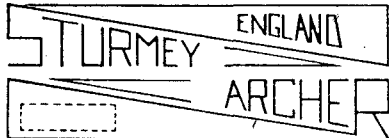
