Commencing at the intersection of the Kamiti River with the eastern boundary of L.R. No. 3696;

thence northerly by the eastern boundaries of L.R. Nos. 3696, 3698 and 3700, westerly by the northern boundaries of L.R. Nos. 3700 and 3699, and southerly by the western boundaries of L.R. Nos. 3699, 3697 and 5975 to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned portion;

thence westerly by the northern boundary of L.R. No. 237/2/7 and the northern boundary of L.R. No. 237/2/6 to the intersection of the latter with the eastern boundary of the Kenya and Uganda Railway Reserve;
