IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon it by Regulation 46 of the Defence Regulations, 1939, which has effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Order, 1946 (Government Notice No. 183 of 1946), and all other powers thereunto enabling it, the Supply Board hereby makes the following Order:-

THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE

HOTEL SITES AT NAIROBI, MOMBASA AND KISUMU

IN RESPONSE to the public demand for additional hotel accommodation in the larger towns of the Colony, the Government has been giving special consideration to the provision of sites on Crown land for the erection of large hotels at Nairobi, Mombasa and Kisumu.

Lay-out plans have been prepared in which are provided suitable hotel sites as follows:

Nairobi.—Four sites of approximately 1.53, 2.95, 4.48 and 3.86 acres respectively, the first of which is situate in the central area of the town and the other three in the residential areas of the Hill District.

Mombasa.—Three sites of approximately 3.56, 3.6 and 2.27 acres respectively situate on Azania Drive adjoining the golf course overlooking the sea.

Kisumu.—A site of approximately four acres near the Nyanza Club and overlooking the lake.

When these plans have been approved by the local authorities concerned it is proposed to invite interested parties to tender in respect of the sites to be made available. The invitation to tender will specify the minimum stand premium and the rent and conditions which will be attached to each respective site. In the meantime copies of the plans showing the proposed sites may be inspected and any other information may be obtained at the Department of Lands, Nairobi, and at the offices of the Municipal Council, Nairobi, and the Municipal Boards of Mombasa and Kisumu.

Goods entered provisionally on deposit in accordance with section 63 of the Customs Management Ordinance, 1926, need not be described on the relative provisional entry in accordance with the new Import and Export List and the appropriate code numbers need not be inserted.

It is not proposed to revise the form of any import or export entry at the present time. In the event of any such revision taking place, due notice will be given and importers and exporters will be allowed ample time in which to use up stocks of entries in the old form.

VACANCIES IN GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS, TANGANYIKA TERRITORY

Accountants, Accountant General's Department

APPLICATIONS are invited for vacant posts of Accountant in the Accountant General's Department, Tanganyika Territory. While candidates who are Associates of the Institute of Chartered Accountants or who possess similar professional qualifications would be given preference, those with suitable experience who do not possess the above qualifications will also be considered.

Building Inspector, Grade I; Road Inspector, Grade I; and Mechanical Inspector, Grade I, Public Works Department

A NUMBER of vacancies exist in each of the categories of Building Inspector, Grade I; Road Inspector, Grade I; and Mechanical Inspector, Grade I, in the Public Works Department, Tanganyika Territory. These posts are pensionable and carry a salary scale of £480 by £20 to £540. Building Inspector, Grade I.—Qualification by apprenticeship in one of the main building trades with good experience in control of general building work and ability to prepare estimates and keep costs. Mechanical Inspector, Grade I.—Full workshop training in mechanical or automobile engineering with extensive experience of repair and operation of motor vehicles; knowledge of welding and smith work and general supervision of repair works and garage operation.
