**A BILL TO PROVIDE FOR THE REBATE AND
REFUND OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE DUTIES IN
CERTAIN CASES**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Rebate and Refund of Customs and Excise Duties Ordinance, 1947, and shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of January, 1947.

Interpretation.

2. In this Ordinance unless the context otherwise requires—

“Commissioner” means the Commissioner of Customs;

“Expeditionary Force Institute” includes the Navy, Army and Air Force Institute.

Rebate of
excise duty.

3. (1) A rebate of excise duty, payable under any law for the time being in force in the Colony, may, notwithstanding the provisions of such law, be granted by the Commissioner, subject to such limitations and conditions as he may specify, in respect of—

(a) tobacco, cigarettes, beer, tea and sugar, delivered from the stock of the manufacturer thereof to the order of the East African War Supplies Board or of any Board, Commission, or Authority, charged or authorized by the General Officer Commanding in Chief, East Africa Command, or by the Government of the Colony, with the ordering of such supplies for the use of His Majesty's Forces, if such supplies are paid for out of the funds of the Imperial Government, the Government of the Colony, or of any Dominion, Colony, Protectorate or Mandated Territory;

(b) tobacco, cigarettes, beer, tea and sugar supplied by the manufacturer thereof to the Expeditionary Force Institute or to the Union Defence Force Institute;

(c) tobacco, cigarettes, beer, tea and sugar, purchased by any public organization, recognized by the Commissioner, for free distribution to members of His Majesty's Forces in the Colony from funds donated, whether within or without the Colony, for that purpose; and

(d) in respect of cigarettes and beer supplied by the manufacturer thereof to the Mombasa Port Welfare Committee.

(2) An application for a rebate of excise duty under the provisions of this section shall be made by the manufacturer of the article on which such duty is payable or by such manufacturer's accredited agent, and shall be in such form, shall contain such particulars, and shall be made in such manner, as the Commissioner may require.

4. (1) A refund of import duty, payable under any law for the time being in force in the Colony, may, notwithstanding the provisions of such law, be made by the Commissioner, subject to such limitations and conditions as he may specify, from Customs revenue in respect of any goods purchased as stores from open stocks by the East African War Supplies Board, or by any other Board, Commission or Authority charged or authorized by the General Officer Commanding in Chief, East Africa Command, or by the Government of the Colony (hereinafter referred to as "the purchaser") with the purchasing of such goods for the use of His Majesty's Forces, if such goods are paid for out of the funds of the Imperial Government, the Government of the Colony, or of any Dominion, Colony, Protectorate or Mandated Territory.

Refund of
import duty.

(2) A refund of import duty, payable under any law for the time being in force in the Colony, may, notwithstanding the provisions of such law, be made by the Commissioner, subject to such limitations and conditions as he may specify, from Customs revenue in respect of any goods purchased from open stocks by the Expeditionary Force Institute or the Union Defence Force Institute, for re-sale, where the Commissioner is satisfied that the facilities provided under subparagraph (iv) of paragraph (c) of item 160 of the Schedule to the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1947, were not available at the time of such purchase.

No. X of 1947.

(3) A refund of import duty, payable under any law for the time being in force in the Colony, may, notwithstanding the provisions of such law, be made by the Commissioner, subject to such limitations and conditions as he may specify, from Customs revenue in respect of any cigarettes or beer purchased from open stocks by the Mombasa Port Welfare Committee.

(4) For the purpose of obtaining a refund of import duty under the provisions of this section, the purchaser shall submit an application in such manner, and containing such particulars, as the Commissioner may require:

Provided that, in respect of the refund of import duty on leaf tobacco used in the local manufacture of cigarettes, such application may be submitted by, and such refund may be made to, the manufacturer of such cigarettes.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Rebates of excise duty and refunds of customs duty in respect of dutiable and excisable articles were originally granted to the N.A.A.F.I.—E.F.I. and other Service organizations by the Defence Regulations. These Regulations expired early in 1946 and the Temporary Rebate and Refund of Customs and Excise Duties Ordinance, 1946 was enacted so as to continue the concessions in force. That Ordinance, however, expired on the 31st day of December, 1946.

It is considered desirable that these concessions should remain in force with effect from the 1st day of January, 1947, indefinitely. This Bill, therefore, seeks to re-enact the provisions of the Ordinance referred to above. The Service Authorities have given an undertaking to the Government that they will take steps to see that the concessions are not abused.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.
